TIPS FOR PLANNING YOUR VISIT

We're very excited for your upcoming visit to the Genealogy Center, located in the Allen County Public Library in downtown Fort Wayne! We have a few tips to make your visit more productive and enjoyable:

- Be prepared by checking out their website at GenealogyCenter.org. Look for the surnames you are researching, as well as the places you believe your ancestors lived in their catalogs and numerous databases. Feel free to ask a question by email Genealogy@ ACPL.info. This will give you an overview of the resources you'll be searching when you arrive.
- Bring a USB drive to save images from computers, microtext, and books for free.
- Bring money (cash or credit/debit cards) for the copy machines.
- You may bring just about anything with you: files and notebooks, computers and tablets, scanner, camera, pens, pencils, etc. However, they do not allow food or drink in the Center. These may be stored in your bag, but not consumed in this area of the library.

- You might want to bring a sweater or light jacket. No matter the season, the rooms occasionally get a little cool.
- Wear comfortable shoes. The Genealogy Center covers about the same space as a football field.
- Want to schedule a free appointment with a genealogist in advance? Email Genealogy@ACPL.Info to get started. Plus, we'll have a welcome packet waiting for you upon arrival that includes dining guides, maps, and more.





OVERVIEW

We realize your goal will be to spend most of your time in the Genealogy Center researching your family history, but be sure to save time to enjoy everything else Fort Wayne has to offer, just steps away.

After a day of researching, take the night off at a TinCaps baseball game (April through September.) Don't forget to stay for the fireworks that follow most Friday and Saturday games in the summer.

For a little relaxation, we suggest a stroll through the beautiful Botanical Conservatory or Fort Wayne Museum of Art.

To get outdoors, take a short walk to the Midwest's newest attraction, Promenade Park, which features porch swings, a tree canopy trail, an amphitheatre, beer garden, and many other modern amenities. Or journey through time and discover the sites, landmarks, and people that made their mark on Fort Wayne with the Allen County Historical Sites pass - VisitFortWayne.com/ historicsites.

Looking to catch a show? Fort Wayne's historic Embassy Theatre, located in downtown Fort Wayne, features national touring Broadway productions, concerts of all musical formats, cinema, and other fun performances.

You'll definitely need to eat during your visit. Downtown Fort Wayne offers plenty of great dining options. 
And if it's coffee you're after, stop by Conjure Coffee or Fortezza, both located in downtown Fort Wayne.






