



If you haven't been to Fort Wayne recently, you may not recognize the many new neighborhoods and attractions throughout our city!

1. THE LANDING

Fort Wayne earned its nickname "The Summit City" in the 1800s when the Wabash and Erie Canal ran through this part of the country, and Fort Wayne was situated at the highest point on the run of the canal. Today, this area has a new life, and has become a new point of destination as "The Landing."

Foodies won't want to miss Fort Wayne's newest dining and entertainment district, The Landing is home to a dozen locally-owned restaurants and attractions.

2. THE BRADLEY

The Landing is also home to The Bradley, Fort Wayne's newest hotel.

3. PROMENADE PARK

Be sure to visit Promenade Park, the new crown jewel of our Downtown.

4. FORT WAYNE OUTFITTERS

While there, rent a kayak from Fort Wayne Outfitters and explore our three rivers!

5. TRUBBLE RIVERSIDE

Promenade Park is also home to Trubble Riverside, a great place to grab a cold one.

6. TREETOP CANOPY TRAIL

Stroll a boardwalk above the river on our Treetop Canopy Trail.

7. KIDS' CANAL

Be sure to splash and cool off in the Kids' Canal!

8. ELECTRIC WORKS

In Fall 2022, make your way to Electric Works, a historic GE campus that is undergoing a massive transformation! The campus encompasses 39 acres, 18 historic buildings and more than 1.2 million sq. ft. of space.

9. UNION STREET MARKET

The first project that visitors can enjoy at Electric Works is the Union Street Market, the region's first food hall and public market. Opening Fall 2022, it will feature 20-plus merchants open daily and a weekly farmers' market.

10. VIETNAM WALL

History lovers will enjoy several new sites in Fort Wayne: the replica Vietnam Wall at the Veterans Shrine.

11. CENTER FOR LINCOLN RESEARCH

And the new Lincoln Collection at the Allen County Public Library downtown.

12. PUBLIC ART

13. FORT WAYNE MUSEUM OF ART

The Fort Wayne Museum of Art has several new exhibits to catch while you are in town! A few include: Saints & Shepherds, an exploration of modern-day mythology through the contemporary Afro-Futuristic lens of LA-based artist Hebru Brantley, through March 6.

14. NEW GLASS GALLERY

And opening this summer, the Museum of Art will offer three galleries dedicated to their extensive glass collection, boasting over 300 pieces!

15. FOELLINGER-FREIMANN BOTANICAL CONSERVATORY

At the Botanical Conservatory, seasonal exhibits include Under the Big Top through April 17

17. Paris: City of Light & Love, July 2-November 13

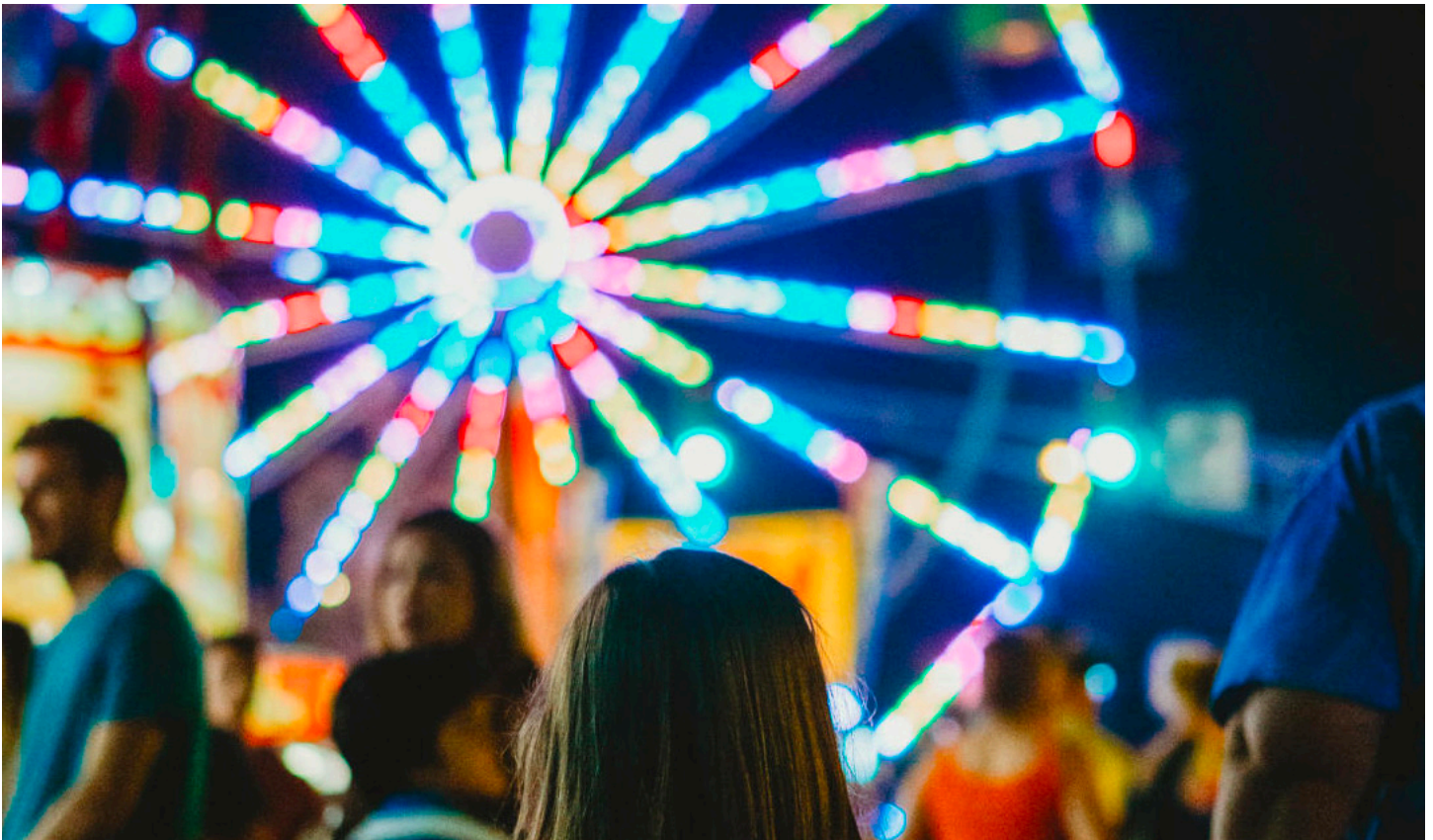
