

Built in 1940, the Palace Theatre has hosted movie screenings, live musical performances and community events, captivating audiences with its character and charm. Thanks to the efforts of the Grapevine Heritage Foundation and with community support, the theatre has been meticulously restored and preserved, honoring its historic past, present and future. The Palace Theatre is listed on the National Historic Register.

Today, the Palace Theatre thrives as a vibrant cultural hub. An evening at the Palace Theatre offers a unique experience unlike other entertainment venues. Stepping into the Palace Theatre, with its original architectural details, transports visitors back in time.

The theatre regularly screens classic films, offers movies for children, and features an incredible lineup of live holiday performances during the annual Christmas Capital of Texas season.





At Nash Farm, visitors witness daily activities such as plowing fields and tending animals, providing insights into 19th-century farming. The original 1869 farmhouse, restored to its former glory, offers an authentic glimpse into the family's homelife and lifestyle. The farm features structures such as a barn, smokehouse and chicken house, all showcasing the pioneers' resourcefulness. Visitors can engage in hands-on experiences, learn historic cooking techniques and participate in year-round seasonal farming tasks.




OUR PURPOSE


