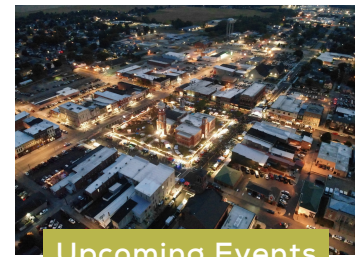

Duane Noah

**MAINTENANCE SUPERVISOR  
WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT**



Duane Noah has been a cornerstone of the Wastewater Treatment Plant since 1994, approaching a remarkable 32 years of service with the City of Greensburg this September. Before bringing his talents to the city, Duane worked for a local farmer and built a robust career in construction, contributing to the development of numerous local houses, hog barns, and old schools.

As Maintenance Supervisor, Duane is responsible for checking all machinery and equipment, including the boilers, rinsing clarifiers, and conducting visual inspections to ensure optimal operations. After nearly 32 years at the facility, Duane has developed an extraordinary intuition for the machinery—he can actually diagnose a malfunctioning belt inside a building while standing out in the parking lot. A true people person, Duane considers working with his plant teammates the absolute best part of his job. His tenure spans four superintendents, seven mayors, and six plant expansions.

Duane is also a recipient of the Spirit Award from the Southern Indiana Operators Association, recognized for his exceptional work ethic, positive attitude, and dedication to Greensburg. The award holds a deep personal significance, as it was named in honor of Joe Taylor—a former city employee, close colleague, and mentor to Duane—who passed away in 2018.

Duane relocated to Decatur County from Fayette County at age six, growing up in the Sandusky area where his father farmed.

A 1979 graduate of North Decatur High School, he entered the workforce immediately after graduation. Duane has been married to his wife, Barbie, for 42 years, and together they share three children and nine grandchildren. He is incredibly proud of his family and spends much of his time off-duty attending his grandchildren's sporting events, local theater performances, and extracurricular activities. Duane also enjoys fishing, landscaping, and creating a massive annual Christmas light display in his front yard for neighbors to enjoy.

When asked to share his perspective on life and career, Duane emphasizes the importance of balance. "Take time to smell the roses and spend time with your loved ones," he advises. "Take advantage of the small things, because life is too short!"
