



Dr. Kathleen Parker, Ph.D., APRN-CNP Nationally Dr. Parker serves as past Chair of the VHA Office of Nursing Services (ONS) Evidenced Based Practice (EBP)Field Advisory Council and as a part of the national EBP consultation team, providing leadership and guidance in EBP implementation across the VA health care system. Dr. Parker is a Leadership VA (LVA) Fellow. LVA is one of the Department's premier leadership development training programs that prepares and equips high-potential, high-performing leaders with the necessary skills to meet the needs of a diverse population of Veterans, family members, survivors, employees and stakeholders. Dr. Parker is Vice President of The Association of Black Nursing Faculty (ABNF). Dr. Parker is the Health Promotion Disease Prevention Program Manager (HPDP PM) at the Oklahoma City VAHCS. Dr. Parker has provided Veteran services as well as program development and activation in the VAHCS since she joined the OKC VA in 1997. Currently Dr. Parker obtained graduate education funding from the VHA Office of Academic Affairs (OAA) to fund GE-APRN clinical rotations and has secured for OKCVAHCS a post- graduate Nurse Practitioner Residency Programs.

As Principal Investigator, she has received grant funds from Women's Health Services and the Office of Public Health (FY13) for a public health improvement project "Women Veteran's Health and Hepatitis-Fight the Silent Enemy with Awareness, Advocacy, and Action". Dr. Parker was co-investigator of VA study: "The Effect of Distance Mentoring on EBP" IRB # 15921 (2013). Dr. Parker's career spans from maternal-child to Veterans care, from community care clinics to federal corrections, and across public and private practices. Dr. Parker is a published investigator, [ABNF J.](#) 2012 Summer; 23(3):51-8, and serves on the local IRB. Dr. Parker was the first graduate of the University of Oklahoma's inaugural PhD in Nursing program (2011). Dr. Parker's program of research focuses on the correlates of physical activity among African-American women.
