### NATIONAL AVIATION HERITAGE AREA

*Many agree that the airplane was the invention that changed the course of human history more than any other. Upon visiting NAHA, you will grasp that significance and come away with a new appreciation of one of America's greatest stories. Huffman Prairie Flying Field and Interpretive Center are located in Greene County and are part of the NAHA area, home of the Wright-Brothers and the birthplace of aviation.*





### **Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park**

The human imagination found its highest expression in three men from Dayton, Ohio: **Wilbur and Orville Wright**, first to fly a powered, heavier-than-air machine and creators of the practical airplane, and **Paul Laurence Dunbar**, who, with his compelling new voice, was the first African American writer to win high distinction in American literature. Dayton Aviation Heritage commemorates the lives and legacies of these three exceptional men and the history of aviation. The park is a cooperative effort between the National Park Service and four partners.

### **Huffman Prairie Flying Field**

Huffman Prairie Flying Field, a national historic landmark, is located at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base in Greene County. This 84-acre pasture is where Wilbur and Orville Wright undertook the difficult and dangerous task of creating a dependable, fully controllable airplane and training themselves to be pilots. The field looks just as it did when the Wright brothers flew here in 1904.

### **Huffman Prairie Flying Field and Interpretive Center (FREE)**

The Huffman Prairie Interpretive Center exhibits focus on the Wright brothers' experimental flights at Huffman Prairie Flying Field in 1904 and 1905, and on The Wright Company's flying school from 1910 to 1916. The Interpretive Center also covers the history of Wright-Patterson Air Force Base from its beginnings at McCook Field in Dayton during World War I, up to its contributions to the aerospace projects of the future now being carried out at its current complex, which includes the Huffman Prairie Field where Wilbur and Orville Wright turned their invention into a practical machine.

# AFRICAN AMERICAN HERITAGE

## **National Afro-American Museum and Cultural Center**

NAAMCC educates the public about African American history and culture, from African origins to the present, by collecting, preserving, and interpreting material evidence of the Black experience. The NAAMCC, which celebrated its 30th anniversary in 2018, is the permanent home of one of the nation's premier collections of African American material history, with over 9,000 artifacts and artwork, over 350 manuscript collections, and tens of thousands of photographs and other images.

The NAAMCC collections, which range from the late 1700s to the 21st century, are of local, regional, national, and even international significance. The collections cover many aspects of history and culture. It includes African American art, historical documents of Black organizations, inventions, childhood memorabilia, sports, military history, Civil Rights, Ohio historic Wilberforce, and the greater Miami Valley community. The collections include sculptures, textiles, weapons, and other significant three-dimensional artifacts. Some very important artifacts include a dress uniform owned by General Benjamin O. Davis, Sr., Alex Haley's typewriter and his final draft of *Roots*, and Gregory Hines' tap shoes.

Current museum exhibitions include:

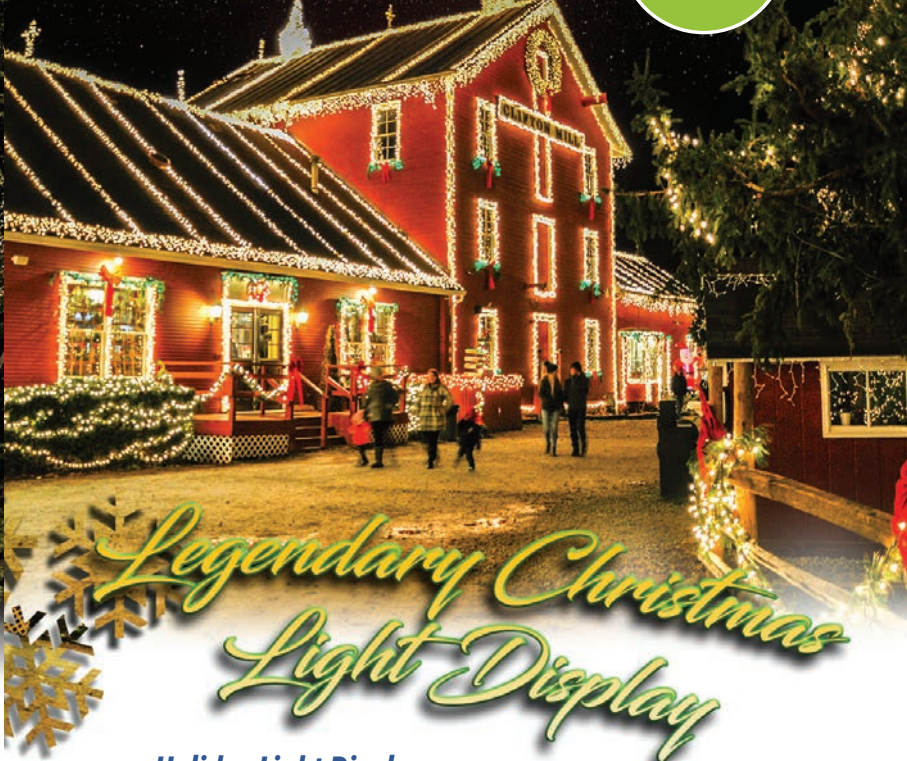
- **African Americans Fighting for A Double Victory**, now through 2024 – Explore how African Americans served our country in the military and on the home front during World War II and how their actions influenced the Civil Rights Movement.
- **Behind the Mask-Black Power in Comics**, now through 2024 – Learn about the painful and triumphant history of African Americans in comic books as you delve into the stories of black comic book characters who, in the past, were rarely featured as heroes.
- **Queens of the Heartland**, now through 2024 – Learn the stories of 30 Ohio African American women through this award-winning exhibition who significantly influenced the Suffrage and Civil Rights Movements.

NAAMCC, which is one of the over 50 historic sites and museums of the Ohio History Connection, is located on the campus of Central State University, 1350 Brush Row Rd., Wilberforce. The Historic Clifton Mill was built in this location to take advantage of the natural power of the concentrated water funneled from the Little Miami River into the Clifton Gorge. The Satariano family purchased the mill in 1987 and continue to preserve its historical integrity. Today, you can still see the mill operate, converting natural water power into energy. Tour the facility to see early machinery, and see how stones are used to grind grain into flour. A visit to historic Clifton Mill is truly an educational experience that you and your family will long remember.

# COVERED BRIDGES

Greene County currently has five historical covered bridges that have been restored/renovated while preserving their original design and structure. These five bridges were built between 1877 and 1883 and one brand new bridge that was built in 2014.

Although the roof over the covered bridge is what sets it apart from other bridges, the trusses are what distinguish one covered bridge from another. A truss is a frame containing beams and braces arranged in triangular shapes. This arrangement of triangles allows each brace to support the other, and working together they support whatever weight is placed upon the bridge.



### Charles F. Dean Ballard Road Bridge #3

Spanning Caesar Creek north branch, the bridge was built in 1883 by J.C. Brown using Howe trusses. The overall length is 80 feet with a clear span of 73 feet. H.E. Hebble was the mason on this bridge and Brown did the superstructure. This is one of the loveliest covered bridges in Ohio.



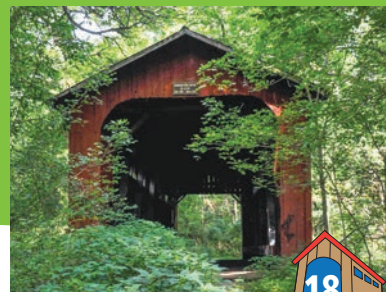
### Robert N. Geyer Charleton Mill Road Bridge #11

This bridge was built over Massie's Creek in 1883 by Henry E. Hebble using Howe trusses. The overall length is 128 feet with a clear span of 120 feet. Major repairs were required in 1969 when a truck loaded with gravel attempted to cross the bridge and caused the floor to give way. There are now steel I-beams under the floor. Currently a working bridge to automobile traffic.



### Engle Mill Road Bridge #14

Spanning Anderson's Fork, it was built in 1887 by the Smith Bridge Co. with Smith trusses. The overall length is 148 feet with a clear span of 136 feet. Engle Mill Road Bridge has been taken out of service and is now a drive-by bridge with off-road parking for visitors to stop and get a closer look at this restored structure.



### Grinnell Road Bridge #18

Previously called the Cemetery Road Bridge, it originally spanned Anderson's Fork. It was built in 1886 by Henry E. Hebble using Howe trusses with turnbuckles on the iron rods that could be tightened. The overall length was 130 feet with a clear span of 126 feet. In 1979, the 60-foot center section was moved from Cemetery Road to Glen Helen Nature Reserve. The bridge is no longer in use and is accessible by a foot path from Grinnell Road.



### Richard P. Eastman Hyde Road Bridge #30

The Richard P. Eastman Hyde Road covered bridge in Yellow Springs is named in honor of Dick Eastman who was the Greene County Engineer from 1974 through 1996. The new structure is a 77-foot span Howe Truss, which was a popular design in the mid-to-late 1800's.



### Stevenson Road Bridge #32

Also known as Whiteman's Bridge and the Wright Bridge, it spans Massie's Creek. It was built in 1877 by Smith Bridge Co. using Smith double trusses. The overall length is 99 feet with a clear span of 95 feet. The bridge has been restored and reconstructed and is out of service to road traffic, but visitors are able to stop and enjoy this wonderful structure.







# BIKE TRAILS

A SURPRISE AROUND EVERY TURN



No matter where you like to ride or hike, there's a place in Greene County to do it. Five trails in Greene County with four converging at Xenia Station, the Greene Trails rails-to-trails system reaches out in four directions on over 140 miles of paved trails. Over 600 miles of county and township roads wait to be explored by bike, including a half-century ride that visits all five of Greene County's covered bridges. John Bryan State Park and MoMBA both offer off-road cycling trails.

**Greene County's paved trails connect to the nation's largest network of paved, off-street trails!**







### Road Riding

Over 600 miles of county and township roads in Greene County beckon you to discover a serene rural landscape. Pedal through alternating bands of sun and shadow alongside the Little Miami River or race ten arrow-straight miles to the heart of farm-rich Ross Township. Ride a half-century trail that visits five covered bridges.

### John Bryan Mountain Bike Trails

There are 7.5 miles of mountain biking trails at John Bryan State Park. The trails were built and are maintained by the Miami Valley Mountain Bike Association in partnership with John Bryan State Park. They are the only trails in the park that are open to bicycles. They are all accessible from the Arboretum Trail which is maintained by the park and is also open to hikers.

All trails are clearly marked with signs. Watch for arrows showing the recommended route at intersections. The recommended route is to start on Power Line Trail, continue on Abracadabra Trail and then finish on the Great Scott Trail. A ride of all the trails is a total of about 7.5 miles.

### MoMBA Mountain Biking Area

The MoMBA network consists of 8.3 miles of trails designed specifically for mountain biking. For safety reasons, recreational hiking, walking and running are prohibited on mountain bike trails. Located within Huffman MetroPark, 4485 Union Rd., Dayton.

### Rails-to-Trails Bike Paths

There are over 140 miles of paved, well-maintained bike paths for you to enjoy here with trail-side lodging, restaurants, parking and services readily available. From Xenia, trails extend in every direction along retired railroad corridors. Ride through wetlands, prairies and woodlands.

### Xenia Station

Xenia Station is located in Xenia on Miami Avenue between South Detroit Street (U.S. 68) and Cincinnati Avenue (U.S. 42) about three blocks south of the Greene County Courthouse. Look for the B&O caboose. Restrooms are located in the replica of the original telegraph office. There is ample parking.

### Beavercreek Bike Hub

Located on North Fairfield Road, between U.S. 35 and Dayton-Xenia Road on the Creekside Trail. Parking. Restrooms. Vending Machines.

### Yellow Springs Station

Yellow Springs Station is a replica of the original train station and is the welcome center for the community with public restrooms. Located at the intersection of Dayton Street and Xenia Avenue. There is ample public parking in the area. Yellow Springs was named a Bicycle Friendly Community by the League of American Bicyclists.



### Little Miami Scenic Trail (Xenia to Urbana)

It is 15.8 miles north from Xenia Station to Beatty Station in Clark County. After Yellow Springs, the trail passes through farm fields where you can also take a quick ride off the trail to Young's Jersey Dairy. A new trail section takes you into downtown Springfield where you can grab a coffee, enjoy lunch or stop by Mother Stewart's Brewery. You can also connect to the Buck Creek Scenic Trail going west to Cliff Park and the Springfield Museum of Art or east to Buck Creek State Park. The Little Miami Scenic Trail extends north as the Simon Kenton Trail 16.6 miles to Urbana.

### Staging areas with parking & restrooms.

**Xenia Station:** Miami Avenue

**Yellow Springs:** Parking available off U.S. 68 near Yellow Springs Station and at Ellis Park on Polecat Road.

**Beatty:** On Yellow Springs Street off U.S. 68 on the southwest edge of Springfield.

**Springfield:** At Veterans' Park at S.R. 72 (Limestone Street) and Warder Street north of downtown Springfield.

**Urbana:** At the YMCA on S.R. 36 east of downtown Urbana.

### Little Miami Scenic Trail (Xenia to Newtown)

It is 56.4 miles from Xenia Station south to Newtown. The name of the trail is derived from the fact that it follows the Little Miami River Valley. Also known as the Bullsken Trace, the Little Miami River Valley has served as a corridor of travel for over ten thousand years. Parts of the valley predate the Wisconsin Glacier, which set the current drainage system, having been part of the now extinct Teays River System that flowed north to Fort Wayne, Indiana. This section is very shaded with an abundance of natural serenity.

**Spring Valley:** On Main Street off S.R. 725 on the south edge of Spring Valley.

**Corwin:** On Corwin Avenue east of U.S. 42 in Waynesville.

**Loveland:** Any of the public lots on Main Street (U.S. 48).

**Milford:** Avoca Park on U.S. 50 3.3 miles east of the Little Miami River.



### Creekside Trail (Xenia to Dayton)

It is 15.21 miles from Xenia Station to Eastwood MetroPark in Montgomery County. Referred to in the past as the H-connector, this trail derives its current name from the fact that it follows Shawnee Creek out of Xenia and the Little and Big Beaver Creeks through Beavercreek. The trail passes through wooded areas, farm fields, and wetlands and is known for the multitude of wildflowers. It is possible to ride through Eastwood MetroPark to connect to the Mad River Bikeway and the Great Miami River Corridor Bikeway.

**Xenia Station:** Miami Avenue

**Xenia:** James Ranch and Fairground Recreation Center on Fairground Road next to the Fairgrounds.

**Beavercreek Station:** North Fairfield Road off U.S. 35 and Beavercreek Community Park on Factory Road.

### Ohio to Erie Trail (Xenia to London)

It is 28.67 miles from Xenia Station to the Madison County Senior Center on the west side of London. It is possible to follow bike route signs one mile to an additional 9 miles of trail. This is a straight trail that parallels U.S. 42 as it passes through a beautiful rural landscape and is well known for the variety and proliferation of wild flowers and birds. Very little of this trail is shaded. When complete, the Ohio to Erie Trail will connect the Ohio River at Cincinnati to Lake Erie at Cleveland and be over 330 miles in length.

#### Staging areas with parking & restrooms.

**Xenia Station:** Miami Avenue

**Cedarville:** On S.R. 72.

**South Charleston:** From U.S. 42 go south on S.R. 41 to West Mound Road (It is Mound Street to the east and Mound Road to the west.) Turn right. Station is immediately past High Street

**London:** At Shelter #1 behind the Madison County Senior Center at 280 W. High Street (U.S. 42) just west of Midway Street (S.R. 38).

### Jamestown Connector (Xenia to Jamestown)

It is 16.0 miles from Xenia Station to the Fayette County line west of Jamestown. This is a straight trail that follows the old railroad.

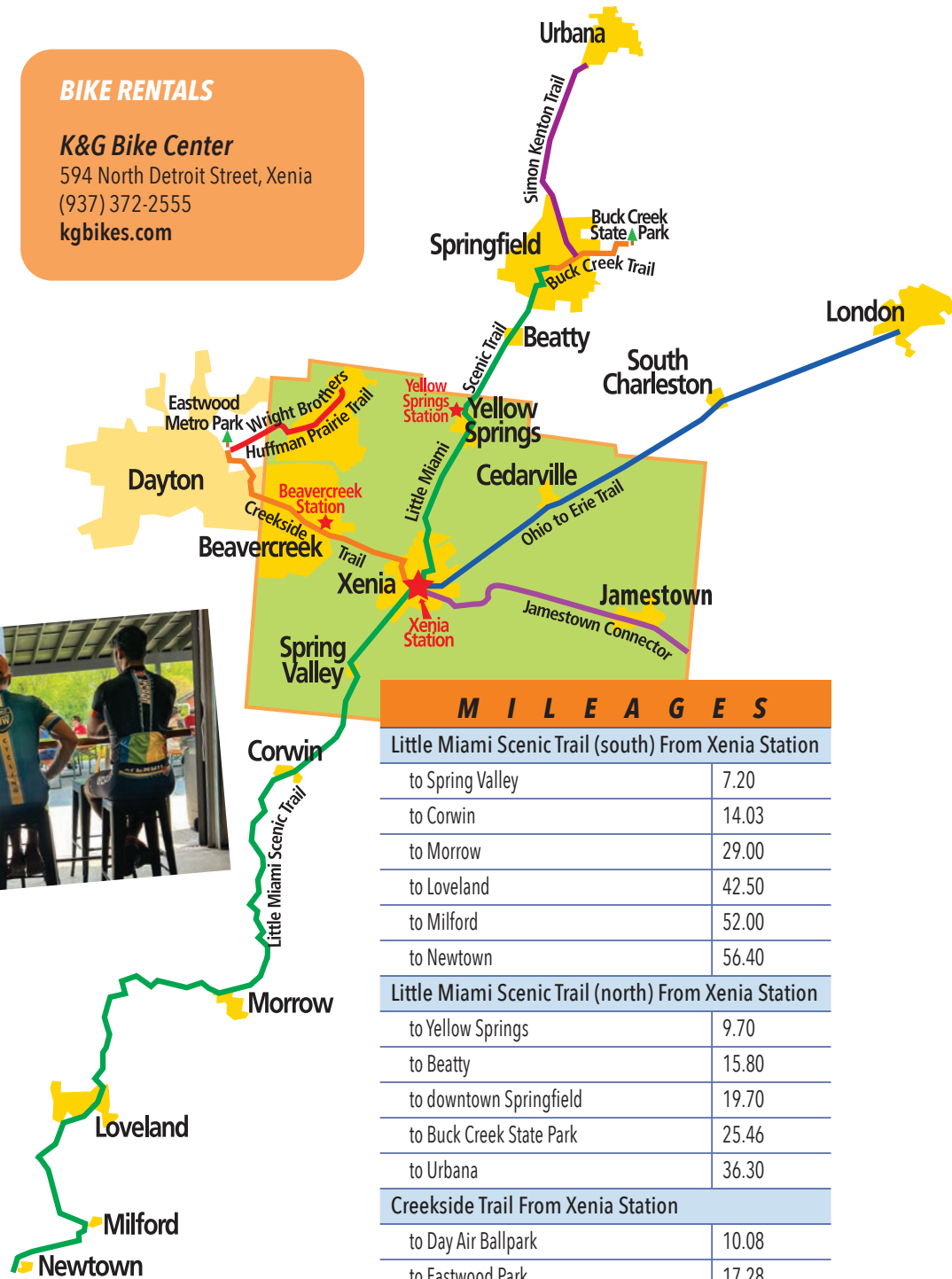

## OHIO'S NEWEST 76th STATE PARK

### **Great Council State Park**

Located on State Route 68, between Xenia and Yellow Springs, in Oldtown, the park will feature a cultural interpretive center focused on Ohio's Native Peoples, their history in their Ohio homeland, and their lives today.

The 12,000 square foot interpretive center will be a three-story structure, designed to pay tribute to the Shawnee longhouse, the traditional dwelling of the Shawnee people. A living stream will be the signature display on the main floor. Also on this entry level is a theater, exhibits, welcome desk, gift area, and restrooms.



### **Preserving the site at Oldtown**

gives us the opportunity to connect future generations of Ohioans with the past, to preserve the legacy of the Shawnee and allow them to share their story, and to share the experience of the pioneers, settlers and frontiersmen in the area.

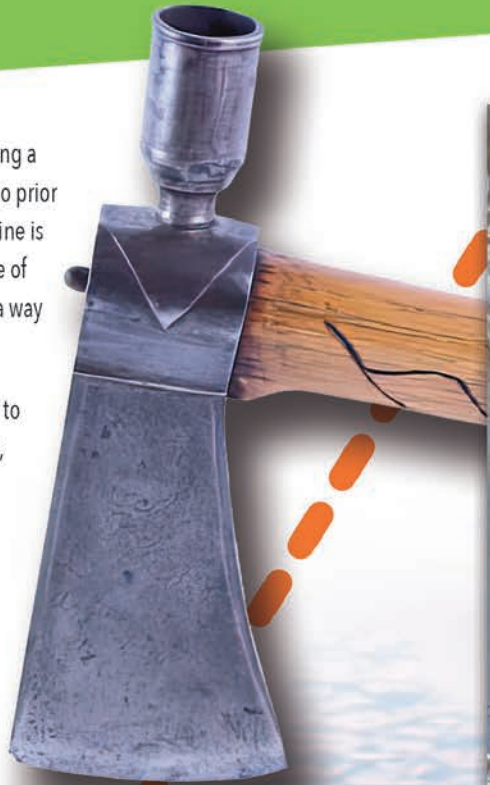
The second floor will feature displays documenting a historical timeline of the Shawnee People in Ohio prior to European settlement to current day. The timeline is punctuated with interesting stories about people of historical importance, bringing history to life in a way that is relatable and memorable.

The lower level of the building will be dedicated to temporary exhibits about the history, culture, art, and modern-day Shawnee Tribe.

The building is a 12,000 square foot modern interpretation of a council house, a central component of the Shawnee village, which would have been used as a primary gathering place.

The building includes a second floor balcony which allows for a view from where the Shawnee village would have been located at the end of the 1700s, including the presumed location of the original council house on site.

The basement gallery has been designed to meet museum-grade curation standards, providing strict environmental and security controls, to allow the facility to house specialized curated and traveling exhibits, displays, and artifacts. Because of the sensitive nature of these exhibits, additional security requirements have been designed into the project as a whole.


The site is developed in an effort to recreate the look and feel of the oak savannah that would have existed in the last 1700s when the Shawnee had established their village at this location, using native grasses as the foreground and wood inspired elements on the building as the backdrop.

The variation of opaque wood-look walls, mixed with clear curtain-wall glazing, mimic the depth of the woodlands that would have existing on site in the late 1700s. This provides for a balanced mix of solid walls for exhibits and displays on the inside and open views to the exterior to create a more direct connection to the site, even while inside the building.

With the acquisition of an additional 14 acres adjacent to the building site, a native prairie with half a mile loop trail will be established.
