Shopping - Power shop in Historic Downtown Grapevine, home to art galleries, gift shops, tea rooms, clothing boutiques, home accessories, antique stores and much more. Grapevine Mills is the largest retail and entertainment mall in the Southwest with 15 major anchor stores and more than 180 specialty stores. Bass Pro Shops Outdoor World has 200,000 square feet of retail devoted to outdoor activities, a sports enthusiast's dream.

Grapevine Vintage Railroad - Travel along the historic Cotton Belt Route between Grapevine and Fort Worth Historic Stockyards. The railroad is serviced by two vintage locomotives – "Puffy," an 1896 steam locomotive, and the oldest continuously operating steam engine in the Southwest, and "Vinny," a 1953 GP-7 diesel locomotive. Grapevine's Urban Wine and Craft Brew Trail (self-guided or DMC coordinated) - Visit several or all of Grapevine's nine tasting rooms and three craft breweries. Learn about the 5th largest wine industry in the U.S. For example:

(1) Bingham Family Vineyards - is pleased to bring their first wine tasting room to Grapevine, Texas. Since 1992, Cliff and his wife, Betty have served as pioneers in the Texas organic cotton and peanut markets and diversified their farming operations in 2003 by planting grape vines. Together with their children, the Binghams currently own or manage over 200 acres of wine grapes in the Texas High Plains American Viticultural Area. (2) Cross Timbers Winery - Located in the historic Dorris/Brock home one of the oldest structures in Grapevine and surrounded by centuries-old Oak and Pecan trees, the outdoor facilities feature a relaxed setting to enjoy wine tastings. The staff can share stories of Grapevine's history as well as wine making. The historic barn, patio, gazebo or tasting rooms are perfect for special events. (3) Delaney Vineyards & Winery - This French-style chateau has a 10-acre vineyard and tasting room where participants can tour and learn about winemaking from the vine through the bottling process. Settlement to City Museums at Ted R. Ware Plaza – Home to the Keeling House Museum, The Donald Schoolhouse and Grapevine Cotton Ginner's Museum, the Settlement to City Museums are open Tuesday-Saturday from 10 a.m. - 4 p.m., Sunday 11 a.m.-4 p.m. (subject to change). Keeling House Museum, resides in a ca. 1888 historic home and chronicles how Grapevine developed from a pioneer settlement into a world-class city and visitor destination. Inside the museum you will see old time police and fire treasures and other City of Grapevine artifacts. There is also a collection of Mayor William D. Tate's artifacts.

The Donald Schoolhouse a ca. 1900 school building, offers a lesson on education as it developed on the Grape Vine Prairie, beginning in a log cabin and growing into today's modern school district. Originally a Home Economics and Agriculture building for the Donald School, this building was situated on Denton Creek.

Grapevine Cotton Ginner's Museum, located inside a ca. 1910 house, chronicles the era when cotton was king and three gins in town prepared Grapevine's crop to touch the world. This museum features hands on activities including the route for Texas Prairie cotton. This wonderful museum can be reserved for private functions and conferences.

Grapevine Museums and Galleries - Housed in the Grapevine Convention & Visitors Bureau headquarters building, the Grand and Tower Galleries are home to a variety of traveling exhibits throughout the year, many of which are free. <u>www.grapevinetexasusa.com/grapevine-museums/galleries</u>

Historic Grapevine's Self-Guided Walking Tour - Explore Historic Downtown Grapevine where many buildings are pre-1900 and have earned Grapevine a place on *The National Register of Historic Places*. This is a terrific compliment to power shopping in Historic Downtown Grapevine and lunch at one of the many restaurants. Use your smart phone to scan the QR Codes around town that link to Grapevine's Self-Guided Walking Tour. The map is in the back of the Walking Guide Brochure and can be obtained at the Visitor's Information Center, 636 S. Main St.

Grapevine's Public Art Walk - Stroll down Main Street and discover the public art that tells Grapevine's story. Sculptures include *Benjamin Richard Wall* (corner of Wall and Main St.), the *Night Watchman* (atop City Hall), *Walking to Texas* (Liberty Park), *The Homecoming* (adjacent to Grapevine's Historic Cotton Belt Deport) and the *Sidewalk Judge* (Messina Hof Grapevine Winery). <u>www.grapevinetexasusa.com</u>
