

Accessible Meetings FAQs: CONVENTION CENTER

- When was the convention center last updated to meet amended ADA standards?
 - a. In 2003 majority of the Convention Center was renovated and updated to meet ADA standards. The Arena side was not renovated, but has elevators available.
- Does the convention center have a wheelchair on site in case of emergencies?
 - a. Yes, wheelchairs are available, but there is a limited supply.
- Are there ramps at the convention center?
 - a. Yes, all entrances to the Convention Center have ramps available.
- Can someone using a mobility device access all meeting rooms in the convention center?
 - a. Yes, majority of the meeting rooms are on first floor. There is elevator and escalator access to second floor.
- How many restrooms are usable by people in wheelchairs?
 - a. All restrooms have wheelchair accessibility stalls.
- Is there a First Aid station in the Convention Center? If so, is it well marked and easily accessible?
 - a. Yes, there are doors that are labeled with First Aid signs on both sides of the Convention Center.
- Does the convention center offer assistive devices for hearing impairment?
 - a. The Convention Center can get assistive hearing devices upon request.
- Are there tactile (Braille) signs on meeting rooms, public access areas, elevators, etc.?
 - a. Yes
- How close is the nearest hospital or clinic?
 - a. Medical Center of Fort Worth – 0.88 miles
- Are there AEDs installed in your building?
 - a. Yes, there are 3 AEDs in the Convention Center. EMT on site for events.
