ITEM COLLECTION DURING A CONFERENCE

TEACHERS TREASURES is an organization that collects items Central Indiana's teachers need most and frequently pay from their own pockets. Attendees can bring new school supplies to the conference as a donation.

GOOD SAMARITAN NETWORK is a collaboration of many non-profits in Hamilton County that feeds, clothes, and cares for the less fortunate furry friends and residents in the area. Attendees can donate gas gift cards, canned food, or clothing.

GIVE YOUR TIME

ACTIVITIES FOR SMALL GROUPS (1 - 50 PEOPLE)

AGAPE - This therapeutic riding center needs labor assistance with landscaping, painting and cleaning projects around its facilities. Please note that all projects take place outside and materials necessary to completing the project need to be purchased by the group.

CARMEL CLAY PARKS DEPARTMENT - Volunteers can step outside to help make the local parks a little more beautiful. The parks department needs assistance in spreading mulch and gravel in the playground areas and trails, removing invasive species of plants from the wooded areas and prairies, and cleaning up litter.

GOOD SAMARITAN NETWORK - Groups can sort food, clothing, pet food, hygiene and household products.

Groups can also make hygiene kits, and/or assist with distribution to families.

HAND, INCORPORATED - This organization works to improve the community by assisting with housing needs for low to moderate income individuals, families, and senior citizens in Hamilton County. It needs volunteers for neighborhood cleanups, common area plantings, beautification and more. Projects typically take place outdoors during the spring, summer, and fall months.

FISHERS PARKS AND RECREATION invites volunteers to support the vibrancy of community and parks. Fishers Parks is in need of volunteers for park and neighborhood cleanups, invasive plant removal, recreation programs, events and more.

HAMILTON COUNTY PARKS - With approximately 1,600 acres of park property, Hamilton County Parks has a number of projects (gardening, invasive removal, landscaping, park cleanup, park improvement, etc.) for individuals, small and large groups. Projects can be customized to align with the group's mission, interests and skills.

NOBLESVILLE PARKS AND RECREATION - With

over 870 acres of parkland, Noblesville Parks welcomes volunteer groups to help keep city parks clean and maintained for the community to enjoy. Volunteer projects may include mulching, flowerbed cleanup or other jobs in and around city parks. Depending on the time of year, volunteers may also be needed at large community events.
