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

Located on the Northeast coast of Florida, Palm Coast and the Flagler Beaches is 31 miles South of St. Augustine and 24 miles North of Daytona Beach, bordered on the east by 19 miles of Atlantic Ocean. Exit 284 off I-95 is the closest exit to the beach from Maine to Miami. Just three miles!







HOW CAN YOU HELP

The natural sand dunes that line the gorgeous shores along Scenic Highway A1A are more than massive piles of wind-blown sand. Natural dunes play a much larger part in beach conservation than most beach-goers might expect, which is why we have to do everything we can to protect them.

They provide the first line of defense against ocean storms for our homes, restaurants and businesses, as well as and coastal inland ecosystems. Dunes create the signature coastline and beautiful beaches that attract locals and visitors alike. They also provide homes to plants and animals such as the legally protected nesting sea turtles that grace our shores.

Make sure you "Dodge the Dunes" by avoiding any walking, parking or driving on any grass or plants on the oceanside of A1A.

RESTORE

Restoration of the dunes can take months or years to complete, but the establishment of natural dunes is key to protecting our economy and natural coastal treasures. Our fragile dune beach grass anchors sand in place and can be damaged by foot and vehicle traffic, causing erosion. Without vegetation, dunes would be lost to the effects of wave, rain and wind erosion.

REVIVE

The renourishment and revival of our natural dunes will continue to make Palm Coast and the Flagler Beaches a beautiful destination and home. We have to look towards the future, not only to ensure the survival of endangered species and the protection of our economy, but also to maintain one of our area's most valuable assets. We owe it to future generations to respect, restore and revive the beaches so that they too can enjoy the beauty of the coastline.

Did you know that this area is ranked as one of the most dog-friendly beaches in Florida? Flagler Beach is proud to have a designated strip of land reserved for dogs and their owners. Here, your furry pals can frolic in the ocean as long as they remain leashed and be sure to clean-up after them!

The dog beach area is located north of N. 10th street and south of S. 10th Street.



UNCROWDED BEACHES & CINNAMON SAND

Locals love to keep the 19 miles of beach a secret, because it's one of the few areas in the state where you don't have to search long and hard for parking spots or fight for the perfect place to pitch your umbrella and beach chairs.

Once settled in, you'll enjoy the cinnamoncolored sand that sparkles with fragments of limestone crystals, and of course, the breathtaking view of the Atlantic Ocean. Keep your eyes peeled for the well-known coquina rocks found throughout the beach. The area is home to one of the largest outcroppings of these densely formed rocks full of mollusks. The other well-known areas to find these rocks are in New Zealand, so you'll know you're coming across something unique right here in Florida.

 - Dogs are allowed on the beach north of N. 10th St. and south of S.10th St.
 - Bonfires are per permitted only during the months of November-April due to Sea Turtle nesting season.

MARINELAND DOLPHIN ADVENTURE

This aquarium and marine park caters to kids (and adults) with a variety of affordable immersive dolphin experiences. There's also the option for your kids to serve as one of the park's dolphin trainers for a day. If you and the kids don't want to get too wet, check out Marineland Dolphin Adventure's Meet and Greet program. Get to know these fascinating creatures up close and personal through a dockside encounter.

FLORIDA AGRICULTURAL MUSEUM

Kids will get a kick out of experiencing life before smartphones and tablets at Florida Agricultural Museum. Here you can tour a fully functioning farmhouse from the 1880s, explore the Florida wilderness on a tractor tour of the woods and meet friendly farm animals, including sheep, ducks and Tucker the farm dog. You can also saddle up for a horseback tour of the trails that crisscross at the nearby woods and lakes.

RIPPLE EFFECT ECOTOURS

Get back to nature with a family kayak tour of the backwaters of the Guano Tolomato Matanzas National Estuarine Research Reserve. You'll paddle past striking sand dunes and fields of salt marsh grasses while seeing the manatees, dolphins and birds that call this 77,000-acre reserve home. If you don't feel like rowing, Ripple Effect Ecotours also offers

tours on its Ripple Effect 1, a boat powered by recycled vegetable oil collected from the frying pans of local restaurants. In case you're curious, yes, the boat's exhaust smells exactly like fries!

FAMILY-FRIENDLY DINING

BREAKFAST

Palm Coast and the Flagler Beaches is home to dozens of family-friendly restaurants, cafés, beach stands and seafood shacks. For a breakfast the kids will never forget, head to Swillerbees Craft Donuts and Coffee Bar. 

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



BIRDING

any birding enthusiasts start by putting up a few bird feeders at home and watching the dozen or so (or, in rural areas, many more) species that come to visit. Most birders learn a great deal more when they go out "birding" with others. The Flagler Audubon Society (www.FlaglerAudubonsociety. org) offers organized group trips, bird walks and local field trips that can accelerate the learning process. Take advantage by exploring the area's five designated Great Florida Birding and Wildlife Trails and more than 45 parks and preserves where you can spot more than 200 species.

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TECHNICAL TRAILS

Graham Swamp Preserve

This trail offers elevation changes to challenge biking enthusiasts with technical rock gardens, steep climbs and drops for 6.8 miles. Typically, riders start off leaving the parking area and head south on the single track trail. There is a hiking trail about 2.2 miles in length running through the center. Be sure to read the entrance sign prior to starting your ride. For a preview of what the bike trails are like, hike

the trail by foot first.

The Mala Compra Trail

This 5.5-mile single track mountain bike trail is located off A1A in The Hammock. The trail head starts at Bing's Landing and is a slow technical ride throughout several different natural Florida



habitats. The trail begins with a hardback single track with switchbacks and straighta-ways through palm brush for about two miles. You'll reach a section spanning 1.5 miles with challenging climbs, quick descents, tight inclined turns and rock gardens all surrounding several sulfur springs. This section is followed by several miles of flowing switchbacks. Your ride ends right where you started after a final 1/2 mile up and down finish.

PAVED TRAILS

St. Joe Walkway

In Linear Park and approximately one mile in length, this trail provides a connection to the Intracoastal Waterway. The walkway is designated as part of the Great Florida Birding and Wildlife Trail.

Intracoastal Waterway Trail

This trail winds approximately two miles from the Hammock Dunes Bridge trailhead to Waterfront Park trailhead

Pine Lakes Parkway (multi-purpose path) Running approximately 3.1 miles between Belle Terre Parkway and Palm Coast



Parkway, this flat route provides resting spots and exercise stations along the trail.


Lehigh Trail

This trail runs parallel to the Lehigh Canal for much of its eight miles. The west end begins at U.S. 1 just north of Bunnell, travels through Palm Coast's Town Center and ends at Colbert Lane.

Linear Park

The park has many amenities to enjoy, including a playground and picnic facilities. The park has been designated as a Great Florida Birding and Wildlife Trail by the Audubon Society since more than 40 bird species have been seen here.

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


HISTORIC SITES THAT ARE INSTAGRAM WORTHY!

Princess Place Preserve
Featuring local materials including tabby block cladding, cedar and palm tree trunk posts, the Adirondack camp-style lodge was constructed in 1887 by Henry Cutting and includes servant's quarters, a caretaker's house, tennis courts, stables, bathhouse, pool house and the first in-ground concrete swimming pool in Florida. Cutting died in 1892, leaving a widow, Angela Mills Cutting and two small children. Angela later married an exiled Russian prince, Boris Scherbatoff. When Prince Scherbatow died in 1949, the Princess used the lodge as her primary residence. For this reason it became known as the

Bulow Ruins Plantation
State Park - This park stands as a monument to the rise and fall of one of the largest sugar plantations in east Florida. The mill was onstructed of local coquina rock, which was used to build most large structures in the 19th century. 1836 brought a volatile time in the Florida frontier as the Second Seminole War swept away the prosperous Bulow Plantation, the spring house, wells and slave cabins of the former plantation. A scenic walking trail and state park magnify the historic significance of the area to educate locals, tourists and history buffs alike about the plantation's history

Washington Oaks Gardens
State Park - Part of a Spanish
land grant to Bautista Don Juan
Ferreira in 1815, this state park
was developed as a plantation by
General Joseph Hernandez, an
early Florida planter. George
Lawrence Washington, related to
our first president, married
Hernandez' daughter, Louisa in
1844. The couple was given the
land and developed the plantation,
started an orange until 1856.
When Louisa died, George left, but
returned in 1886 to live out the
remainder of his years. After the
death of Mr. Young in 1964, a
previous owner, Mrs. Young gave
the property to the state of
Florida.


