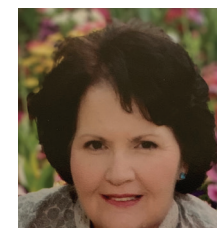

## HERITAGE TRAIL



Take a walk back in history from The Cotton Belt Depot to Settlement to City Museums! See how the original settlers on the Grape Vine Prairie lived and worked. This collection of historic sites and museums highlights the cultural and family life of early Grapevine residents and explores how technology helped transform the prairie into the city we now enjoy. Museums are open Friday, Saturday and Sunday from 10am-4pm. Located at 206 W. Hudgins St.

## THE MCPHERSON BARN



The circa 1850 Thomas Jefferson McPherson Log Barn, formerly at 900 Park Blvd., was moved across the street to the Cotton Belt Railroad District in 2017 and is Grapevine's second oldest structure! Crib barns were a popular type of barn found throughout the U.S. south and southeast regions. These barns were composed of multiple cribs, up to six, which were used for feed storage and livestock pens.

Today, Grapevine's four-crib log barn is one of only five known west of the Mississippi River. It has been restored to reflect Grapevine's early history.

## THE PALACE ARTS CENTER

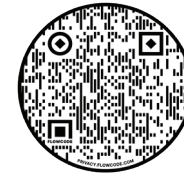
