Viewing and Q & A with Ingrid Palmquist, producer & director

The documentary, *The Tale of the Lion*, grew out of AARCH's very successful Living Treasures initiative. Living Treasures celebrates African-Americans living in Frederick County who are 90 years or older. Over a period of ten months, twenty-one "Living Treasures" were interviewed. Video oral histories were created that document the lives and experiences of these people. The interviews serve as the foundation for the film which premiered on September 15, 2018. The film's title was inspired by an African Proverb: "Until the story of the hunt is told by the lion, the tale of the hunt will always glorify the hunter." AARCH & FHSC are delighted to show the film and to host a special Q&A session with director Ingrid Palmquist.

Ingrid Palmquist has long been interested in using film and photography to explore the diversity of life and to savor the subtlety of moments long after they have passed. As a filmmaker she is inspired by her dedication to social justice, which has been seasoned through her career as a civil rights lawyer, experiences traveling in forty-something countries, and family life as a mother of two.

The Country School Association of America is a nationwide nonprofit organization dedicated to preserving old schoolhouses--mostly rustic one-room structures that now symbolize early public education. Each year, CSAA holds a conference in a different spot around the country and will convene next June in Frederick County. Learn about the organization and what it takes to keep alive these iconic American treasures--including restoration of Frederick's Rocky Springs schoolhouse.



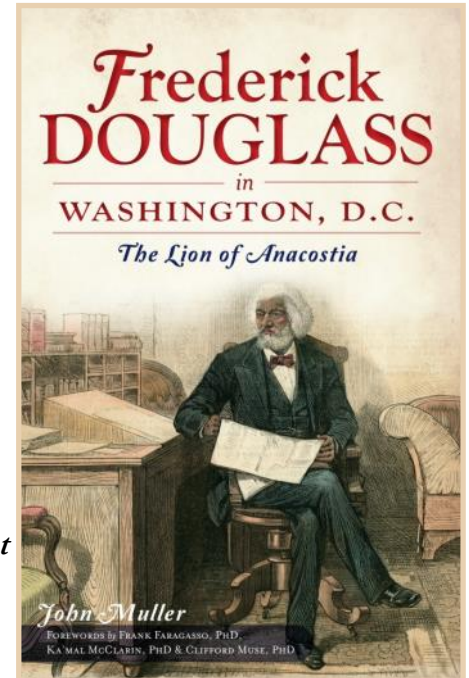
Ralph Buglass, a CSAA board member, is a docent at the restored one-room Kingsley schoolhouse in Little Bennett Park, just over the Frederick County line in Clarksburg. He is also a frequent speaker for Montgomery History, our neighboring county's historical society, and teaches lifelong learning courses on local history topics.

Author John Muller will present newly discovered information found in public and private archives throughout the state, including the Maryland Room of C. Burr Artz Public Library, Frederick County Public Libraries and the Western Maryland Room of the Hagerstown Branch of the Washington County Free Library.

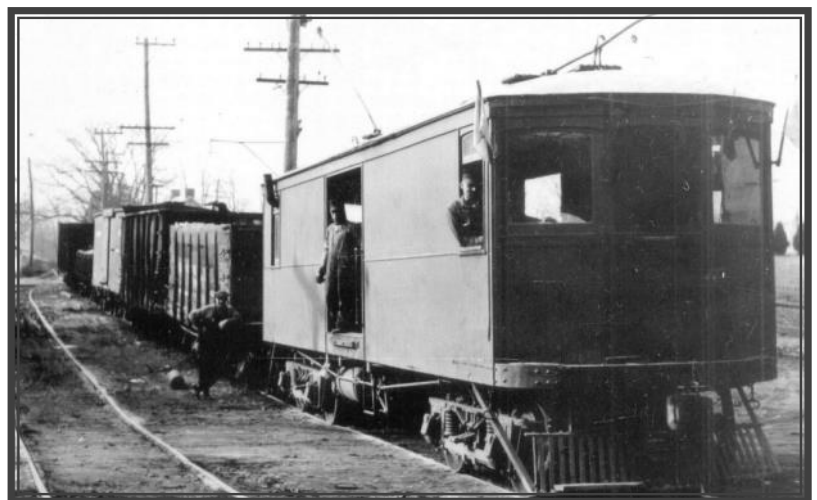
John Muller is the author of Frederick Douglass in Washington, D.C.: The Lion of Anacostia (The History Press, 2012) and Mark Twain in Washington, D.C.: The Adventures of a Capital Correspondent (The History Press, 2013), will make his debut speaking before a Frederick County audience. Muller has presented widely throughout the DC-Baltimore metropolitan area at venues including the Library of Congress, Newseum, Politics and Prose, American Library in Paris and local universities. He is currently working on a book about the lost history of Frederick Douglass on Maryland's Eastern Shore.



2:00 pm *An Electric Road Over Catoctin*

Discover the history of the Hagerstown & Frederick Trolley system and the importance of this early transportation system to the Washington County & Frederick County communities. The trolley line provided a vital link for the area's farmers, merchants, and students for almost 60 years during the 19th & 20th Centuries.

Reuben Moss is Vice-President and Curator of the Hagerstown & Frederick Railway Historical Society. The Hagerstown & Frederick Railway Historical Society is dedicated to promoting and preserving the heritage of the trolley line that served Washington and Frederick Counties in Maryland. We offer historical and technical data, as well as educational information to members and the public.



3:00 pm *Braddock's Tars: Common Sailors and the Braddock Expedition*

Based on research using primary sources on both sides of the Atlantic, Dalton will present on the lives of common sailors in an uncommon situation. Discover the lives and backgrounds of some of the sailors of the 18th century as we explore the journey of Braddock across Virginia, Maryland, and Pennsylvania.

Kyle Dalton is the Public Programs Administrator at Historic London Town & Gardens. He is passionate about engaging public in history through new and interactive learning opportunities. His love of maritime history has led to his current research, using primary sources on both sides of the Atlantic, to explore the lives of common sailors in an uncommon situation. By following their journey across Virginia, Maryland, and Pennsylvania, he highlights the lives and backgrounds of common sailors in the eighteenth century Atlantic world.

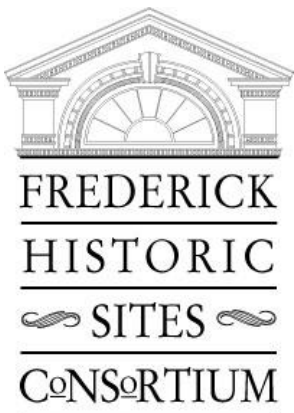
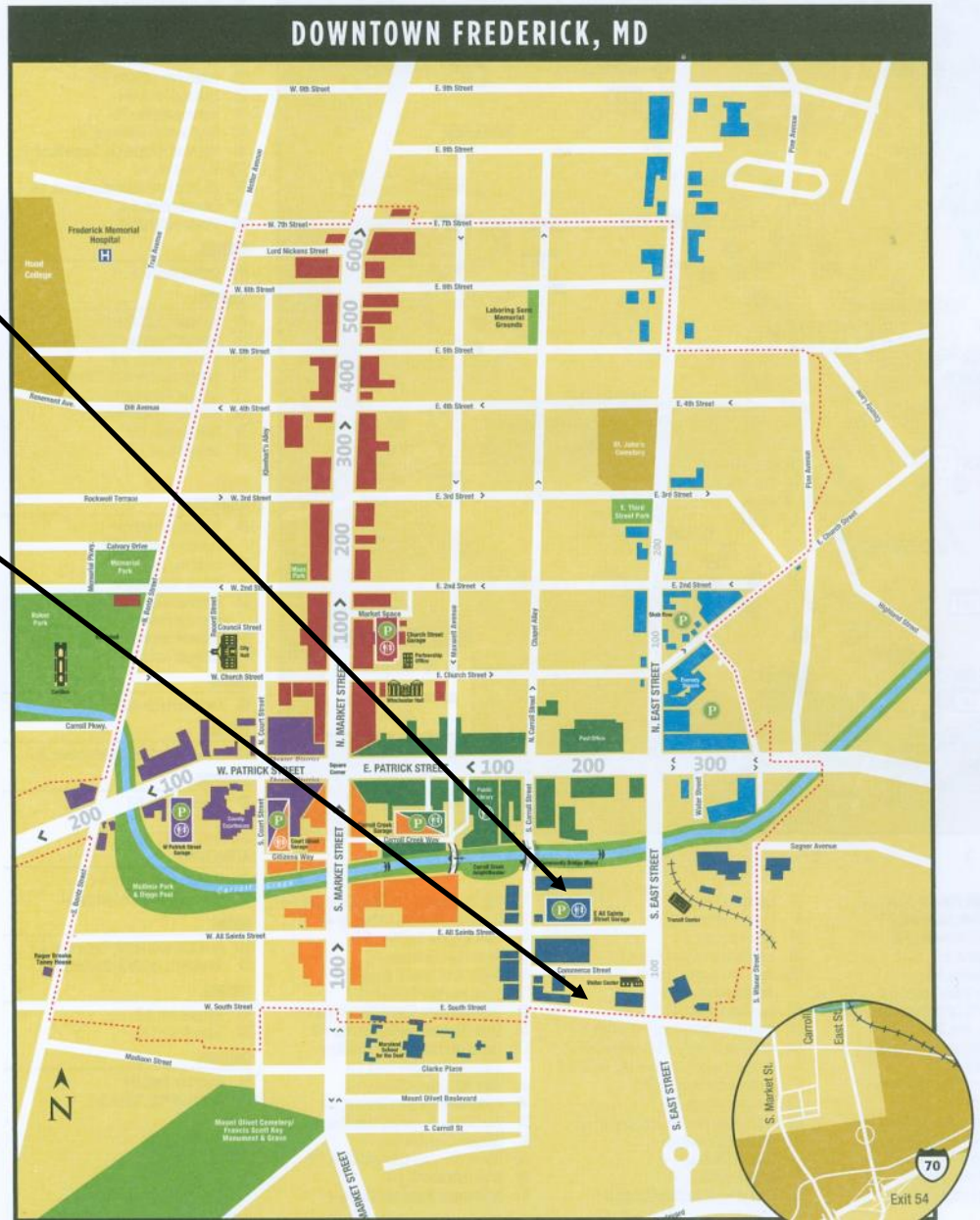
