Fredericksburg Home to National Historic Sites

Recently, Fredericksburg was ranked among the nation's best places to learn about history and with sites like the National Museum of the Pacific War, Pioneer Museum, Fort Martin Scott, Texas Ranger Heritage Center, the Gillespie County Country Schools and LBJ State and National Historical Parks, the possibilities are endless. The National Museum of the Pacific War has adapted to allow admission by reservation only, while the Pioneer Museum offers walking tours of the towns historic area.

Luckenbach Texas

Luckenbach Texas continues to offer live Texas music 364 days a year. The historic town is located about eight miles southeast of Fredericksburg. "Everybody's Somebody in Luckenbach!" Check the website at luckenbachtexas.com for performers and event schedule.

Seasonal Can't Miss Opportunities

Spring: Wildflowers & Wildseed Farms

Spring turns Fredericksburg and the Texas Hill Country into a wildflower paradise. Bluebonnets, Indian Paintbrushes and a multitude of other varieties of wildflowers make Fredericksburg very popular for sightseers, cyclists and motorcyclists. Bloom times vary based on weather, but when visiting from March through May visitors will have a chance to see the beauty. Even if you miss the peak season, enjoy the view at Wildseed Farms, the nation's largest working wildseed farm, which is located just seven miles east of Fredericksburg and usually always has something blooming.

Summer: Texas Hill Country Peaches

Before grapes, peaches were the dominant crop in the region and many peach orchards in Gillespie County remain today. In a season which typically runs from mid-May through mid-August, you can find some of the sweetest peaches in the country at roadside markets and the weekly Fredericksburg Farmer's Market.

Fall: Texas Wine Country Grape Harvests

To produce the award-winning wine of Texas Wine Country, vineyards harvest grapes from late July to early September typically. Local wineries offer picking parties, grape stomps and lots of other great events surrounding the harvest.

Holiday Season: Small-Town Charm

Fredericksburg during the Christmas season has often been compared to a holiday Hallmark movie and with good reason. Whether it's ice skating, watching the daily lighting countdown, marveling at decorations, shopping along a Main Street decked out in its holiday finest, enjoying the wine trail and local cuisine, or experiencing one of the many special events, Fredericksburg is the perfect holiday getaway.

Coming Soon: New Albert Hotel

For the first time in over five years, a new hotel will open in Fredericksburg and it will be Fredericksburg's first full-service hotel. On Main Street, Albert Hotel, a boutique 107-room property with multiple dining options, is slated to open in 2022.
