OUTDOORSY ADVENTURES IN COLORADO'S GRAND VALLEY

EXPLORE COLORADO NATIONAL MONUMENT Take in the towering sandstone pillars and red rock canyons of Colorado National Monument while driving or cycling along the historic 23-mile Rim Rock Drive.

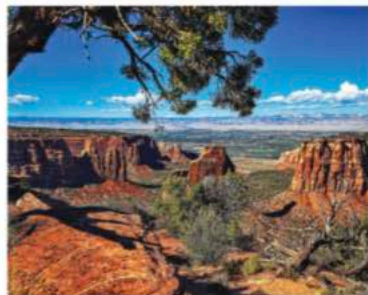


GO MOUNTAIN BIKING AT LUNCH LOOPS Whether you're a total newbie or a mountain biking pro, you'll find trails of varying difficulty at Lunch Loops, a popular trail system just west of downtown Grand Junction. (If you're a super-advanced mountain biker, check out the Palisade Plunge, a challenging 32-mile point-to-point backcountry trail.)



ADVENTURE ATOP THE GRAND MESA This region is home to the world's largest flat-top mountain, the Grand Mesa. Perched at roughly 10,000 feet above sea level, the Grand Mesa is an outdoor recreation lover's dream—perfect for hiking, fishing, paddleboarding, mountain biking, camping, and more.

PICK YOUR OWN FRUIT Palisade is known for its peaches—but farmers here also grow apples, cherries, apricots, pears, and other sweet treats. Many orchards offer a “u-pick” option, which, as the name suggests, means you can wander among the trees and pluck your own.



FLOAT THE COLORADO RIVER Beat the heat by paddleboarding, kayaking, tubing, or rafting the Colorado River, the same famed waterway that helps make this valley so fertile. —S.K.
