GOLDEN

Located in an area of outstanding natural beauty, Golden was the first capital of the Colorado Territory. Today, Golden offers a delightful main street of historic buildings that have been transformed to house art galleries, cafes, craft breweries, restaurants and one-of-a-kind shops. Since 1947, the most memorable image of Golden is a 58-foot-long welcome arch that spans main street and says, "Howdy Folks! Welcome to Golden – Where the West Lives."

Beautiful Clear Creek flows through the center of town and is lined with paved walking trails. To the east are high Western-looking volcanic mesas; to the west are the tree-covered foothills of the Rocky Mountains. Golden makes a perfect base for groups to explore this scenic and historic area.

Golden is conveniently located near the world-famous **Red Rocks Amphitheatre & Park**, which has hosted everyone from the Beatles to Bruce Springsteen. Red Rocks offers spectacular year-round views, short hiking trails and the Colorado Music Hall of Fame – a museum highlighting the performers who have appeared there, all just a 10-minute drive from Golden.

The Buffalo Bill Museum and Grave tells the exciting story of the West's most famous scout and showman with fun, interactive exhibits. Located atop Lookout Mountain, the museum and gravesite offer groups spectacular views of the snowcapped Rockies. The Lariat Loop Trail from the grave to Golden is one of the most exciting and scenic drives in Colorado.

Located in downtown Golden, **Coors Brewery** is the largest single site brewery in the world. Groups can visit the large copper kettles that brew the beer, tour the packaging facility, stop in the tasting room to sample three glasses of Coors beer and take home a souvenir glass, all for a modest group fee.
