Check out kid-friendly slot canyons around Ticaboo that are perfect for younger children to get the feel of what it is like to do some stemming and crabbing across the canyon walls.

Antimony offers beginner horseback riding tours that kids and families will love. Enjoy strolling along the picturesque meadows and foothills for an unforgettable experience. You can even learn to brush, saddle and feed your horse.

CAN I TAKE MY PETS WITH ME ON HIKES AND INTO PARKS?

Within Bryce Canyon National Park, pets are permitted only on all paved surfaces: campgrounds, parking lots, paved viewpoint areas, etc. Pets must be on a leash and cannot be left unattended or tied to an object.

Pets are allowed on the trails in Red Canyon and Dixie National Forest, as well as in the Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument. If you have any further questions about pet regulations, please visit the nearest visitor center for additional information.

In Panguitch, there is a kennel for a safe and comfortable option for you to leave your pet.

ANTIMONY

Scenic Drive | For a lesser-known scenic drive, try taking John's Valley Road. Begin in Panguitch and go along Scenic Byway 12 before turning on John's Valley Road up to Antimony, then make your way back to Panguitch on Highway 89.

Horseback Riding | With trails for beginner, intermediate and advanced riders, you can take a picturesque ride through the beautiful meadows and foothills of Antimony.

Otter Creek State Park and Reservoir | Enjoy a quieter campground equipped with modern restrooms and a developed boat launch. This is also one of Utah's best trout fisheries. A number of ATV/UTV trails running near the reservoir through nearby mountains are perfect for adventure-seekers.

ATV/UTV Riding | Take a ride on Powell Point, a 20-mile trip with majestic views, best for intermediate riders.

Or try Widstoe/Griffin Top, a moderate 50-mile trail to the top of the Escalante Mountains.

TICABOO

Lake Powell and the Glen Canyon National Recreation Area | Take time to go fishing, boating or swimming in an area known for unparalleled opportunities for water-based recreation. The Glen Canyon National Recreation Area stretches from Lees Ferry in Arizona all the way to the Orange Cliffs of southern Utah, and offers miles of stunning views.

Bullfrog Marina | A Lake Powell harbor, Bullfrog Marina consists of an RV Park and Campground. The marina has houseboats, powerboats and other water toys available for rent. The site offers restrooms, showers, 30-amp power, full hook-ups and can accommodate RVs up to 50 feet.

ATV/UTV Riding | **Ticaboo Mesa Trail** | Follow several ATV/UTV loops to see spectacular views of Ticaboo Canyon and Lake Powell.

Bull Creek Pass | A moderate, 68-mile trail up and through the Henry Mountains. Be sure to keep your eye out for spectacular wildlife along the way.

Shooting Canyon Trail | A moderate 12-mile backcountry trail that will take about 1.5 hours to complete.
