On March 17th, Hawai'i's Governor David Ige announced actions the State will be taking to support the worldwide efforts to mitigate and slow the spread of COVID-19.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Hawai'i Department of Health (DOH) have stressed the importance to expand social distancing and limit gatherings to no more than 10 people.

Under the guidance given, the Hawai'i Convention Center will be closing for 30 days starting March 18, 2020, to ensure the health and safety of our guests and staff due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

We are working closely with event and meeting planners who will be impacted to help with the rescheduling or cancellation of their event.

We will remain in close communication with local hospitality, state and government leaders to determine what additional measures need to be taken upon our planned reopening in April. The long-term sustainability of Hawai'i's visitor industry is vital to our economy. However, the safety and health of our residents, visitors and employees is our number one priority.

Our actions during this short moment in time will be critical to the long-term health of Hawai'i's people and our industry.
