

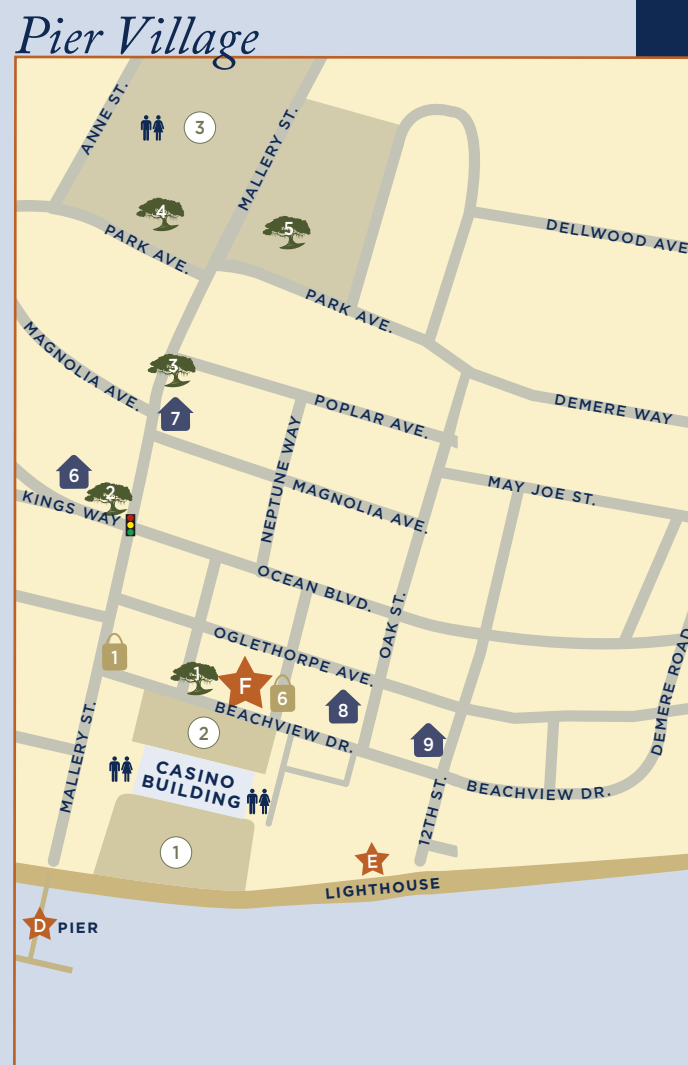

Explore Safely

"Multi-use" means paths may be shared with pedestrians, roller skaters, cyclists, motor vehicles, etc. Pedestrians have the right of way on these paths. To be considered pedestrians, cyclists must dismount and walk their bikes, including when crossing streets.

Narrow, rural or multi-use roads are part of our local charm, but be aware, some paths offer little or no shoulder for cyclists. Cyclists are responsible for knowing the rules of the road and evaluating their own comfort riding on multi-use trails, which may parallel or intersect with vehicular traffic. Please remain alert for motor vehicles on all multi-use trails.

Georgia law requires all cyclists under the age of 16 to wear a helmet, although we recommend cyclists of all ages wear helmets.

Golf carts can only be driven on streets where the posted speed is 25 mph or less. For more information about golf cart regulations please visit glynncounty.org

HAMILTON PLANTATION TABBY SLAVE CABINS

Two tabby slave cabins built on Hamilton Plantation remain today at Gascoigne Bluff near Epworth by the Sea. The modest structures have been carefully restored and received their placement on the National Register of Historic Places in 1988. Contact the location for cabin entry and tours.

CHRIST CHURCH, FREDERICA

Built in 1884, this church is nestled among huge live oak, holly and cedar trees on St. Simons Island's north end.

IBO LANDING MARKER

In 1803, a group of 75 Africans from Igboland, the present-day Republic of Nigeria, were captured and brought to Georgia. Upon landing on St. Simons Island, the Ibo walked in unison into Dunbar Creek, choosing death over enslavement. Although the exact site is unknown, this historical marker represents the story of the Ibo's defiance to slavery.

LOVELY LANE CHAPEL AND MOORE METHODIST MUSEUM

Formerly named St. James Union Chapel, the church was built by Norman W. Dodge in 1880 to serve the workers at the lumber mills at Gascoigne Bluff. Today it is the oldest standing church building on St. Simons Island. Explore the Methodist movement and its founder at the nearby museum.

ST. SIMONS LIGHTHOUSE MUSEUM

Climb the 129 steps of the island's most iconic landmark—one of only five surviving lighthouses in Georgia—and be rewarded with breathtaking views of the Golden Isles.

BLOODY MARSH BATTLE SITE

On July 7, 1742, an outnumbered force of British troops ambushed and defeated Spanish troops, halting a planned attack on Fort Frederica. Visit the outdoor observation site to learn about the battle, which once and for all ended Spain's claim to the Georgia territory.

FORT FREDERICA NATIONAL MONUMENT

Established by English General James Oglethorpe, Fort Frederica was used to protect the southern boundary. Today, the archaeological remnants of the fort are protected by the National Park Service. Take a free tour of the monument and explore the artifacts in the visitor center.

THE AVENUE OF THE OAKS

These magnificent oaks were planted in 1826 to provide an entrance to Retreat Plantation, once a prosperous cotton plantation. Visitors are welcome to drive around the magnificent double row of nearly 200-year-old live oaks.

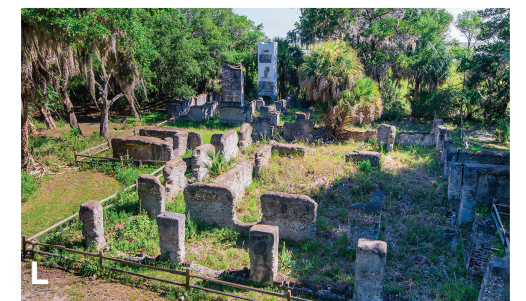


HISTORICAL HARRINGTON SCHOOL CULTURAL CENTER

The Harrington School is the last African-American school on the island and the most valuable venue to interpret the island's Gullah Geechee heritage.

CANNON'S POINT PRESERVE

The oldest remains on this world-class complex of archaeological sites are the several shell middens that date back to 2500 B.C. The site also contains the remains of an 18th-century house along with a large plantation-era home, outbuildings and slave quarters built in the early 1800s. Closed August and September.
