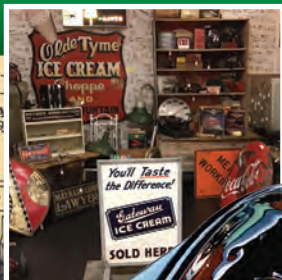

Get your kicks on Route 66 in Vinita where America's Main Street is their Main Street too. Nestled at the crossroads of Route 66 and the Jefferson Highway, this historic town celebrates its deep connection to America's past while offering endless opportunities for modern adventure. Cyrus Avery, the "Father of Route 66," once called Vinita home, and the town proudly keeps his legacy alive with year-round celebrations of the Mother Road, including the highly anticipated Route 66 Festival every June.

Step back in time at the Eastern Trails Museum, where exhibits highlight local Civil War history, railroads, ranching and the glory days of Route 66. Don't miss the recreated general store, doctor's office, printing press and post office.

Downtown Vinita's streets are lined with antique stores and unique shops like unique shops, antique stores and cafés. Pick up a gift at Home of Hope, or stop by 66 Apparel for custom screen-printed and embroidered items. Foodies can savor a meal at Piguet's Prime Time, a farm-to-fork experience specializing in wood fired steaks. Try the "cowboy candy" appetizer for something a little different!

Vinita's three municipal parks are ideal for family fun, offering everything from a splash pad and swimming pool to a skate park and disc golf. Just north of town, Vinita Lake Park provides a tranquil retreat for fishing, kayaking, hiking and primitive camping.

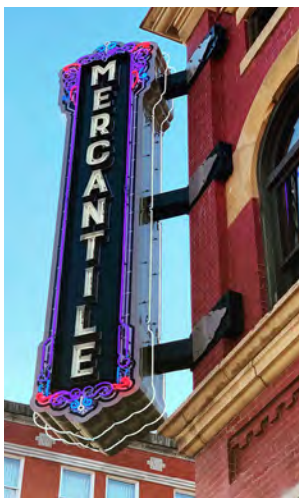
Dive into the rich cultural heritage and explore museums that weave the story of its past, from Native American roots to the pioneers who shaped its landscape.

SKIATOOK



The City of Skiatook is just minutes from Tulsa's historic downtown district. Enjoy a central retail corridor consisting of a five mile stretch of State Highway 20 that dissects the community and offers shopping, dining and fun for the entire family. Located just west of the city is beautiful Skiatook Lake, which boasts 10,190 surface acres and 160 miles of shoreline. Thousands of people visit each year to swim, boat, hike, camp and connect with nature. Hunters have access to 1,800 acres of project land, and fishing enthusiasts will marvel at the ample populations of sport fish including largemouth

bass, small-mouth bass, hybrid striped bass, crappie, channel catfish and bluegill, as well as drum, carp, and buffalo. Skiatook is also a popular sky diving area.

There is plenty of shopping and you won't want to miss the Antique Depot for one-of-a-kind items, antiques and collectibles. If all that shopping has worked up an appetite, then you are in luck. Mac's BBQ offers some of the most mouth-watering, tender barbecue in the state. Grab a bottle or two of their delicious sauce before leaving, and don't forget dessert.

Grove welcomes you with open arms to a world of serene landscapes, charming communities and endless outdoor adventures. If it's outdoor recreation you're after, Grove has it in spades with its prime location on Grand Lake O' The Cherokees, where you're welcomed with magnificent sunsets, all kinds of water sports and plentiful relaxation.



Step into the past with a visit to Grove's Har-Ber Village Museum, a pioneer-era village settled on six acres near Grand Lake O' The Cherokees. Browse a historic jail, drug store, mercantile, chapel and numerous cabins and log structures showcasing over 100 exhibits ranging from a chuckwagon and threshing machines to military and displays showcasing occupations of the time such as a dentist's office and doctor's office. Grove is also home to the beautiful and secluded Lendonwood Gardens where visitors can meander through eight lush acres packed with over 1,200 species. Visit during the spring for an array of azaleas, daffodils and dogwoods, while summer and fall each offer vibrant blooms and colorful foliage.

Set sail on the sparkling waters of Grand Lake, where fishing enthusiasts reel in trophy catches and memories that last a lifetime. Whether you're a seasoned angler or a first-time fisher, the region's pristine lakes and rivers promise an angling paradise. Embark on thrilling water sports adventures, from jet skiing to paddleboarding, there's no shortage of adrenaline-pumping activities on Grove's crystal-clear waters.

Make your trip to Grove even better with an overnight stay at the Honey Creek Area at Grand Lake State Park. Plan a trip during October when the park hosts the popular Pelican Festival. If camping isn't your jam, check out the dozens of privately-owned cabins and cottages surrounding the lake.

PRYOR

This progressive community in Green Country is home to the incredibly popular Rocklahoma Music Festival. Held over Labor Day Weekend, this hardcore festival packs three stages with non-stop rock from over 70 head-banging bands. Cyclists travel to Pryor each September to participate in Dam J.A.M., Oklahoma's most scenic one-day bicycle tour featuring fun rides of 33, 55, 73, or 105 miles! Country music lovers pack your wagons for the Born & Raised Festival, also in September. Nearby Salina hosts Chouteau Day - Oklahoma's Founders Day, in October with a huge celebration sure to please the entire family.

For even more thrilling action, head to the Salina Highbanks Speedway - the fastest speedway in Oklahoma! Top off the night at the on-site Finishline Bar & Grill for a great meal. Both Pryor and Salina have the privilege of being located around Lake Hudson, where plentiful camping and cabins are available all year.

Pryor's main thoroughfare, Graham Avenue/Highway 20, offers boutiques, vintage treasures and one-of-a-kind shops. Pick up lovely gifts at the Rust N Lace Mall, and then browse over 30,000 covers at the Book Exchange & Bible Bookstore. Abby's Place stocks must-have home decor and is always decked out for each season. Art lovers will want to visit the Rabbit Gallery in Pryor, which showcases the incredible

work of nationally-known artist Traci Rabbit. Located in the Old Katy Depot, the Co-Y-Yah Museum details local history, including art and artifacts from the Cherokee and Osage tribes.

Nearby Locust Grove offers unique shopping, museums and Wonder City Coffee offers locally-sourced coffee, tea, meals and more in a quaint setting. Over at Manda's Cones & Cream, you can score a chili cheese cone with mustard and onions. Afterward, enjoy premium Made in Oklahoma ice cream by the scoop. Chouteau, another nearby town, and home to a large Amish community, boasts the Dutch Pantry, Amish Cheese House and an abundance of antique stores.

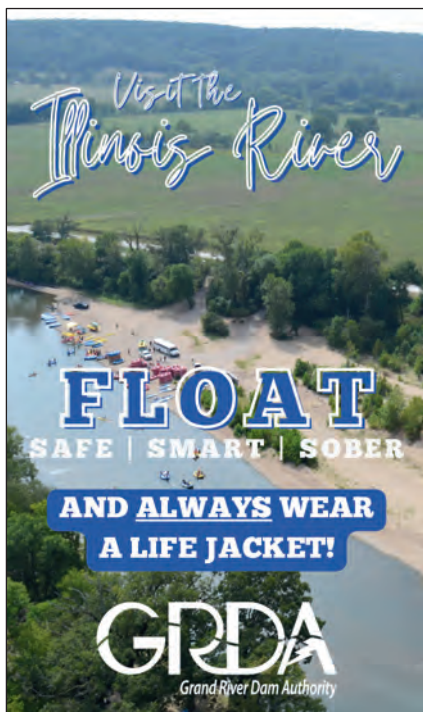



TAHLEQUAH

Nestled in the heart of the Cherokee Nation, Tahlequah invites travelers to embark on an unforgettable journey. Explore the region's breathtaking landscapes, from the rugged beauty of lush terrain to the serene shores of Lake Tenkiller, where outdoor adventures like hiking, fishing, boating and camping await. Paddle along the gentle currents of the Illinois River, surrounded by forests, towering bluffs and the occasional sight of majestic bald eagles soaring overhead.

Step back in time as you immerse yourself in Cherokee history and culture. Downtown Tahlequah offers a glimpse into the rich heritage of the Cherokee people through museums and cultural sites. Don't miss the Cherokee Nation Gift Shop on the outskirts of town!

Beyond history, Tahlequah boasts a lively atmosphere with charming boutiques, art galleries, antique shops and dining options that range from homestyle cooking to authentic Cherokee cuisine. Festivals, art shows and outdoor concerts keep the town buzzing year-round. Whether you're seeking outdoor adventures or cultural experiences, Tahlequah promises memories that will last a lifetime.



PONCA CITY

The magnificent Marland Mansion is the crown jewel in Ponca City. This 55-room mansion was built by oil tycoon E. W. Marland during the oil boom days of the 1920s. It is exquisitely furnished and has been recognized as one of America's castles. Marland's first home, the Grand Home, is also available for touring with an American Indian Museum on the second floor showcasing a diverse collections of Native American Indian artifacts focused on the north central tribes of Oklahoma: Ponca, Osage, Otoe-Missouri, Kaw, Pawnee and Tonkawa.

After exploring the opulent "Palace on the Prairie" and Marland's Grand Home, enjoy an equally decadent meal at Danny's BBQ Head Quarters. Family owned and operated by Oklahoma Barbecue Society Hall of Fame honoree Danny Head, this amazing eatery has twice won the Kansas City American Royal International Invitational Barbecue Grand Championship and the Jack Daniels Invitational World Barbecue Grand Championship, as well as countless other regional and state championships and prestigious awards.
