•Parking is \$15 at all Farm Show Complex-operated lots.


• Write down or photograph the parking lot name and location of your vehicle. Be prepared for heavy traffic and pedestrian congestion.

- Follow PennDot traffic signs to open parking lots. Signs on all major roads leading to the complex are updated throughout the day.

- There is a free, round-trip shuttle service between the complex and downtown Harrisburg on weekdays between 11 a.m. and 2 p.m.
- Handicapped parking is available at all parking lots operated by the Farm Show Complex.



Touring the Food Court

Farm Show Food Court Serves Up Rich History, Delicious Eats

There's something about the Pennsylvania Farm Show that makes people hungry. Always has been, always will be.

No food was available for purchase on Jan. 23, 1917 when the first Farm Show opened. Yet visitors to the first show, held in a farm implement building at 10th and Market streets in Harrisburg, got hungry just looking at exhibits of apples, celery, carrots, corn, turnips, potatoes, milk and butter.

Over the next few years, the Farm Show outgrew its original home and spread to about a dozen locations. By the 1923 Farm Show, a hungry visitor could buy a baked potato for a nickel. The tradition of eating at the Farm Show was born.

Farm Show food for decades consisted of baked potatoes, milkshakes, apple, honey, chicken and various



honey products, all sold at the end of the Main Exhibition Hall. Religious and civic groups also sold everything from subs to hot dogs. The Farm Show Complex lunch bars and cafeteria also sold food.

In 1991, the various agricultural commodity food booth were moved into a section of the East Hall dubbed the Farm Show Food Court. The name has stuck. Years later, the Food Court moved into what is now called the Giant Exposition Hall.

Now, the Food Court consumes about 40% of the 172,000 square foot hall with various commod-

ity booths and has a smaller presence in the Main Exposition Hall.

After walking around the 24acre Farm Show Complex, few visitors can resist the thick chocolate milkshakes, deep fried vegetables, fluffy maple cotton candy and rich sticky buns available in the Food Court. If they look behind the food, they'll also find a rich history.



Pennsylvania State Beekeepers Association sells honey, honey ice cream, honey waffles and beehive products. It also features the Fisher family.


The late Merle P. Fisher, a Mifflin County beekeeper, participated in the Farm Show since 1932 and managed the honey booth there for decades. These days, J. Aaron Fisher – Merle's grandson, a third-generation beekeeper and a sixth-generation farmer – runs the stand.

Wearing a dressy shirt, a bow tie and a big smile, Merle Fisher brought a friendly feel to the honey booth. He also started the Pennsylvania honey queen program in the 1950s, financing it with profits from the sale of honey ice cream at the Farm Show.

Fisher loved and lived for the Farm Show. Fellow beekeeper Stewart Mathias of Hummelstown, another longtime worker at the State Beekeepers' Association Farm Show booth, recalled how he and Fisher slept overnight at the Farm Show dur-

ing a big snowstorm in 1960.

The next morning, he said, "We made waffles and fed everyone." Fisher did same thing after a blizzard dumped 22.2 inches of snow on Harrisburg during the 1996 Farm Show. He served waffles, honey ice cream and coffee to hungry visitors.



Touring the Jood Court

Pennsylvania Cooperative Potato Grow-

ers Inc., which sells baked potatoes, baked sweet potatoes, fresh cut French fries and potato doughnuts, has the longest food presence at the Farm Show. The cooperative turns 100 in 2022.

The group's baked potatoes debuted in 1923 for a nickel each. Rahn Troutman of Dornsife, potato booth manager for decades, said that "a potato farmer baked some potatoes, put them in a cooler to keep them hot, set up across the street one of the buildings where the Farm Show was being held and sold them. They were popular."

Nathan Tallman, cooperative CEO, said that Mrs. Frank Diehl of Hegins bought the 1 millionth Farm Show baked potato in 1952.

"That year then Sen. Richard Nixon of California spoke to more than 700 people at the cooperative's banquet at the Farm Show," Tallman said. "His nephew, Dr. Ernest Nixon, worked for the cooperative developing varieties of potatoes and making fertilizer recommendations."

President Richard Nixon spoke about the world Communist conspiracy, calling Communists "our major potential enemy." Ernest Nixon talked about potatoes, noting that the one million potatoes required seven tons of butter and a million dashes of salt.

Troutman, whose parents met on a high school trip to the Farm Show, started working at the potato stand with them when he was 10. Back then, baked potatoes sold for 60 cents. The

booth also sold potato doughnuts and French fries.

"When we were in the main hall, we were near milkshakes and apples," he said. "We stored our potatoes in a storeroom 50 or 75 feet away and carried each bag of potatoes in. It was really crowded."

"Baked potatoes used to be our most popular item because people like potatoes with their meals," Troutman said. "Now, it's between French fries and potato doughnut. Years ago, we sold 12 to 15 tons of baked potatoes at the Farm Show. Now, we sell eight tons of baked potatoes and 12 tons of French fries. The cooperative uses the money for potato research at Penn State, for scholarships and to promote potato consumption."

The potato booth has seen changes over the years. The cooperative bought bigger, faster

doughnut making equipment to increase production. These days, workers use three doughnut machines and gas convection ovens.

The cooperative staffing increased from 35 to 40 workers years ago to 65 to 70 workers now who staff the potato booths in the Exposition Hall and Main Hall.



"It's like one big family," Troutman said. "We've had up to four generations of one family working at one time. We also get college students on winter break, friends, etc.

He recalled the Blizzard of 1996, saying he left the Farm Show Complex amid the snow the night before.

"The potatoes weighed my van down," he said. "When I got to Millersburg, my van was able to push snow. We got a phone call that the governor declared a state of emergency and that roads would be closed."

> Although Troutman didn't get to the Farm Show the next day, the booth had lots of doughnuts left. "We called security and told them to set the doughnuts out so people could help themselves," he said.



Touring the Food Court



Pennsylvania Dairymen's Association has been selling milkshakes at the Farm Show since 1955. It also sells deep fried mozzarella cubes with marinara sauce, toasted cheese sandwiches, white and chocolate milk, ice cream sundaes and ice cream cones.

The association provides the ingredients while Valley Grange 1360 of Lewisberry provides the volunteers to staff the booth. The public drinks more than 100,000 milkshakes each Farm Show.

Over the years, the association has featured three women it calls "the Golden Girls of Farm Show

Milkshakes" – Janet Eppley, Fae Snyder and Betty Yinger, who made milkshakes for six decades.

"When I started selling milkshakes in 1955, they cost 25 cents," Snyder said during an interview at the 2020 Farm Show. "We would put bricks of vanilla ice cream in a cup, add vanilla or chocolate syrup, add milk, put the stainless steel sleeve

on the milkshake machine and turn it on. Each milkshake was made separately. We made about half vanilla and half chocolate." Years later, the workers began using a liquid mix for the milkshakes.

Snyder said she loves working at the stand and seeing the same customers each year. She said sales



usually are brisk, although "once it starts snowing, people leave. Otherwise, they buy a lot of milk-shakes. It's a long day here but I just love it."

Pennsylvania Maple Syrup Producers Council has one of the sweetest stands in the Food Court, where it sells maple syrup, maple sugar, maple candy, maple sundaes, maple yogurt, maple cotton candy, maplecoated nuts, maple cream sugar and cookbooks.

Jim and Dora Tice of Mainsburg in Tioga County have worked in the stand since 1993. They tell people that maple is not just for breakfast.

"I especially remember working here during the Blizzard of 1996," Jim Tice said. "When we left, I bought a snow shovel from another vender. I drove my Dodge Caravan to a hotel in Harrisburg and we stayed till the next day. I helped people dig their vehicles out from that snow. I still use that same snow shovel!"



He said the maple stand rotates 20 to 25 volunteers a day through the booth, which does a steady business.

Touring the Food Court

Pennsylvania Livestock Asso-

ciation sells roast beef sandwiches, ham and cheese sandwiches, beef meatball sandwiches, pork barbecue sandwiches, lamb stew, hot dogs, beef sausage, Italian sausage, steak salad, ham salad, gluten-free meatballs, horseradish and pink lemonade, walking goat tacos.

Mike Firestine has worked in the Livestock Association booth for about 45 years. He remembers when the booth was in the Main Hall.

"When I first started, we sold roast beef sandwiches, ham sandwiches, barbecue and shepherds stew with roast beef as our best seller," he said. "We later added to our menu. Now we even offer goat meet along with lamb, pork and beef."

Firestine recalled various governors enjoying the association's food and especially remembers a "young lady who said she was a vegetarian, tasted her husband's pork barbecue and wanted to buy half a pork barbecue because she liked it so much!"

Like other booth workers, Firestine said that the Blizzard of 1996 stands out in his mind.

Pennsylvania Mushroom Growers Coop-

erative sells fried mushrooms, fresh mushrooms, cream of mushroom soup, mushroom salad, blended mushroom burger and Philly Port sandwiches.

Gale Ferranto, president of Buano Foods of Landenberg and Food Court mushroom booth manager, started working at the booth when she was 7.

"We were in the East Hall and shared a space with the vegetable growers," she said. "The poultry was in the same area. Mushrooms were new at the Farm Show then, so people were curious. We



"We had eight people in our Jeep and made it back to our hotel," he said. "Some of the judges were stuck in the Farm Show Complex. We did what we could to offer them food. We had a limited menu."

Firestine praised the camaraderie among the various Food Court commodity stand workers, calling them "one big happy family. We work nonstop to serve the public. We help each other out. I've served honey ice cream and helped serve milkshakes when those booths were short of help. We all serve simple, wholesome food that people like to eat."

Sue Sansom and her husband worked at the livestock booth for many years.

"Working at the Farm Show was such a joy but such hard work," she recalled. "We had many volunteer groups that helped us with the food prep such as United Church of God, Boiling Springs Band Boosters, First Church of God Youth Group, Lebanon County Farm Women, and Mechanicsburg Sertoma. It also was great to employ energetic college students each year."

had mushrooms lovers and mushroom haters. I wore a cowboy hat and handed out a lot of samples. We sold one product then, breaded white mushrooms."



Bob Ferranto, her dad, started growing mush-

rooms in the early 1960s. His wife, Rosemarie, came up with the marinated mushroom salad that the booth sells. Their daughter, who grew up in the business, took over running the booth in 2007.

She said that mushrooms became mainstream over the years, with breaded mushrooms remaining the top seller.

"Now, we have mushroom mania," she said. "We show the versatility of mushrooms. We started with mushroom soup in the mid-1980s and added a lot of other choices. We give out recipes too. People are more interested in plant-based food. "

Pennsylvania Vegetable Growers Asso-

ciation sells vegetable soup, chicken corn soup,

broccoli soup, vegetable wraps, blooming onions, bean salad, chili, broccoli-cauliflower salad, fried vegetables, dill pickles, carrots and celery, tomato juice, chili breakfast sandwich, strawberry slush drink, berry pie, pumpkin pie and chocolatedipped strawberries.

"We've been selling at the Farm Show since the late 1970s," said Bill

Troxell, association executive director. "We started with vegetable soup, then added broccoli cauliflower salad and dill pickles. At first, we shared space with mushrooms in the Main Hall. Then we moved to the East Hall, then later the Expo Hall where we have a lot more room." Troxell, who has run the booth since 1984, said that profits fund vegetable and berry research projects.

"Vegetable soup is not as popular as it once was," he said. "Batter dipped vegetables and blooming onions are our best sellers. We've recently added water infused with flavors like blueberry, raspberry, strawberry, cucumber and melons."

Troxell said that during the 1996 blizzard, he walked to the Farm Show from his motel and served vegetable soup to people stranded in the complex. "We did some business, but things were pretty slow," he said.

A few years later, the FFA also sold deep-fried cheese made by the Pennsylvania Dairymen's Association, then apple dumplings alamode from the State Horticulture Association and maple ice cream provided by Pennsylvania Maple Council.

By the time the FFA was invited to participate in the larger Farm Show Food Court, it already had been operating the food stand in the Main Hall. The FFA ran food booths in both places for a few years. Its first food item in the main Food Court was its Orchard Freeze, a fruit slushie which it sold for two years before moving into the current business. Now, the FFA sells fresh apple pie pizza, chicken buffalo pizza, cheese pizza and pepperoni pizza along with freshly squeezed lemonade and orangeade.

The Pennsylvania FFA in

the early 1990s sold Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture Tshirts, FFA baseball jerseys, two editions of their Winross trucks and 12 editions of their PA FFA collector tractors. The group then got into the food business at the annual Farm Show. Originally, the FFA food stand shared space with the state beef producers in the Main Exhibition Hall Food Court Annex which later included milkshakes and baked potatoes. The FFA first sold Hatfield pork products including hotdogs, rib sandwiches, and pulled pork sandwiches.



Couring the Food Court

Penn Ag Industries Association has a larger than life presence at the Food Court.

Most years, it sells chicken nuggets, chicken breast sandwiches, hot dogs, turkey barbecue, wings, bucket

of chicken, chicken cheese steak, seasoned slow-roasted rotisserie sliced chicken, chicken soup, deviled eggs, red beet eggs, mustard eggs, chicken parmesan sandwich, turkey meatball sandwiches, pork nachos, chicken nachos, chicken chili, fish sandwich, trout chowder, tortilla-crusted tilapia, bagels, cinnamon sticky buns, shoofly pie, whoopie pies, cookies, cinnamon buns, breakfast

sandwiches and slow-roasted pulled pork. Yet Penn Ag didn't always have such a big menu.

Chris Herr, Penn Ag executive vice president, began selling Farm Show food in the 1970s when he worked with his mother at the then Pennsylvania Poultry Federation.

"When I came to Penn Ag in 2002, our equipment at the Food Court was in bad shape," Herr said. "We

State Horticultural Association has been a steady Food Court presence, where it sells apples, apple dumplings with ice cream, apple cider, apple butter, cider floats, dried apples, caramel apples, cider slushies, dried apple snacks and apple or peach sundaes. The apples come from various association member farms.

The Strite family, which has been farming in the Harrisburg area since 1843, has worked at the Farm Show for generations.

"I remember my Dad, Earl, running the apple booth in the Main Exhibition Hall for years," said Joe Strite. "I helped him carry his apples into the Farm Show. Back then, we sold cider for \$1 a quart and apples for a quarter. I took over our Farm Show stand after I graduated from Penn State in 1976. I remember how popular the apple dumplings were when we added them. They still are."

Later, Strite said, the Food Court expanded into the East Hall. Strite said it usually took the association workers a day to set up the stand, although tearwere doing chicken nuggets, chicken sandwiches, chicken in a bucket, mustard and hardboiled eggs and chicken corn soup." Penn Ag eventually got more and better equipment.



Over the years, various groups joined Penn Ag as "councils." Penn Ag now has a Feed and Grain Council, Poultry Council, Aquaculture Council and Swine Council. Each contributes to Penn Ag's Food Court menu.

"We added pulled pork, trout sandwiches, trout chowder, tilapia, sticky buns, whoopie pies, cookies, breakfast sandwiches and

much more," Herr said. He called Penn Ag's week at the Food Court "long and exhausting. It's a great fundraiser." Money raised goes to scholarships and promoting agriculture.

"It takes a big team to staff the Food Court," he said. "We use about 300 volunteers who work the counter and 30 others who prepare the food, with a captain in each area. It's a monumental task."

down was faster.

"On opening day, the governor would tour the Food Court," Strite said. "We usually gave him an apple or maybe a quart of cider."

Strite said that over the years, the Farm Show lengthened to eight days, the Food Court moved to what's now the Giant Expo Hall, the crowds increased,



and the State Horticultural Association made more money at its booth.

Weather always has impacted the success of Food Court stands, Strite said, noting that, "Snowstorms are never good for us."

Strite said that the stand usually is open from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m., with volunteers committing to days and times to work. Now, he said, his nephew, Matt Strite works at the association Farm Show booth.

Dennsylvania Farm Show Scholarship Foundation

In the Farm Show tradition of providing educational activities and support, the Farm Show Scholarship Foundation was established to assist Pennsylvania youth with financial support in their goal to pursue continued education. Recognizing the value of agriculture to the state's economy, this program is designed to help students reach their goals and hopefully keep them our agriculture industry. The Farm Show Scholarship Foundation was established in 1993 through the vision and generous support of several key leaders in agriculture and three companies that contributed more than \$11,000 toward scholarships. Since then, the Foundation has awarded nearly \$1.7 million in scholarships to nearly 600 worthy 4-H and FFA youth.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR THE SCHOLARSHIP?

Eligible applicants must be enrolled in a post- secondary educational institution and have been a PA Farm Show exhibitor of junior market livestock including sheep, steers, swine, rabbits or goats. Junior breeding project exhibitors, Farm Products, and Family Living youth exhibitors are also eligible to apply.

HOW DO I BECOME A FOUNDATION MEMBER?

There are three types of memberships: Ambassador Club, Regular and Past Scholarship Recipient.

The Ambassador Club is available for those individuals and corporations who wish to visibly demonstrate their support of agriculture and the Foundation. Annual membership dues start at \$300/ individual and \$500/ corporations/ businesses. Of course, you're encouraged to contribute much more than those minimum levels! As an Ambassador Club member you receive tickets to the breakfast and access to the lounge with food and refreshments both during the PA Farm Show event in January.

Regular Membership is open to any person interested in supporting the mission of the Foundation. Annual membership dues are \$50.

'Ever thought about bringing home the bacon? The Farm Show Junior Livestock Sale provides the opportunity to take home meat raised right here in the Keystone State.

4-H and FFA members work hard for a year or more, to prepare to show their market livestock over the three days at the beginning of the PA Farm Show. Their work purchasing, raising, training, clipping, and showing their market animals has all led to the minute they bring their animal to the auction block at Tuesday's sale. Bidders support these youth, who then invest the money in their education or their herds and flocks.

Why buy an animal at the Junior Livestock Sale?

- Cheaper than purchasing meat at the store.
- Knowing where your food comes from and who raised it.
- Supporting the next generation of agriculturalists and agriculture promoters.

But before you seek the winning bid:

Do you have enough freezer space?

(Here's how much meat to expect!)

- •Steer: 450-500 pounds of beef
- •Hog: 120-150 pounds of pork (bacon, sausage, ham)
- •Sheep: 40-55 pounds of lamb
- •Goat: 35 pounds of meat
- •Rabbit (sold by pen): 3-4 pounds each

Do you have a preferred butcher shop?

• If so, let them know you'd like them to handle harvesting and fabrication of an animal you hope to purchase at the Farm Show. If not, contact your county Penn State Extension office for help locating a shop. If you are purchasing a hog: all hogs must go directly to harvest with pre-approval of trucking and harvest facilities.

• If you don't have a livestock trailer, your butcher shop, or the exhibitor you plan to purchase from, may be able to help you find a hauler.


