



CITY COUNCIL MEETING

Pledge of Allegiance

Today is Tuesday, May 12, 2026, and the time being 6:30 pm. The meeting of the Greensburg City Council has been called to order.

Roll Call

Approval of Minutes

Minutes from the April 14 regular meeting and May 4 executive session were approved as presented.

Old Business

Building Commissioner Sarah Hamer presented Ordinance 2026-02 for Rezoning of E Fourth Street for second reading. Motion to approve Ordinance 2026-02 on second reading made by Jamie Cain, seconded by Darrell Poling. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

New Business

Leigh Ann Dashiell from Decatur County Communications presented an agency update.

Decatur County EMA Director Mike Snyder gave an update on the agency.

Snyder presented Resolution 2026-09 for a Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan. It is a federal requirement that counties must update every five years under the Hazard Mitigation Act. It was adopted last month by the county to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program and be eligible for hazard mitigation funding. The next step is that all the cities and towns within the county adopt it as well. Motion to approve Resolution 2026-09 made by Jamie Cain, seconded by Rodney King. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Snyder also presented a Mutual Aid Agreement. This is a requirement to have in place between the city and county, especially if there is a desire to receive reimbursements from FEMA for disastrous or catastrophic events. It also allows for the reimbursement of services from one community to another. The agreement is voluntary, and reimbursement

costs can be waived or deemed unreasonable. Motion to approve the mutual aid agreement as presented made by Jamie Cain, seconded by Mark Carman. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Fire Chief Nathan Stoermer presented Ordinance 2026-03 to amend Ordinance 2025-19 City Salary Ordinance on first reading. This is a change based on the new Honda contract. It only changes the pay for the Honda Hotworks and Honda Hotworks Emergency pays. Motion to approve Ord 2026-03 on first reading made by Jamie Cain, seconded by Darrell Poling. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Motion to suspend the rules for Ordinance 2026-03 made by Jamie Cain, seconded by Rodney King. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Motion to approve Ordinance 2026-03 on second reading made by Jamie Cain, seconded by Rodney King. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Motion to approve backpay for those fire employees who have already earned the updated pay rate made by Jamie Cain, seconded by Rodney King. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Police Chief Mike McNealy and Director of Public Projects Zach Wirrig requested approval of surplus vehicles being sold through an auction. Chief McNealy presented a 2017 Dodge Charger and a 2015 Ford Taurus, both with mileage exceeding 75,000 and some mechanical issues. The online auction service has presented the following fees: \$175 to open an auction. \$20/hour for any work (max \$150), 10% commission (max \$1,500), and will meet Indiana code requirements for public advertisement. Money for the cars would go back into the general fund, anything earned from the sale of the weapons would go into the LECE fund. Director of Public Projects Zach Wirrig also said that last month two vehicles were put up for sealed bids, only one of them receiving any bids. The winner of that bid process has not been responsive in claiming the vehicle. It was recommended by the city attorney that Wirrig should present written notice to the highest bidder, giving them an opportunity to fulfill their obligation. A general motion to approve the use of the online auctions to dispose of surplus items now and in the future was made by Jamie Cain, seconded by Mark Carman. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Motion to approve the auction service to sell the two surplus vehicles from the police department plus the Ford Taurus that received no bids last month made by Jamie Cain, seconded by Mark Carman. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

It was recommended that the lead bidder on the vehicle from last month be given 10 days to respond. If they do not respond within 10 days, the vehicle should go back to the Board of Works for a decision on what to do

Council members gave updates on their respective boards and commissions.

Adjourn

Motion to adjourn made by Darrell Poling. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes. Meeting adjourned at 7:24 PM.
