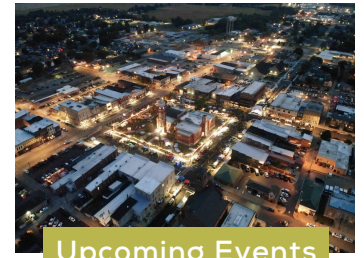

Trent Campbell

Trent Campbell has been a valued member of the Greensburg Fire Department since 2023. A lifelong Greensburg resident, Trent graduated from Greensburg Community High School in 2019. His commitment to public safety began early; while still in high school, he served as a volunteer firefighter and EMT with the Letts Fire Department.

To earn his EMT license, Trent completed a rigorous six-month course that included clinical shifts in the Emergency Room at Margret Mary Health in Batesville and field experience on ambulances. He followed this with another six-month Fire 1 and 2 certification program in Edinburgh.

At GFD, Trent finds the team spirit of his fellow firefighters and the unpredictable nature of the work most rewarding—though he admits that driving the fire truck with lights and sirens is a definite highlight. His technical expertise also extends to the skies as one of the department’s staff drone pilots. Recently, Trent was selected as one of the newest Tactical Medics for the Greensburg Police Department’s Tactical Response Team.

Beyond the fire station, Trent and his wife, Madison, stay active in the community by attending local events, traveling, and spending time with family. Trent continues to serve his community as a volunteer with the Letts Fire Department and mowing for his grandpa. He is naturally mechanically inclined and enjoys taking things apart to figure out exactly how they work.

When reflecting on professional growth, Trent’s advice is centered on persistence and focus. "Keep up the good work and don't let the outside noise get to you," he says. "Focus on yourself and the work you are doing."
