Pledge of Allegiance

Today is Tuesday, April 14, 2026, and the time being 5:30 pm. The meeting of the Greensburg Board of Works has been called to order.

Minutes from the March 10 regular meeting and April 6 executive session meeting were approved as presented.

Old Business

New Business

Deena Hamer with the Decatur County YMCA requested road closures for the Tree City Rolling Tour. This year it will be held on June 27. No official road closures are requested but police guidance is requested for the intersection of Washington and Lincoln from 6:45 AM to approximately 10:00 AM. Motion to approve the police presence and road usage made by Robin Meyer, seconded by Lauren Barnhorst. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Brennley Jameson and Declan Bruns, members of the Mayor's Youth Council, were present to request road closures for the 5K Color Run to be held June 20 from 9 am – 12 pm. This is officially the third year, even though the event was rained out last year. Motion to approve the road closures and police presence as requested made by Robin Meyer, seconded by Jamie Cain. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Carol Pumphrey is hosting the Indiana Grand Auto Tour on either August 4th or 5th. The tour will bring 75-100 vintage automobiles to downtown Greensburg as part of a Midwest tour. The request is to use Franklin Street as a staging zone for the cars. The event is not an official car show, but consolidating the cars in one space may create an impromptu car show. Franklin Street from Washington to Main is requested for parking. Motion to close Franklin Street from Washington to Main on either August 4th or 5th when the date is chosen made by Jamie Cain, seconded by Lauren Barnhorst. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Building Commissioner Sarah Hamer requested approval of a sign that would hang into the right of way at 211 E Main Street. Motion to approve the sign as presented made by Lauren Barnhorst, seconded by Robin Meyer. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Zach Wirrig opened bids for the 2016 Dodge Charger. Bid amount \$3,680.00 from Ringwood Motors Incorporated. The second bid is from Brett Patti of Emergency Remarketing for \$1,888.18. Motion to approve the sale of the 2016 Dodge Charger to Ringwood Motors Incorporated made by Glenn Tebbe, seconded by Lauren Barnhorst. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

No bids were received for the 2002 Taurus SE. Motion to allow Zach Wirrig to place it on public auction with no reserve bid made by Glenn Tebbe, seconded by Robin Meyer. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Wirrig presented an on-call contract extension for Christopher B. Burke for MS4 reporting. We have used this same type of on-call contract since 2022. The contract is not to exceed \$50,000. Motion to extend the contract with Christopher B Burke Engineering made by Glenn Tebbe, seconded by Robin Meyer. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Wirrig gave updates on the City projects. For the CCMG 2026-02 project, awarded to O'Mara was the mill and fill. Microsurfacing was awarded to All-Star Paving. This is from the bids from last month. INDOT has many projects going on around the City this summer and into the fall. Wirrig will keep all City departments updated on all closures and project progression.

Street Commissioner Mark Klosterkemper requested the purchase of a Heil 5000 high compaction trash compactor. He presented three quotes. He requested the one from SourceWell, due to the location and the brand, as well as the price. Klosterkemper also requested the purchase of the chassis from International to support the new compactor. The old truck will be traded in to help reduce the overall cost. Motion to approve the purchase of the chassis from International and the body from Heil for a total of \$244,000 made by Glenn Tebbe, seconded by Lauren Barnhorst. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Commissioner Klosterkemper also advised the Board that he submitted an unofficial detour to INDOT for the I74 construction. If approved, it would allow the City and County to be reimbursed for any damages done to the detour during the construction process. The initial submission was denied. However, seeing that the City and County have made over \$900,000 in improvements in just the last year to this specific route, Klosterkemper, along with the County, would like support in appealing INDOT's decision. The Board fully supports Klosterkemper in this endeavor.

Fire Chief Nate Stoermer and firefighter Roger Volk presented information on grain bin trainings they have recently completed. They showed pictures of the facility specially created to do the training. The facility has been used by surrounding fire departments to do the same type of training. Chief Stoermer requested reimbursement payment to Justin Greathouse who helped build the facility. The payment will come from the training budget. Motion to approve the reimbursement payment to Justin Greathouse of \$5,666.14 made by Glenn Tebbe, seconded by Robin Meyer. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Chief Stoermer also requested the approval of stand-alone body armor panels for EMT providers. He presented three quotes, there is one that is less from a local vendor in Indianapolis and is \$6,960. The body armor is intended for use in active shooter situations to help provide care for victims and protection for those providing assistance. Motion to approve the purchase from Star Uniform made by Jamie Cain, seconded by Lauren Barnhorst. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Police Chief Mike McNealy and Captain Wayne Davis presented department awards. Seargeant Jacob Mays was presented the Meritorious Service Award. In addition, Officer John Amis was presented with both a Meritorious Award and a Purple Heart Award. These were awarded for the same event on the evening of Thanksgiving 2025.

Chief McNealy presented an adoption of the Tactical Medic Policy. Captain Wayne Davis discussed the specifics of the policy and listed the individual firefighters who have gone through the training to be part of this team. The purpose of adding Greensburg Fire Department personnel to the Tactical Response Team is to enhance the team's capability to safeguard team members, the public, and suspects if high-risk operations or violent encounters result in injury. Motion to adopt the policy as presented made by Jamie Cain, seconded by Robin Meyer. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Chief McNealy requested the promotion from probationary status to first class police officer for Curtis Keppel. Motion to approve the promotion and backdate the pay to March 31 made by Jamie Cain, seconded by Lauren Barnhorst. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Chief McNealy requested road closures for the upcoming public safety cookout events. Motion to approve the road closures as presented made by Glenn Tebbe, seconded by Robin Meyer. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Finally, Chief McNealy and Mayor Joshua Marsh performed the swearing in of Officer Robert Runstrom.

Motion to approve claims as presented made by Robin Meyer, seconded by Lauren Barnhorst. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Adjourn
