CASSINA GARDEN CLUB SLAVE CABINS Restored by the Cassina Garden Club, the

Hamilton Plantation Slave Cabins offer visitors an opportunity to step back in time and catch a glimpse of the past. In summer, visitors are able to tour the historic cabins. Private tours can be arranged by calling the number below.

LOVELY LANE CHAPEL

The oldest standing church on St. Simons Island, Lovely Lane Chapel was built by Norman Dodge in 1880. In 1897, a hurricane came through the area, causing the church to be repaired. Now, the church is open to the public for services and also serves as a popular wedding venue. (100 Arthur J. Moore Drive, 912-638-8688, epworthbythesea.org/chapel)



When entering The Lodge at Sea Island, visitors will be astonished by the double row of picturesque oak trees that line the entryway. They were planted by Anna Page King who inherited the land in 1826. Today, the trees are said to be over 160 years old. Access beyond the gate is restricted to Sea Island guests and members only. ST. SIMONS ISLAND PIER

One of the most popular sites on St. Simons Island, the pier is great for fishing or to see stunning views of the ocean. Located at the end of Mallery Street, the pier village shopping district also offers an array of dining and shopping options to choose from. (End of Mallery Street)



GOLDEN ISLES WELCOME CENTER

ST. SIMONS LIGHTHOUSE MUSEUM

One of only five surviving light towers in the state of Georgia, the St. Simons Lighthouse is an operational lighthouse which casts light as far out as 23 miles to sea. Open for tours daily where guests can explore the museum, climb the 129 steps to the top of the lighthouse and take in breathtaking views of the island. MARITIME CENTER

Interactive galleries and exhibits fill this unique museum that is located at the Coast Guard Station. The center gives guests great insight into the natural assets that the Georgia Coast has to offer, along with the maritime and military history of the island. The Coast Guard Station is also one of the main entrances to the beaches on St. Simons Island. (4201 1st Street, 912-638-4666, saintsimonslighthouse.org)



BLOODY MARSH NATIONAL MONUMENT

Located off of Demere Road, Bloody Marsh National Monument marks the location where an outnumbered force of British troops defeated Spanish troops in 1742. This battle ended Spain's claim to the Georgia territory. Open seven days a week, the monument is managed by the National (Old Demere Road, 912-638-3639, nps.gov)



HARRINGTON SCHOOL

The Harrington School is one of the many highlights of Gullah Geechee culture on the St. Simons African American tour. CHRIST CHURCH

Located on the north end of the Island, Christ Church was built in 1820, partially destroyed by Union troops, then rebuilt in 1884 by Anson Dodge. Now, it has an active congregation and is open for tours where visitors can explore the historic grounds and go inside to view gorgeous stained glass windows. FORT FREDERICA NATIONAL MONUMENT

Established by General James Oglethorpe in England, Fort Frederica was used to protect the Southern boundary. Today, the archaeological remnants of the fort still remain and are protected by the National Park Service. Free tours are open to the public daily along with a visitor center filled with artifacts and a gift shop. (6515 Frederica Road, 912-638-3639, nps.gov/fofr)



CANNON'S POINT PRESERVE

Acquired by the St. Simons Land Trust, Cannon's Point is a primitive wilderness experience featuring the native species to St. Simons Island and stunning maritime forests with six miles of marsh-upland interface. The preserve is open on Saturdays, Sundays and Mondays and is a "can't miss" experience for nature lovers. (912-638-9109, sslt.org)
