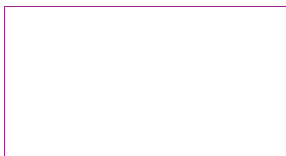


DIOCESAN MUSEUM

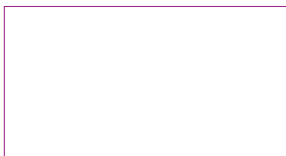


THE FREEMASONS HALL
