The Team

The Fort Worth Sports Commission (FWSC) works hand in hand with the city, our venue partners, and hospitality leaders to make the planning and execution of high-profile events streamlined and efficient. Our experience in hosting events of a similar caliber as the 2024 U.S. Olympic Team Trials - Men's & Women's Artistic Gymnastics, 2024 USA Gymnastics Championships, and USA Gymnastics National Congress & Trade Show is extensive. When you host an event in Fort Worth, you have a partner in the Sports Commission and the city as whole that will be with you every step of the way to ensure a successful event and a truly unforgettable experience.

Competition Venues

To accommodate the 2024 U.S. Olympic Team Trials - Men's & Women's Artistic Gymnastics, 2024 USA Gymnastics Championships, and USA Gymnastics National Congress & Trade Show, Fort Worth will be utilizing two separate venues, Dickies Arena and the Fort Worth Convention Center. Both of these venues are available to USA Gymnastics from June 23-July 1 and calendar holds have been placed at both venues. There are no conflicts with professional teams and USA Gymnastics is the main priority. The venues are ready immediately.

U.S. Olympic Team Trials – Dickies Arena

Dickies arena is an exceptional facility and one that will serve as an incredible site for USA Gymnastics 2024 U.S. Olympic Team Trials. The state-of-the-art venue, a \$500 million-dollar multi-purpose arena, is equipped with firstclass amenities that will add to the competition atmosphere and provide an unforgettable experience for the athletes on the road to Paris as well as the fans cheering them on. In addition to the competition floor, the facility has 100,000 sqft of exhibit space, which allows for an onsite training gym. This space was used in 2021 when Fort Worth hosted the U.S. Gymnastics Championships.

USA Gym Championships and National Congress – Fort Worth Convention Center

The Fort Worth Convention Center boasts over 250,000+ sqft of total space (200,000 sqft contiguous), with an upstairs ballroom and an attached 10,000+ fixed-seat arena. This facility is no stranger to the world of gymnastics. It hosted the 1978 World Gymnastics Championships, has hosted multiple NCAA Gymnastics Championships and still currently hosts a variety of state, regional, and national competitions including Region 9 Trampoline and Tumbling and the Metroplex Gymnastics Challenge. It will be the perfect venue for the USA Gymnastics Championships and National Congress and within steps of 3000+ hotel rooms in our downtown.

Volunteers and Community Support

As USA Gymnastics is well aware, Texas is a gymnastics hot bed. The DFW metroplex is home to over 60 gyms alone. Fans are abundant here but the massive amount of support from those gyms and the gymnastics community as a whole for this bid is palpable. In our letters of support, you will find this on display for key leaders ready and willing to support this event from procuring knowledgeable volunteers to selling tickets. The Fort Worth Advisory Council has already committed to selling 1000 tickets for trials!

The state of Texas has the Event Trust Fund which is based on five major taxes (hotel, food and beverage, alcohol, shopping, and rental cars) allows for cities and National Governing Bodies to receive reimbursements for certain approved expenses. Based on our current knowledge of your event, we have run an initial estimate which shows the event qualifies and is approved to the Major Event Trust Fund. Unlike the regular Event Trust Fund, the MERP (Major Event Trust Fund) looks at an event's impact on the city over the course of a year and those five taxes. 





FORT WORTH DICKIES ARENA - U.S. OLYMPIC TEAM TRIALS




Dickies Arena is a 14,000 seat, spectacular multipurpose venue located adjacent to the Will Rogers Memorial Center campus in Fort Worth, Texas. The facility is the result of a pioneering public-private partnership between the City of Fort Worth, Tarrant County, the State of Texas and a group of private-sector participants, including foundations, individuals and organizations. The arena is owned by the City of Fort Worth and managed by the not-for-profit operating entity, Trail Drive Management Corp. (TDMC). The state-of-the-art arena hosts concerts, sporting events and family entertainment, and is home to the Fort Worth Stock Show rodeo performances.



FIRST CLASS AMENITIES

Dickies Arena was designed with the guests, athletes and entertainers in mind. Spacious locker rooms, hospitality areas and training facilities were all designed to create the maximum level of comfort.



EXHIBIT SPACE

Adjacent to the arena itself, Dickies Arena has a 100,000 square foot exhibit hall. Within the exhibit hall space, a 10,000 square foot Pavilion was designed to create the perfect warm up venue for all athletic events. With high ceilings and polished concrete, the space can be transformed from a meeting space to a warm up arena, depending on the event's needs.

LOCKER ROOMS

Dickies Arena is equipped with a number of locker rooms and performers rooms to comfortably accommodate athletic tournaments. The venue holds a home and away team locker rooms, four auxiliary locker rooms and four performers rooms, in addition to two officials locker rooms. Depending on event needs, the four performers rooms can be combined into two larger locker rooms.





TRAINING ROOMS

A large, dedicated training room includes an x-ray room, hydro room and doctor's room that accommodates basketball, hockey, gymnastics, rodeo athletes and more. The training room is connected to the home team locker room but can be accessed by all athletes. All team locker rooms also have their own dedicated training room.



AIRPORTS

DALLAS-FORT WORTH INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Downtown Fort Worth is only 17.5 miles from DFW Airport; an international hub as 4th busiest airport in the world and serving more that 260 destinations with direct flights.
