Today is Tuesday, June 9, 2026, and the time being 6:30 pm. The meeting of the Greensburg City Council has been called to order.

Approval of Minutes

Minutes from the May 12 regular meeting and May 13 executive session were approved as presented.

New Business

Main Street Greensburg Executive Director Allison Beck presented an annual update report on the organization.

Executive Director of the Economic Development Corporation Bryan Robbins presented a submission for a tax abatement from Valeo. They are requesting incentive on a new investment. The tax abatement committee suggested a 3-year phase-in tax abatement. This abatement will be laid out in Resolution 2026-13. Motion to approve Resolution 2026-13 as presented made by Mark Carman, seconded by Darrell Poling. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Robbins also presented the renewal of current abatements. These must be renewed every year as long as they are still on the schedule for their abatements. Two renewals requested an extension to their abatement. The current rules allow them to request two 1-year extensions. They are each requesting a 1-year extension, and each had requested an extension last year, making it their final extension. Motion to approve 2024-06 and 2024-14 for extension made by Mark Carman, seconded by Daryl Tressler. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Robbins presented tax abatement renewal for abatement 2020-19. This business was given a deadline last year to finish their business and put their plan into place by July 1, 2026. This is not going to be completed by that date. Motion to approve the recommendation of the committee to terminate the abatement of 2020-19 based on it not meeting the deadline made by Mark Carman, seconded by Vietta McKenzie. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Motion to approve all remaining abatement renewals as presented made by Darrell Poling, seconded by Mark Carman. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Police Chief Mike McNealy requested approval for the purchase of a new vehicle this year, as they have a large amount of money leftover this year to move forward with the purchase and will allow them not to have to purchase four next year. The request is to purchase an administrative-style Dodge Durango for \$61,000. The approval is contingent on the Council's approval of an additional appropriation to cover the remaining amount, which would be less than \$9,000. There was a consensus by the Council that they would approve the additional appropriation, which will be presented for first reading in July.

Clerk Treasurer Amy Borns requested approval to have Julie Herbert or Julie Nobbe to serve as backup submitters for Gateway should Borns be unable to submit any documents or reports required for the City. Motion to approve the backups for Gateway submissions made by Rodney King, seconded by Kevin Fleetwood. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Borns presented Resolution 2026-12 to transfer the budgeted amounts out of three funds into Park Road. Motion to approve Resolution 2026-12 made by Daryl Tressler, seconded by Vietta McKenzie. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Mayor Marsh and Clerk Treasurer Borns discussed the grant from the Federal Department of Energy for solar panel installation. Mayor explained that the grant is still in the final stages of application, and there is no match necessary from the City. Borns explained that it is required to create a new fund for any federal grant, therefore she presented Ordinance 2026-12 to create a new fund for the solar grant for first reading. Motion to approve Ordinance 2026-04 to create a new fund for the Solar Panel Grant on first reading Rodney King, seconded by Darrell Poling. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Motion to suspend rules on Ordinance 2026-12 made by Kevin Fleetwood, seconded by Darrell Poling. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Motion to approve Ordinance 2026-12 on second reading made by Kevin Fleetwood, seconded by Rodney King. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes.

Mayor Marsh requested to change July meeting from July 14 to July 8, due to the county fair. Consensus to approve the change of meeting to July 8.

Council members gave updates on their respective boards and commissions.

Mark Carman invited the public out to the bridge on Moscow Road on July 4 after the parade. He and other coordinators are hoping to have at least 250 participants waiving flags on the overpass.

Adjourn

Motion to adjourn made by Rodney King. Voice vote, all ayes no nays. Motion passes. Meeting adjourned at 7:20 PM.
