The complimentary event will take place Monday, November 25 from 4:00 to 8:30 p.m. This beloved tradition is the official kickoff to the **Christmas Capital of Texas**[®] festivities featuring more than 1,400 events over 40 days.

Main Street will be closed to traffic, and the event will feature an unforgettable Street Lighting at 5:30 p.m. Attendees will enjoy the vibrant glistening of lights from any location along Main Street, ensuring an excellent view from anywhere. This ensures everyone has a front-row view of the magic as Grapevine's Christmas lights illuminate simultaneously. The Carol of Lights is a come-and-go event, allowing guests to stroll Main Street at their leisure.

For Carol of Lights, Historic Main Street will close to car traffic at 6:00 p.m. Sunday, November 24 and will reopen at 11:00 p.m. Monday, November 25.
