

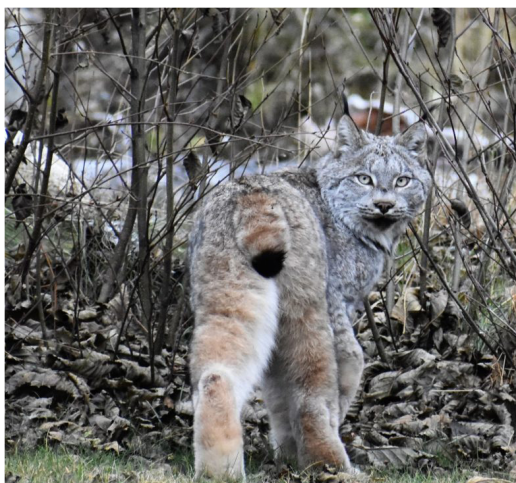

BY SEA

Haines is a regular stop for the Alaska Marine Highway ferry system, coming from as far south as Bellingham, WA., which accommodates cars and RV's making it convenient and a scenic way to travel. We also connect with smaller private passenger ferries between Juneau, Haines, and Skagway or book a cruise to Haines! Interested in bringing your boat, contact our harbor for stall space and amenities available. An intimate port surrounded by choices on how to continue your travel via the waterway.

BY AIR

Juneau, Alaska, has daily jet service making your connections convenient as you continue to Haines through our smaller commuter aircraft, which are located at the same airport. Enjoy the 30 minute scheduled flights that offer a close and personal scenic view of Lynn Canal and surrounding glacial landscape. Car rentals are available when you get to Haines.

Valley of the Eagles - National Scenic Byway

Haines Highway (Tammy Kokjohn)



Unlike many other Southeast Alaska communities, Haines is connected to Canada (Passports required) and Interior Alaska by the Alaska Highway through British Columbia and the Yukon. Designated a Scenic Byway in 2009, the 40-mile stretch from Haines to the Canadian border takes you through the Eagle Preserve, with visitors stating that it's one of the most scenic drives.

If you're looking for a great getaway to make a day outing or longer and would like to have someone else do the driving have Haines be your **BASE CAMP** for adventuring out.

- Daily ferry service available for pedestrian traffic between Haines and Skagway in summer. Sail up to Skagway for a day or overnight and then return to Haines.
- A day trip or make it an overnight trip to Juneau departing out of Haines is an excellent option on the Fjord Express. Sail down in the morning and watch for whales and explore the capital of Alaska.
- Glacier Bay National Park and Preserve is on the other side of the Chilkat Range, our backdrop to our community. Flightseeing day tours available over Glacier Bay or overnight in Gustavus and explore Glacier Bay a little longer.
- Hinterland Express offers transportation to Whitehorse (capital of Yukon Territory) via Haines Junction, wildlife viewing along the way, including some culture tours.

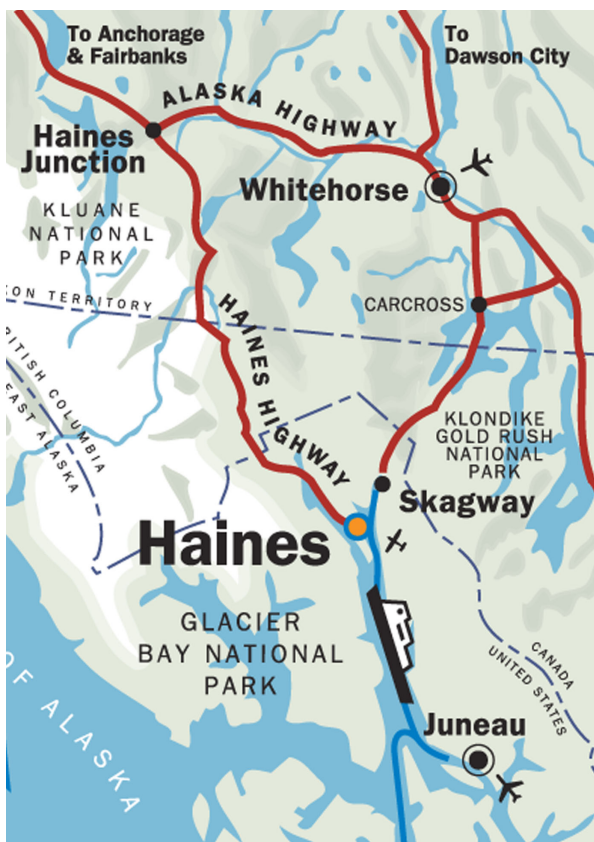

1

HAINES

Spend one night—or more—taking in the sites and attractions of Haines before making your way out the Haines Highway, a National Scenic Byway, through the Bald Eagle Preserve, along massive glacial peaks and rivers, through BC, and into the Yukon.

2

HAINES JUNCTION

Haines Junction: where the Alaska and Haines Highways meet, and the jumping-off point to Kluane National Park and Reserve. Enjoy camping and hiking, and do not miss the Da K'ya Cultural Centre and Kluane National Park and Reserve Visitor Centre.

3

WHITEHORSE

On to Whitehorse, capital of the Yukon, on the banks of the Yukon River. Whitehorse offers numerous options for museum and outdoor enthusiasts. A larger city with hotels and good restaurants, Whitehorse is a great city to stay a day or two.

4

SKAGWAY

Driving southbound on the dramatic Klondike Highway toward Skagway takes you along the historical gold rush route. Stop mid-way in Carcross for incredible mountain biking and Native culture. Spend a day or more in Skagway to enjoy rich Klondike Gold Rush history, the historical White Pass railroad, shopping, and period-inspired entertainment.

RETURN BY FERRY

From Skagway, return to Haines or Juneau by ferry.

The Alaska Marine Highway System offers service between Juneau, Haines, and Skagway year-round as well as passenger service with two private ferries.

HAINES IS BORN

8,000 BCE - First arrival of the Tlingit people.

1741 - First contact with Russian explorers.

1774 - First contact with Spanish explorers.

1794 - English Explorer Captain George Vancouver names Lynn Canal after home town of King's Lynn.

1867 - After purchase of Alaska, surveyor George Davidson makes first scouting trip to Chilkat Peninsula and names the large glacier southwest of the peninsula after himself. (Davidson Glacier)

1869 - Davidson returns with Secretary of State William H. Seward to view an eclipse of the sun at a party with Chief Kohklux of Klukwan.

1877 - Presbyterian minister Sheldon Jackson begins his missionary work in Alaska.

1879 - Naturalist John Muir and missionary S. Hall Young meet with the chiefs and people of local Tlingit villages at Yendustucky, five miles up the Chilkat River from present-day Haines. A site for the Presbyterian mission is decided.

1881 - Eugene and Caroline Willard open Chilkat Mission.

1882 - Chilkat Mission post office and Chilkat Cannery established.

1883 - First Presbyterian Church of Haines is formed. Chilkat Mission is renamed to honor Mrs. F.E. Haines, secretary of the Women's Executive Committee for Home Mission of the Presbyterian Church. Two hundred miners pay the Chilkats a fee to cross the Chilkoot Pass.

1885 - Sol Ripinsky arrives to teach at Haines Mission, eventually making a homestead claim of the area. The Navy hires Ripinsky to chart the upper Lynn Canal.

1894 - Former Chilkat Cannery employee Jack Dalton builds trading posts along the Chilkat Trade Route at Dalton Cache, Dalton Post and Champagne. Amateur photographer Captain John Francis Pratt photographs the Chilkat people on the eve of the Klondike Gold Rush.

1895 - Jack Dalton forms Dalton and Company and begins improving the Chilkat Trail, trading with the Athabascans, and packing supplies into the mining regions.

1896 - Gold is discovered on a tributary of the Yukon River bringing 100,000 people to Alaska and the Yukon.

1898 - Gold is discovered in Porcupine Creek, Chilkat Valley, where gold mining still operates today.

1903 - Fort William H. Seward is built and fully garrisoned by 1905 in response to a border dispute with Canada.

1910 - Haines incorporates as a city.

1917 - Haines Packing Company begins operation and is still operating today.

1942 - Alaska Canadian (ALCAN) Highway completed.

1943 - Haines Cut-Off Highway built to connect with the ALCAN.

1946 - Fort Seward is declared surplus and sold to Army veterans.

1948 - Army veteran Steve Homer starts the first Haines-Skagway-Juneau ferry transport with the vessel "Chilkoot."

1951 - Territory of Alaska purchases "Chilkoot" from Homer. This is the beginning of the Alaska Marine Ferry System.

1970 - Port Chilkoot (Fort Seward) becomes an integral part of the city of Haines.

1972 - Port Chilkoot is designated a National Historic Site and reverts to its original name: Fort William H. Seward.

1975 - Presbyterian Church donates land to build new Sheldon Museum and Cultural Center.

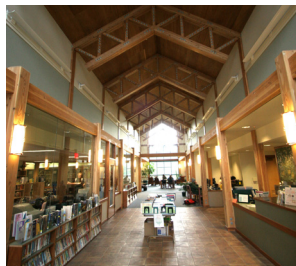
1983 - Governor J. Hammond establishes the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve, 48,000 acres adjacent to the Haines State Forest Resource Management Area.

1986 - American Bald Eagle Foundation groundbreaking ceremony.

1990 - Walt Disney movie "White Fang" is filmed in the Chilkat Valley.

1995 - First annual Bald Eagle Festival held in November.

2005 - Haines Borough Public Library wins Library Journal and the Gates Foundation "Best Small Library in America" Award.

2010 - Discovery Channel begins filming the reality show "Gold Rush Alaska" at Porcupine Creek.

2014 - Haines Arts Confluence wins Arts Place America Grant to bring art to our downtown planning and establishing a sculpture garden.

2016 - Opening of the Jilkaat Kwaan Heritage Center in Klukwan, showcasing the coveted Whale House collection.

Wildlife is just that “WILD,” so viewing is known to be anywhere in the Chilkat Valley, even downtown. Driving on the Lutak Road will give you access to the Chilkoot State Park, it is one of the most visited parks in Alaska from the easy access to bear viewing and fishing. Located on Mud Bay Road is the Chilkat State Park, which is highlighted for hiking, fishing, and glacier viewing. Driving out the Haines Highway, you enter the Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve, 48,000 acres of council grounds for Eagle (largest congregation is during the fall and early winter), and spotting wildlife. Numerous guided tours are offered and are a good way to optimize your wildlife viewing, they not only know where to go but are also able to reach more remote areas not typically accessed by the mainstream of people. Make sure to pack your binoculars for spotting critters near and far. In town, our American Bald Eagle Foundation presents live bird presentations along with an interpretive wildlife display for all ages to enjoy while Kroschel’s Wildlife Center, out the Haines Highway, is a great educational source right at our hands with over a dozen live animals all indigenous to this area but make sure you book a tour before heading out.

TO MINIMIZE EFFECTS ON WILDLIFE AND THEIR HABITAT, HERE ARE SOME WILDLIFE AND BEAR VIEWING TIPS



- **Keep Your Distance** – Never approach wildlife for any reason. Give bears plenty of space (100 feet) and remain calm. Stay together in a group. Your approach may cost an animal valuable energy, or cause undue stress.



- **Time It Right** – Bears are active on and off all day and night. Some bears come out at night to feed without the threat of humans. Respect the animals and use neither spotlight nor flash to take a photo.



- **Keep Your Impact Low** – Do not try to attract an animal's attention as it could influence their natural response. Note that it is illegal to harass wildlife—let bears be bears.



- **Keep Wildlife Wild** – Never feed wild animals. Bears are intelligent and will associate humans with food, putting you and the bear in danger of being injured or killed. Feeding bears, and leaving trash or your picnic area unattended, is illegal.



- **Be Considerate of Others** – Everyone enjoys wilderness and wildlife in different ways. Be sure to respect private property, and give hunters, anglers, and others plenty of space.

1 Lutak Road follows the protected waters of Lutak Inlet with pullouts along the way offering views of Haines and wildlife viewing overlooks. Lutak Inlet is narrow and sheltered making it easier to spot river otters, sea lions, porpoises and seals. A few humpback and killer whales swim into the inlets, especially in early May and June during the eulachon run, which is a rich food source that only arrives once during the season and the length of the run is unpredictable. Look and listen for an abundant of waterfowl and bald eagles along the way.

2 The Chilkoot River flows into Lutak Inlet, and is one of the more easily reached bear viewing spots in Southeast Alaska. Salmon spawn in the Chilkoot each year, luring brown bears between mid-June and October for a feast, while river otters and seals chase the salmon upstream at high tide for their share. Common waterfowl and bald eagles feed at the estuary where the Chilkoot River flows into Lutak Inlet. In the spring and fall it's a bird watcher's paradise, large numbers of shorebirds flock to the mudflats to refuel before continuing their annual migrations. Local naturalist-guided tours to the Chilkoot River are available during the summer, some of which combine the river and Lutak road into one wildlife viewing excursion.

3 Battery Point overlooks the narrowest and shallowest part of Chilkoot Inlet. Schools of fish often congregate in these relatively still waters, attracting a variety of marine mammals. Stand on the beach and look for the indicator of blows or flukes of humpback whales while scanning the waters for the reflection of the heads of seals or sea lions. Closer to shore, look for loons, surf scoters, and other waterfowl as they search for a meal. The Battery Point trailhead is located about a mile and a half south of town at the end of Beach Road. A flat, primitive trail winds through the rain forest for a little over a mile before reaching Battery Point. It is possible, though not common, to encounter bears and moose on the trail, so stay alert while hiking. In early May this area has the most colorful array of wild flowers.

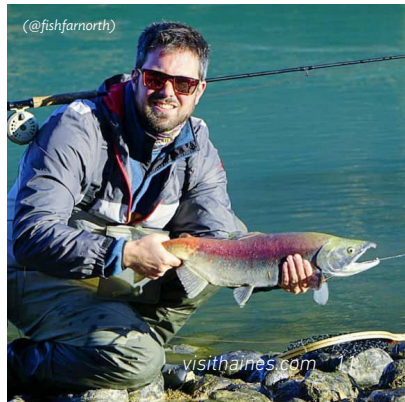

WILD PLACES...



4 Chilkat State Park borders on the waters of Chilkat Inlet, where the Chilkat River meets Lynn Canal. This is a great area to spot wildlife, both on land and in the water, and gets you close to Davidson and Rainbow Glaciers. Brown bears move through the forests and along the beaches. Moose, especially cow and calf pairs, have been known to wander near the developed areas, in part to seek protection from the bears. A cabin with a viewing platform and spotting scope overlook Chilkat Inlet, an excellent perch from which to scan Chilkat Inlet for seals, sea lions, porpoises, and humpback and killer whales. Surf scoters and pigeon guillemots may also be seen throughout the summer. Peer into the spotting scope for better marine viewing, and to search the ridges across the inlet for mountain goats. Eulachon, a small oily fish, also runs into the Chilkat Inlet heading to the Chilkat River in mid-to-late May. Looking for a good hike? The park's Ayiklutu Trail follows the shoreline for seven miles, with many viewing spots along the way, or just do the first mile to Moose Meadows. In early May, this area displays a colorful meadow of wildflowers and aroma of the Alaska rose. Chilkat State Park is nestled on the west side of the Chilkat Peninsula south on Mud Bay Road, six miles out of town then follow the signs for the park. Right before the park entrance beware, the road is a 14% grade dirt road and requires careful driving.



5 The Haines Highway passes through the Chilkat River and the Takshanuk Mountains, designated a National Scenic Byway in 2009. This area has been enhanced, providing ample pullouts to stop and scan for wildlife and stunning views of the river and mountains. Species found along, or sometimes on, the highway include moose, coyotes, wolves, porcupines, and brown and black bears. A pair of trumpeter swans are often seen in the ponds near 5 mile in the spring. Pink salmon spawn in 10 Mile Creek in late July and August. Moose munch on underwater plants at roadside marshes, like the ones at mile 12 and 14. The best time to see moose is in the early morning hours. The slide area at mile 19 is a good place to look for mountain goats. Bald eagles circle in the sky or perch in trees, especially where the highway parallels the Bald Eagle Preserve (see site #7) between miles 9 and 30. The Haines Highway extends 42 miles to the U.S. – Canada border, making day trips into the Canadian alpine inviting.

6 The Chilkat River serves as a travel corridor for wildlife as you maneuver through the rugged mountains that separate the interior of North America from the coastal ecosystems of Southeast Alaska. Moose wander the banks of the Chilkat throughout the summer. Watch for cow and calf pairs at the river's edge along with Brown bears and wolves. Mountain goats patrol the ridgelines and are best spotted with binoculars or a spotting scope. Watch for the numerous birds, including arctic terns and trumpeter swans, along the Chilkat, but the birds that make the river famous, however, are bald eagles.

WILD PLACES...



7 The Bald Eagle Preserve was established along the Chilkat River as an Alaska State Park in 1982 to protect critical habitat for eagles. There are over 80 bald eagle nests and a year-round eagle population in the preserve, numbers varying. Between late October and February, the largest congregation of bald eagles in the world gather to feed on a late-season salmon run. Guided boat and raft tours travel the Chilkat throughout the summer, and land-based tours visit the preserve during the winter. Check with the Haines Visitor Center for more information. Pullouts on the Haines Highway have restrooms, a viewing platform, interpretive signs, and spotting scopes with good views of the winter eagle congregations. Each November in Haines, the Alaska Bald Eagle Festival is held, a four-day event of education and celebration of the largest concentration of bald eagles in the world. The festival features guided naturalist trips to the Bald Eagle Preserve, presentations, educational wildlife exhibits, and an opportunity to watch rehabilitated eagles be released to the wild. 8 Mt. Ripinsky stands 3,600 feet above downtown Haines hiding snow in its crevices until late summer. The forest gives way to alpine, the primary habitat for mountain goats, at around 3,000 feet, this steep, rugged terrain offers protection against other predators. In the late spring and early summer, bears head for higher elevations to feed on emerging plants. Blue grouse, gray-crowned rosy-finches, and mountain chickadees are some of the birds found on Mt. Ripinsky. The trailhead for the challenging and difficult 3.5-mile Mt Ripinsky Trail starts at the end of Young Road on the northeast edge of town. This trail is for fit and experienced hikers only. Read the "Haines is for Hikers" guide (available at the Visitor Center) for more information and hiking safety tips before setting out, and let someone know when you plan to return.

EXPLORE THE ARTS, CULTURE...

LONG WINTER NIGHTS AND RAINY DAYS ARE TIMES WELL SPENT FOR OUR ARTISTS TO CRAFT YOUR ALASKAN GIFT.

- Enjoy the art of more than 40 local artists in the window displays on Main Street and find the colorful murals that decorate the walls of local businesses.
- Browse the shops and discover handcrafted silver and beaded jewelry, knives, knitted items, hats, cards, prints, soaps, and salves and more.
- Peruse the galleries of the area; downtown, Mud Bay, Fort Seward and the Fairgrounds, we have over 10 galleries.
- Stop at the bank on Main Street to see the local artist's work that is being displayed at that time, changes often.
- Totem Poles of the Chilkat Valley, pick up your guide, and enjoy the totem walk that will take you to different districts of the valley.
- Locally owned salmon shops, Dejon Delights, and Haines Packing have fresh seafood for you to enjoy here or ship home.
- Join a First Friday Art Walk every month with exhibits, live music, and treats in galleries and shops, usually includes an artist at the Haines Brewing Company.
- In 2005, a confluence of local artists, entrepreneurs, and community members started the non-profit organization Alaska Arts Confluence. Its mission is to promote the arts in Haines.
- Farmer's Market is held seasonally at the Fairgrounds showcasing local ware..

MUSEUMS

- American Bald Eagle Foundation & Raptor Center is the conservation of the Bald Eagle and its habitat through education and stewardship. Well-educated staff members are on hand to share their passion and their live raptors.
- Haines Sheldon Museum & Cultural Center is committed to collecting, preserving, and interpreting the history, art, and unique blending of diverse cultures within the Chilkat Valley region.
- Hammer Museum is dedicated to preserving the history of the hammer with over 2,000 on exhibit, a museum to definitely worth bragging to your friends about.
- Jilkaat Kwaan Heritage Center teaches the traditional Chilkat Village's cultural, history and subsistence way of life. Book a tour and receive first-hand knowledge from the village Tlingits and hear their stories.

FORT SEWARD HISTORIC DISTRICT:

- Pick up the self-guided walking tour pamphlet of William H. Fort Seward, named in honor of the US Secretary of State William H. Seward. Stop along the way at the new interpretive signs while taking in the history as you go through. Disputes along the United States-Canadian border prompted the US government to establish this military presence in 1903.
- Where Art is an Adventure, and Adventure is an Art. Let that adventure start here by taking the Sculpture Garden's walking guide to escort your curiosity through the artist's garden where there is artwork, sculptures made of recycled materials and beach glass, and other surprises along the way.
- Visit Alaska Indian Arts to see northwest coast artisans in action; also, the location where past and present totem poles were/are carved.
- Browse the shops and galleries, meeting some of the local artists and hear their stories. Can't find what you are looking for, ask they may know.
- Enjoy a meal at one of the dining options known for using local foods and serving local brews.
- March on into the award-winning Port Chilkoot Distillery, a tasting room with spirits flavored with locally made syrups.
- Visit the tribal house in the middle of the Parade Grounds showcasing totem poles and panels.
- While at Officer's Row, top of the fort, look for UAS Professor and Master Carver Wayne Price's dugout canoes. A Native American from Alaska, Wayne produces totem poles, masks, rattles, spoons, bentwood boxes, canoes (both model and finished 18' functional canoes), and dance regalia using traditional Tlingit Indian styles. Wayne began his career carving at Alaska Indian Arts in 1971.

Haines has adventures for every season, with activities and tours to fulfill the biggest adrenaline junky to those wanting to just sit, relax, and breathe it all in.

FALL & WINTER

- Glacial waters run clear in the fall with fisherman gathering to the shores of the Chilkat and Chilkoot rivers to cast for Coho and Chum Salmon, why not enter the Silver Salmon Derby.
- The largest congregation of Eagles starts flocking on to the Chilkat River for their continuous feeding time on the salmon.
- Fall colors of red, orange, and yellow cover the valley, and the bears become more active for viewing and easier to see.
- Activities abound from skiing, snowshoeing, and snow machining right out the back door. Or your adventure can take you further to the roadless snow-laden terrain and fresh powder areas only reachable by helicopter, plane, or snowcat with our local tour operators playing in those prime locations.
- From February to May each year, skiers, snowboarders, and photographers from around the globe come to test their expertise in the big mountains.
- Trout fishing on the frozen lakes produces a great meal. Share an already drilled hole with a local that may share the secret of catching one.
- Fairweather Ski Works produces custom boards and skis from the local forest while our other outfitters will assist you with rentals and the right gear if needed.
- Dining and shopping options are available along with evening entertainment being added during the season.
- Trout fishing on the frozen lakes produces a great meal. Share an already drilled hole with a local that may share their secret of catching a keeper.

SPRING & SUMMER

- Late April or mid-May, we wait for the eulachon run (smelt like fish), which brings out traditional subsistence fishermen while bringing in marine wildlife, eagles, and seabirds.

- Haines is for hikers, cyclists, beachcombers, wildlife enthusiasts, and even water lovers.
- Plan your visit during one of our annual events, sure to make you a repeat visitor.
- During this season, there are increased tours available around the valley from land, air, and boat tours covering the inlet, rivers and surrounding area.
- All dining and shopping areas are open with a wide selection of local flavors to choose from.
- Visit our historic working Cannery out on Mud Bay Road, slime line in action.

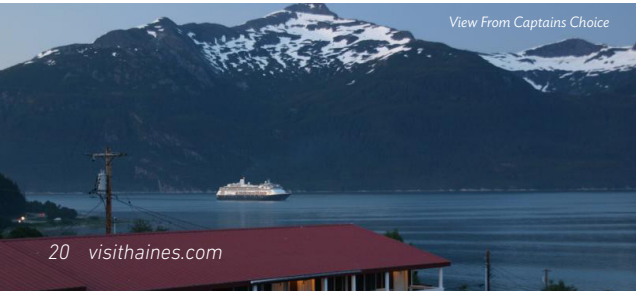

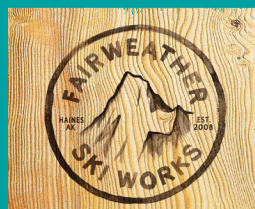

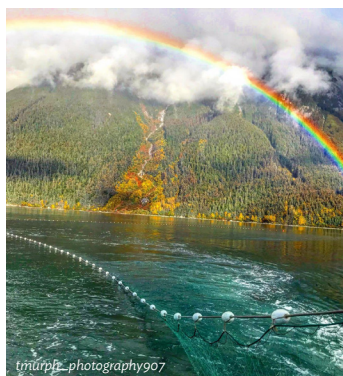
