

In 1859, Nash Farm was established when Thomas Jefferson Nash and his wife Elizabeth purchased 110 acres of farmland in Grapevine. Today, it's the oldest farmstead in Tarrant County exploring the life of Grapevine's earliest settlers.





Preserving Heritage for Future Generations

The Farm raises heritage breeds of livestock, including sheep, turkeys and chickens, and grows seasonal heirloom field crops and produce year round. A variety of workshops and special events throughout the year, including the annual Barn Dance, Spring Into Nash, Fall Round-Up, Nash Farm Supper: A Farm-to-Fork Experience and more, offer guests unique learning experiences in a historic setting.





# Did you know?

Thomas and Elizabeth Nash raised five daughters and a son. In 1869, a mere ten years after purchasing the land, the Nash Family built the green Farmhouse.
