



HAMILTON PLANTATION TABBY SLAVE CABINS

Two tabby slave cabins built on Hamilton Plantation remain today at Gascoigne Bluff near Epworth by the Sea. The two modest structures have been carefully restored and received their placement on the National Register of Historic Places in 1988. HISTORICAL HARRINGTON SCHOOL CULTURAL CENTER

The last African-American school on St. Simons Island, the Harrington School is the most valuable venue to interpret the island's Gullah-Geechee heritage. CHRIST CHURCH, FREDERICA Built in 1884, Christ Church is nestled among huge oak trees on St. Simons Island's north end. ARTHUR J. MOORE METHODIST MUSEUM

On the grounds of Epworth by the Sea, this museum houses a vast collection of books and artifacts about founders John and Charles Wesley and is the official repository of records for the archives of the South Georgia Conference of the United Methodist Church.

THE AVENUE OF THE OAKS

These magnificent oaks were planted in 1826 to provide an entrance to Retreat Plantation, once a prosperous cotton plantation. ST. SIMONS LIGHTHOUSE MUSEUM

BLOODY MARSH BATTLE SITE

On July 7, 1742, an outnumbered force of British troops ambushed and defeated Spanish troops, halting a planned attack on Fort Frederica. Markers and information panels at this outdoor observation site explain the battle, which once and for all ended Spain's claim to the Georgia territory. **Old Demere Rd.**



REDFERN VILLAGE Shop, dine and stroll under the oaks in Redfern Village, a popular centrally-located district with dozens of locally-owned boutiques, restaurants, art galleries and a bookstore. Keep your eye out for the Redfern Village Tree Spirit. **1625 Frederica Rd.**



FORT FREDERICA NATIONAL MONUMENT Established by General James Oglethorpe in England, Fort Frederica was used to protect the Southern boundary. Today, the archaeological remnants of the fort still remain and are protected by the National Park Service. Free tours are open to the public daily along with a visitor center filled with artifacts and a gift shop.

CANNON'S POINT PRESERVE

The oldest remains on this world-class complex of archaeological sites are the several shell middens that date back to 2500 B.C. The site also contains the remains of an 18th-century house along with a large plantation-era home, outbuildings, and slave quarters built in the early 1800s.
