

Hendricks County COVID-19 Hotel Data Monthly Report

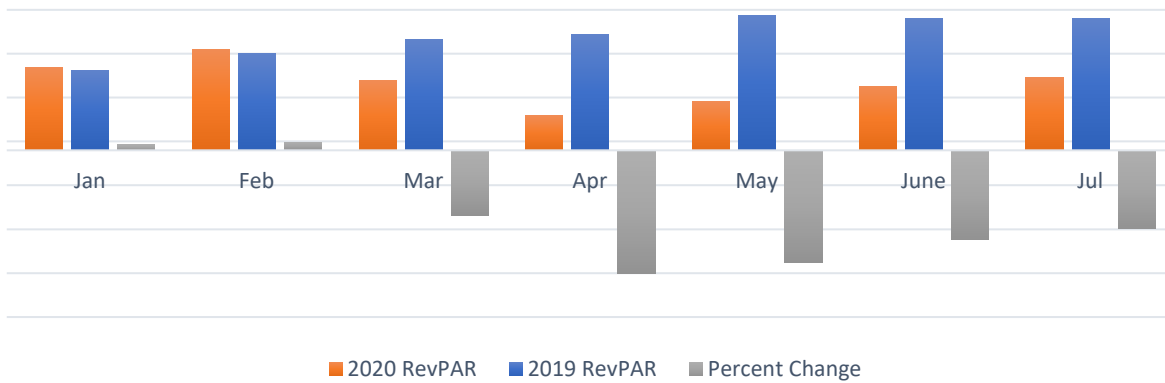
Through the Month of July 2020

Hendricks County was above the national average for Occupancy in July, coming in at 51%. We have seen monthly increases in both Occupancy and RevPAR for the last three months, although it seems that growth has slowed recently.

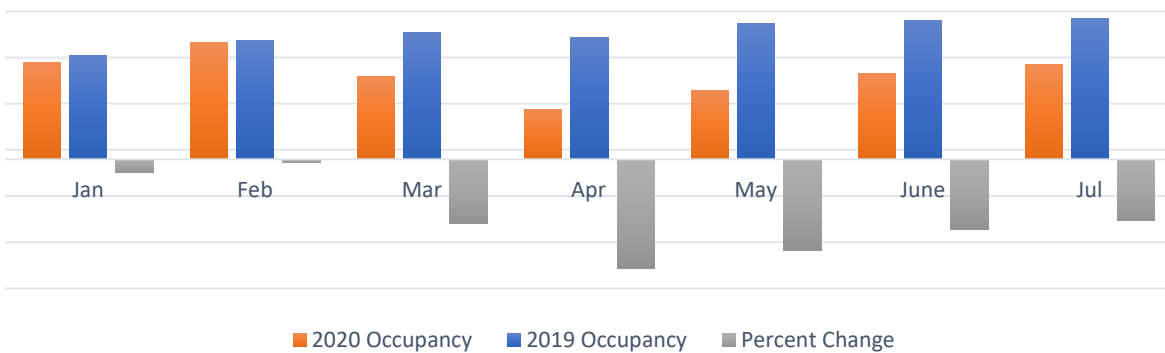
For the first time in 2020, Hendricks County occupancy and RevPAR came in just beneath the average for Indiana. It appears that growth in both metrics has slowed for most surrounding counties. Hamilton County, which was hit the hardest at the beginning of the pandemic, has shown significant monthly increases for two months, finally reaching similar occupancy levels to the rest of the region in July.

While U.S. Occupancy and RevPAR continue to show large YOY declines, both metrics are showing slight improvements over June. According to data from STR, Occupancy for the U.S. was 47% for the month of July.
