
irst stop is Wilton Manors, a suburban haven proud of its vibrant LGBT+ community. It's also a candidate for the most charming, populated with many colorful thrift shops, restaurants, bars and clubs to discover — from adorable mom-and-pop cafes to specialty boutiques with antiques and handcrafted finds.

Wander through Wilton Manors, and you may stumble upon the village of Lazy Lake, a hidden gem with fewer than 40 residents and the state's smallest municipality. It feels like a world of its own.

Just north in the city of Oakland Park, residents and visitors can immerse themselves in a profusion of community festivities, from the family-friendly Youth Day Parade to the joyous Oktoberfest, where you can indulge in local award-winning craft beer.

In these pages, we'll introduce you to favorite nooks and crannies, giving you insight into the people and places that make this area truly special.

Whether you're a first-time visitor searching for something unexpected to add to your itinerary, or a South Florida native looking for new adventures right in your backyard, we invite you to experience the unique treasures tucked away in these small towns.





OAKLAND PARK

A small yet mighty city with around 43,000 residents, Oakland Park was once an agricultural community. It was incorporated in 1925 as Floranada, but its indomitable spirit led to a re-incorporation as Oakland Park four years later, following a devastating hurricane.

While the city has come a long way from its farming roots, it has retained a close-knit camaraderie. For outdoor enthusiasts, there are jogging paths, picnic areas, and a host of welcoming events at Jaco Pastorius Park, named after the famed jazz bass player and native son. With its artsy vibe, vintage aesthetic, love for great beer and international curiosities, Oakland Park exudes an eclectic flair.

WILTON MANORS

Affectionately known as "The Island City," Wilton Manors occupies a modest two square miles between the North and South Forks of the Middle River. Envisioned as a playground for the wealthy, the city's grand dreams were tempered by the Great Depression. Today, the Richardson Historic Park and Nature Preserve stands as a reminder of its past grandeur, featuring a manor house and a 5.4-acre park.

Formally incorporated in 1947, Wilton Manors has since emerged as a prominent LGBTQ+ community, boasting one of the highest numbers of same-sex couples in the country. For outdoor enthusiasts, the riverfront parks offer canoe trails, a mangrove preserve, and community centers hosting intimate cultural and performing arts events. Above all, Wilton Manors prides itself on its dedication to diversity, striving to be a welcoming destination for people of all races, sexualities and cultures to live, work and play.

LAZY LAKE

Preserved with love and zeal by passionate locals, the village of Lazy Lake remains a charming corner of subtropical wilderness. Its roots trace back to 1925 when it served as a simple limestone quarry supplying construction material for Wilton Manors. Over time, water filled the rock pit, giving birth to its storybook lake. Shying away from fanfare and visitors, Lazy Lake is more of a closely-held secret than a tourist attraction.



ightharpoonup he Wilton Manors and Oakland Park entertainment district features a diversity of restaurants and an array of shops for those unique mementos, parks and preserves for nature lovers, as well as some of the top-rated entertainment venues in South Florida.

In nearby Oakland Park, find everything from beer and spirits to drag shows and bees, then take a sledgehammer to your frustrations and a few choice appliances.

WILTON MANORS

RICHARDSON HISTORIC PARK AND NATURE PRESERVE

► Take in scenic views at this 5.4acre park and nature preserve. Within the park are the preserved Carriage House and Manor House, two of the first manor homes built in the city. Both are open to the public for events, weddings and casual sightseeing. Visitors can stroll the boardwalk that meets up with the river or cast a line down on the deck. Those with a penchant for adventure can bring their kayak or canoe and set sail from the on-site boat dock, while others looking for a more relaxed afternoon can pack for a picnic in the courtyard after meandering through the natural habitats. The park is open daily from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m.







ISLAND CITY STAGE

Noting its location along an unassuming strip, the typical traveler might not suspect that Island City Stage is an iconic landmark for local talent. This performing arts venue touts its inclination toward sharing "stories of universal interest" with diverse entertainment that explores both people of color and LGBTQ+ culture. Catch a show Thursday through Sunday and witness standout performances of off-Broadway shows. Make a day of it with Mimosa Sundays — the second Sunday performance of every show includes a complimentary pre-show libation, light bites and a post-show talk.


OAKLAND PARK SELFIE MUSEUM



LIPS

◄ Indulge in the glitz and glamor of a night out. at Lips – the ultimate drag dining experience. Hidden in a small plaza off Oakland Park Boulevard, Lips offers an experience complete with over the top shows, glamorous costumes, a three-course dinner menu and fabulous drinks with cheeky names. Hailed as one of the country's largest cabaret show chains, Lips was founded in New York by prominent drag queen Miss Yvonne Lame over 25 years ago. Since 2007, it has been a popular South Florida venue for birthday parties, bachelorette parties or the casual walk-in. Each night, from Wednesday to Sunday, you can expect engaging live entertainment that's heavy on the audience interaction. They even host a gospel brunch on Sundays, offering a special menu with bottomless mimosas and bloody marys. Reservations are encouraged but not required.

CHAINBRIDGE DISTILLERY

 Family-owned and operated, the award-winning ChainBridge Distillery carries on the tradition of previous generations as they craft innovative spirits from fruits, vegetables and herbs. Transplant Bela Nahori, along with his wife, sister and parents opened the Oakland Park distillery in 2019. Inspired by the brandies from their native Hungary, ChainBridge is a small batch distillery specializing in fruit brandies, vodka, gin and specialty spirits with adventurous ingredients like carrot and beet. They also have a molasses rum for your favorite mojito recipe or just to pair with some cola and a wedge of lime. All brandies are distilled from 100% hand-selected fruit. Each batch is rested for at least three months before it is processed, hand-bottled and hand-labeled. Their Florida Basil Vodka features two types of native basil, and the process starts the day the farmer picks it. Visitors can enjoy ChainBridge Distillery tours, tasting room offerings and venue rental for those over 21.





t's also possible you didn't notice you were there. The quaint village consists of a handful of homes surrounded by the city of Wilton Manors. There's no main square, no shops, restaurants or parks. Yet it somehow retains an innate fascination and appeal, simply by continuing to exist and remain independent.

The village was incorporated in the 1950s, and according to Lazy Lake mayor Richard Willard, it remains the smallest municipality in the state of Florida, giving it a unique interest. However, the residents of Lazy Lake are almost more keen to remain unnoticed, preferring anonymity in their tranquil, tiny and independent swath of paradise.

Remaining separate from Wilton Manors and other neighboring towns allows Lazy Lake to elect its own mayor and city council, positions held and almost rotated among the residents.

But Lazy Lake's greatest appeals might be its unique history and pristine beauty. In 1925, the creator of

Wilton Manors quarried Lazy Lake, creating a pit that would fill with water and amount to little for years. However, in 1946, Charles Lindfors, a purchaser, partnered with Hal Ratliff, a contractor, to create Lazy Lake, a subdivision with privacy and serenity for all of its residents. The first three homes built belonged to the founders of the village.

In 1953, the small group of Lazy Lake residents denied a request to join Wilton Manors. They vehemently voted themselves an independent entity to prevent ever being reclaimed into another town. Lindfors was elected mayor and served the first eight terms in the village's mayoral history. The lush greenery and natural beauty of the neighborhood continued to attract new residents until the final count of fourteen homes was reached.

Over time, people have moved in and out. The town was even briefly put up for sale, but never sold. After it all, Lazy Lake remains both independent and a sanctuary to fewer than 40 residents. And they love it that way.



The neighboring cities of Wilton Manors and Oakland Park are great spots to get active and explore new paths to wellness, with options from high-end gyms to holistic wellness centers and unique exercise.

The Woman's Club of Wilton Manors offers daily Jazzercise classes (excluding Wednesdays) at a range of levels, so there are great options for the longtime dancers and those who are brand new to the activity.

To unwind after a stressful week, or an active aerobics class, Chi Spa, also in Wilton Manors, is the perfect place to find holistic body wellness and relaxation. Here you can try one of many massages, Reiki, Thai stretch therapy, facials, waxing, yoga and meditation classes — or get a membership and try it all.




In neighboring Oakland Park, there's even more wellness potential to energize your mind and invigorate your body. Adventurous individuals can hit projectROCK, an indoor climbing center where you can try lead climbing, bouldering, rappelling or take classes to get prepared for your in-nature climbs. The center offers an approachable view of climbing, welcoming those who are beginners and offering plenty of support.

CrossFit is known for being an intense workout — and making for some serious body transformations. If you're looking to commit to a program and get more active, CrossFit SoFlow is a welcoming, community-based option that encourages beginners to explore the programs and classes and find what works for them alongside other CrossFit enthusiasts.

For those who prefer a more relaxing exercise experience, nearby Heart & Soul Yoga offers a lineup of classes made to help you connect with your body, release stress, and leave feeling healthier and happier. They offer daily classes, including more accessible slow yoga and chair yoga, and more advanced yoga and strength.

Finally, if you're looking to heal lingering body troubles, Compassion Acupuncture & Holistic Healing might be worth a try. Though beloved for its plethora of tasty brunch spots and daytime shopping galore, when the sun goes down, there's a whole different side to Wilton Manors the common traveler might not see.

rom nightclubs to lounges, speakeasy cocktail bars and cowboy-friendly line dancing joints, a night out on "The Drive" will never disappoint.

Start the night with happy hour at DrYnk Bar and Lounge — which runs from 2-7 p.m. daily — and enjoy a craft margarita infused with peach, mango or spicy strawberry on the upscale outdoor deck. If you're only planning on one round, the award-winning smoked old fashion with smoked cedar and black cherry is the move.

Right across the street lies Georgie's Alibi Monkey Bar, a beloved hotspot among Wilton Manors' LGBTQ+ community. Georgie's showcases four charming spaces for fun: the Main Bar, Times Square Bar, Monkey Bar and the Patio each with its own unique vibe. With a full menu of American bites, you'll never go hungry. But the real attention-grabbers are the signature cocktail offerings featuring more than 15 stand-out drinks. Entertainment lovers can appreciate the full calendar of events ranging from drag shows to Latin dance nights, live music, events and more.

Don't want the party to end? In the same plaza as Georgie's is Hunter's Nightclub. Nestled in the Shoppes of Wilton Manors, this chic lounge has been a haven for the gay community since its doors swung open in 1980. It's been scooping up the title of Best Bar from South Florida Gay News every year from 2015 to 2022. From karaoke and trivia sessions that light up the Drive's largest video screen to groovy dancing nights and dedicated evenings like "In the Biz" for our hardworking service industry heroes, the calendar is always packed with engaging events, making sure you're in for a good time

Eagle Wilton Manors is a hot spot for a cheeky night out on the strip. This locally famous gay bar has a rich history dating back to 1948. These days, it's the ultimate destination for a latenight escapade filled with music, drinks and dancing, where you'll also find an underground, old school "leather" bar called Code Bar, which acts as a safe space for the "fetish" community to congregate.


When looking to get fired up, a night out at LIT Wilton seems appropriate. Inside, the 6th Boro NYC Eatery offers tasty classics like a chicken parm sub, coconut shrimp and halal gyros, but events are the name of the game at this community centric joint. Flag football socials, drag lip sync events, bingo, flip cup tournaments and more are enjoyed with a specialty LIT mojito in hand.

Did someone say cocktails?
Hang a right when walking on the Drive and enter Infinity Lounge.
This sophisticated cocktail bar is well revered as a hot spot for enjoying wine, well drinks and domestic and imported beers with friends amid hanging chandeliers and glitter walls.
Their calling card is a martini with a twist.

If a themed night is in order, the infamous Scandals Saloon is the answer. This line-dancing






PRISON PALS BREWING CO.

After owner Juan moved from Argentina to the U.S. and opened a custom brewing location in Doral, a second location of Prison Pals Brewing Co. was brought to Oakland Park in 2022. The bar and taproom serves more than 16 unique beers, like the Dorada Pampeana Blonde Ale, Queen hazy IPA, and La Colorada amber lager, along with "smoothie" style sour ales like the Hakuna Matata made with strawberry, banana, orange and pineapple. On Saturday nights, the outdoor garden of the venue turns into a karaoke bar, but if looking for a mid-week break, take advantage of the 4-6 p.m. happy hour featuring discounted pints and bar snacks.




As Greater Fort Lauderdale becomes home to a growing number of breweries, beer-lovers rejoice. New craft breweries, artisan bars and beer gardens are popping up all the time in spots like Oakland Park and Wilton Manors. They are quickly becoming the place to be for a cold pint (followed by some excellent food, if you choose). Here are the stops we recommend if you want to make a day of it.

FUNKY BUDDHA BREWERY

▲ If you live around Oakland Park, you're probably already familiar with Funky Buddha Brewery, brainchild of Ryan Sentz and now co-owned with his brother K.C. The sprawling brewery, bottling plant and taproom has been a staple of the area for more than 10 years. Funky Buddha is a pioneer of the local craft beer scene with one of the largest spaces and a stand-out menu. While the brewery's beers are sold in stores across Florida and even beyond state lines, their taproom and signature flavors are what make them exceptional. Very early to this now-popular trend, Funky Buddha produces culinary-inspired beers with exclusive natural ingredients. Past special releases featured the flavors of maple bacon, french toast and s'mores. And according to their marketing department, the food menu is "an upscale take on pub food with a lot of South Florida-inspired ingredients."


you enter Claudia Castillo ART Studio two doors down.


STORK'S BAKERY




