

Online Safe Travels Form

The <u>Safe Travels</u> form is a digital form that is mandatory for all travelers to Hawaii. This online form provides the State Department of Health (DOH) access to the mandatory health information that passengers need to provide to monitor and protect public health in real-time. It can also be used by the Dept. of the Attorney General and county law enforcement officials to enforce the quarantine rules. Travelers are encouraged to enter their information and trip details well in advance of their flight.

<u>Scheduled Nonstop Overseas Air Service to Hawaii – October 2020</u>

Schedule is preliminary as carriers continue to modify their schedules in preparation for Hawaii's October 15th acceptance of a negative COVID-19 test result in lieu of the 14-day mandatory quarantine for arriving passengers.

The 7-Day Moving Average measures daily passenger arrivals to Hawaii (including visitors and residents) from the U.S., Japan and other international source markets. This analysis is used to visualize real-time demand monthand year-to-date tracking of arrivals.


