Currently, all beaches are open in Hancock, Harrison and Jackson counties. However, social distancing is strictly enforced, and beachgoers must limit groups to 20 people or less.

Are the casinos open in Coastal Mississippi?

The casino properties in Coastal Mississippi are still closed at this time.

Should I cancel my trip/stay/visit?

We urge all visitors to take protective measures to keep Coastal Mississippi as safe and healthy as possible. Before cancelling your upcoming trip, we hope you will explore rescheduling as an alternative solution. We hope to see you in Coastal Mississippi, when it best suits you.

Many businesses around me are closed. What can I do?

Whether heading out for a day trip or for a long weekend, we urge all visitors to take protective measures against COVID-19 and make informed travel decisions to keep our state as healthy as possible.

Restaurants are still limited to drive-through, carry out and delivery. Starting Thursday, May 7, Gov. Reeves announced that he will allow restaurants to offer limited in-house dining and larger outdoor gatherings of 20 or less. Restaurants will be allowed to open indoor and outdoor dining as long as they adhere to extensive requirements outlined by the updated order.
