CHIEF'S MESSAGE

It has been an honor and privilege to serve you as Chief of Police this past year, 2020 came with many challenges. The best word to describe 2020 is chaotic. The Greensburg Police Department had planned on 2020 being a break out year with Community Policing and implementing several new programs for the City of Greensburg. Unfortunately COVID-19 put a hault on a lot of these programs, so that the community could concentrate on the health of its citizens.

You will see a noticeable decrease in several of our statistical categories this year. Many of the factors that accounted for the decreases were directly related to the COVID-19 Pandemic. There was less traffic, businesses were shut down and many residents chose to stay home. That caused a reduction in vehicular and foot traffic as well as general calls for service.

The Greensburg Police Department was short staffed the entire year. Officers were gone on military leave, quarantine, and general staff turnover. During the height of the pandemic, we had to adapt and change how we normally police the community. We closed our business office and stopped performing some of our non-essential services. We began to take minor infraction reports by phone versus face to face and temporarily discontinued stopping vehicles for minor traffic violations. These changes were an effort to limit staff exposures to the virus.

I cannot express how proud I am of our police officers, community service officers and civilian staff. These brave men and women worked tirelessly each day knowing that in addition to the normal risks of being police officers, they would likely be exposed to a deadly virus. There were days whenseveral officers were off each shift. Officers continued to step up and cover shifts to make sure that the City of Greensburg was still protected. These officers came into work each day knowing the hightened risk of catching this deadly virus.

As you review this report, I hope it provides you with an understanding of how we have adjusted through the COVID-19 Pandemic, and how we will continue to grow and improve our community partnerships into the future. This pandemic has caused each employee of the Greensburg Police Department to change the way they had to police.






2020 Calls For Service






STATS OVER THE PAST YEAR





2020 Criminal Arrest




2020 Traffic Accidents




2020 OWI Arrest




2020 Vehicle Stops


In 2020, the Greensburg Police Department saw a large decrease in traffic stops. COVID-19 and officer shortage contributed to the decrease in stops.


2020 Narcotics Arrest

Community Events


