Today is Tuesday, April 8, 2025, and the time being 6:30 pm. The meeting of the Greensburg City Council has been called to order.

Approval of Minutes

Meeting minutes for the March 11 meeting, as well as the March 31 and April 1 Executive Sessions, were approved as presented.

New Business

Police Chief Mike McNealy presented a contract with Motorola. There is now going to be an annual increase of 11% instead of the 8.5% the department has used for budgeting. The encouragement of the company was to go to a subscription-based contract. This contract is for both County and City. The County holds the contract, but the City is a funding partner. The department heads at both the County and City level are in favor of the five-year contract. Chief McNealy highlighted several additional perks of the contract as well. Motion to approve the contract and preauthorize the Mayor to sign (if necessary) made by Mark Carman, seconded by Jamie Cain. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Chief McNealy also presented a Memorandum of Understanding for the Crisis Intervention Team between the City and the County. Motion to approve the Memorandum of Understanding made by Jamie Cain, seconded by Kevin Fleetwood. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Director of Public Projects Zach Wirrig presented an option to sell the parking lot owned by the City at 128 W Railroad Street. This would be sold to Iron Men who will be developing apartments downtown. This would allow them to have overflow parking. The developers have stated it would also be open to public parking. This could potentially add an additional 50-60 parking spots for the apartments, as well as downtown parking. Motion to approve the sale of the lot at 128 W Railroad Street for \$55,000 pending EDA approval made by Jamie Cain, seconded by Darrell Poling. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Wirrig also gave updates on the local projects, including Washington Street and the trail out at Rebekah Park.

Clerk Treasurer Amy Borns presented Resolution 2025-09 Declaration of Dormant Funds. These funds have had no activity or have no balance for at least two years. This resolution would allow these funds to be taken off the books and the balance, if any, be moved to the General Fund. Motion to approve Resolution 2025-09 made by Rodney King, seconded by Jamie Cain. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Mayor Joshua Marsh recommended that Laura Jo Tebbe be re-appointed to the Library Board. Motion to approve the appointment made by Jamie Cain, seconded by Rodney King. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Wastewater Superintendent Joe Cain gave an update to the Board about activities that happened over the weekend due to the torrential rains from Thursday to Sunday. The Council and Mr. Cain wanted to make sure the department is recognized for the work they did and the many hours they put in over the weekend.

Council members gave updates on their respective boards and commissions.
