Greg Kelso

**EQUIPMENT LABORER
WATER TREATMENT PLANT**

Meet Greg Kelso, Equipment Operator for the City of Greensburg! Greg has been a staple at the Greensburg Water Treatment Plant since 1999. He started his career as a swing shift operator on the outside crew and now serves as an Equipment Operator. For Greg, no two days are exactly alike—he might be digging up a water main to fix an emergency leak one day, and replacing old service lines to upgrade the City's infrastructure the next. Chances are you might have seen him operating the backhoe! When asked what the best part of his job is, Greg didn't hesitate: it's the people. He says the team at the plant feels like an extension of his family. A Greensburg native and Class of 1997 GCHS graduate, Greg loves the heart of this town. His favorite part of living in Greensburg is seeing how neighbors rally together. "Everyone has their differences," Greg says, "but when push comes to shove, the community rallies and supports each other." When he isn't keeping our water flowing, Greg is an avid outdoorsman who loves hunting, fishing, and dirt track racing in the summer. He is also a massive San Francisco 49ers and IU Hoosiers fan! Family is everything to Greg. He has been married to his wife, Sara, for 22 years. They have three children: Brayton, who also works part-time for the City's GIS Department; Brycen, an apprentice lineman; and Blair, a 5th grader. Rounding out the family is Ace, their miniature dachshund. Greg's biggest piece of advice? "Give it your all, don't cut corners, don't rely on someone else to do your job. Always be a part of the team and give it 100%."
