Approval of Minutes

- Scott Mangels made a motion to approve March 3, 2026, Minutes; Tony Higginbotham seconded the motion, voice vote all ayes and motion carried.

New Business

- Darren Burkhardt
 - o Broadway & 10th Street Project Update
 - Darren reported that he is working on getting the INDOT permits. There have been some issues with the connection points being in the right-of-way. State Road 3 has limited access right-of-way; there are service lines in that right-of-way, this is what is causing the delay. He does not want to advertise until this issue is resolved as it could change the length on some things. He is setting up a meeting with INDOT to get this resolved. He does have the permits from IDEM.
- Zach Wirrig
 - o Project Update
 - Updates on the Main Street Project: they had their final field check last week; INDOT, their designer, and all the utilities meet to go through the project to make sure there are no outstanding conflicts. Everything is on a good path as far as plans getting finished up. The railroad has about another week or two until they reach their max allotted for review time. INDOT did make some changes to the contract; they changed the pavement section from asphalt to concrete, with that change, they have pushed back the letting of the project to January 2027. The plan is to have the West project completed in 2027, and the East project to be completed in 2028.
- Aaron Schwendenmann
 - o HydroCorp Backflow Preventer Program Service Agreement
 - The backflow program is something IDEM requires; inspections and reports are sent to Aaron annually from everyone who has a backflow preventer. This company has people on site to do inspections and address any issues that any of the industrial customers may have, then reports them to Aaron to work through to get corrected. Inspections are done once a year. The agreement is for five years and is to be paid annually. Tony motioned to approve the five-year contract for \$33,383.71, Ryan seconded the motion, voice voted all ayes and motion carried.
 - o 120 Water Service Agreement
 - 120 Water is partnered with IDEM for the lead and copper inventory; they run the platform on which the public can access. Starting November 1, 2027, is when all the lead and copper become stricter with more sampling, etc. 120 Water makes sure we are complying and doing everything we are supposed to do. We will have our own representative to help with the process. Ryan motioned to approve the contract for \$32,808.00, Scott seconded the motion, voice voted all ayes and motion carried.

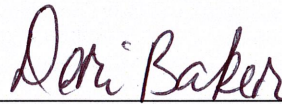
