# 1 Fort Wayne Children's Zoo

The Fort Wayne Children's Zoo is home to several new additions including Red Panda Ridge, Bamboo Forest, and Coastal Cove. The Zoo's new adventure play area for kids of all ages features a two-story ropes-style course, a free-flying sky rail, and more for the little tykes.

## 2 The Pearl

Coming in 2024, The Pearl, a one-of-a-kind, mixed-use space, will provide opportunities for local businesses, shops, and restaurants. Explore this gem in downtown Fort Wayne.

## **3 New Arts Center**

## **11 New Lodging**

Two new hotels will be opening in southwest Fort Wayne in 2024: Springhill Suites and Home2Suites.

### **12 Promenade Park**

The continuation of our riverfront redevelopment at Promenade Park features expanded public spaces, including an extension of the Tree Canopy Trail, boat docks for private watercraft, a universally accessible bouldering mound, and a hammock grove.



### **13 Utopian Coffee Lab**

Local coffee roaster, Utopian Coffee, will unveil a new coffee lab concept that will immerse you in the flavor profile and techniques of brewing a Utopian cup of coffee.
