Pro-1700s

Area occupied by tribes of the Catawba Indian Nation.



German, Swiss, Scotch-Irish settlers arrive to the area.



Catawba County is established, named for the Catawba Indians who once inhabited the land. Cities and towns formed later including Newton in 1855, Hickory in 1870, and Conover in 1876.



Furniture manufacturing began in the community.

Hickory Motor Speedway was opened as a ½ mile dirt track and known as the world's fastest short track and the birthplace of many NASCAR Stars.





CREATING MOMENTUM

Hickory has a history of craftsmanship. Hickory's past and future prospects have drawn to this place people with an eye for detail and a hand for hard work, those with a passion for making something of themselves and of the future.

The regional hub of over 365,000 people for commerce and recreation, Hickory continues to evolve and reinvent itself, capturing the attention and affection of people and publications far beyond its borders. Hickory was recognized in 2018 by National Geographic Travel as one of the Best Small Cities in America and by Forbes Magazine for being ranked first in the nation for lowest business costs, at 25% below the U.S. average. Hickory is located between Charlotte and Asheville at the foot of the Blue Ridge Mountains, along I-40, where a collective spirit of craftsmanship strengthens any endeavor with detail, artistry, and quality.







As Hickory's bond program comes to fruition throughout the city, it is generating much excitement among residents and visitors while fueling economic development, growth, and job creation. The Hickory Trail will become a regional destination providing connectivity and unique experiences to enrich the quality of life in Hickory. With \$90 million being invested into our community through the bond referendum and additionally secured federal and state grant funding, we're actively crafting a stronger, more vibrant future for Hickory and the greater metro region.

HICKORY'S BOND PROJECTS SPUR GROWTH AND REVITALIZATION

In 2014, the City of Hickory's citizens passed a \$40 million bond referendum, covering four major projects that are underway - Trivium Corporate Center, City Walk, Riverwalk, and Streetscapes & Gateways. These projects are spurring growth, development, and attracting visitors to Hickory. Throughout the process, leaders have worked with a 42member Bond Implementation Commission to guide the projects and make recommendations to City Council. The City has been able to leverage those funds to secure an additional \$50 million in grant funding to total \$90 million. This enabled the City to extend the Hickory Trail to 10 miles, connecting different parts of the community with destinations and amenities.

With all of these projects being in design and construction now, Hickory has seen job growth, as well as new development happening throughout the City.



CITY WALK

Hickory's City Walk is a 10-foot-wide, multiuse path that will run approximately 1.7 miles through Downtown Hickory to 9th Street NW (in front of Deluxe Printing Group). The City Walk will connect destinations and amenities throughout the City, and be a catalyst for economic development and growth. An iconic bridge, featuring interwoven arches, and other highlights along the path include Lenoir-Rhyne University, the SALT Block, Hickory City Hall, One North Center, Book Walk, Union Square, and Lowes Foods City Park. The City Walk is expected to be completed by spring 2021.

RIVERWALK

The Catawba River is one of Hickory's most beautiful, natural assets. The Riverwalk will provide public access to Lake Hickory with a combination of waterfront and wooded trails. The Riverwalk will provide visitors with a variety of scenery and multiple vantage points to admire the beauty of Lake Hickory and the surrounding natural environments. Plans to renovate Rotary-Geitner Park to create the Deidra Lackey Memorial Park, featuring a Lake House for events, an outdoor amphitheater on the water, a conservatory, gardens, and trails.





The City of Conover began in the mid 1800's as a "Y" intersection of the railroad traversing North Carolina. Although originally called Wye Town, legend says the name Canova was adopted but transposed to Conover over several years. The City of Conover was chartered in 1876 and incorporated in 1877.

Through the years Conover has grown to house many local furniture manufacturers and now is home to the Manufacturing Solutions Center (MSC.) The Manufacturing Solutions Center has become an essential part of manufacturing and is a facility where

innovative concepts can be brought to life. It's where products and prototypes are tested; manufacturing processes are fine-tuned and accurate cost and product studies are performed. All of these services are available to manufacturers to help them stay at the forefront of their industry.

Just down the street you will also find the Furniture Manufacturing Academy, which is a part of the local Catawba Valley Community College curriculum. Here they continue to train the Metro area in fine crafted skills like furniture upholstery, fabric and leather cutting and more. The academy houses a showroom on-site and allows tours planned in advance.

Conover offers a quaint downtown with live music, local shops, local dining and more









he Crawdads arrived in Hickory in 1993 when Don Beaver, Luther Beaver, and Charles Young purchased the Gastonia Rangers and relocated the team to their hometown. Upon arrival in town, the owners held a contest to select the name of the baseball team. Nominations included the Hound Dogs and River Cats but ultimately the "Hickory Crawdads" found their home. Contests were also held to name the team mascot Conrad and his long time love interest, Candy. Conrad and Candy were married in an on-field ceremony during the 2018 season, which was the first mascot wedding in Minor League Baseball history.

The Crawdads have played at L.P. Frans Stadium since their inaugural season in 1993. The stadium was built on donated land and is named after the local Pepsi bottler, Lee Polk Frans, who partially funded the stadium's construction. The stadium has undergone several major renovation projects. The first round of renovations took place following the 2013 season and focused on fan

round was following the 2017 season and primarily focused on the playing area. Prior to the 2020 season, the playground and clubhouses were completely remodeled.

The 2021 season marks the 'Dads 13th year of affiliation with the Texas Rangers after being originally affiliated with the Chicago White Sox (1993-1998) and the Pittsburgh Pirates (1999-2008). In October 2017, the Rangers announced they had purchased the organization. Some notable Crawdads alumni that have since gone on to the Major Leagues

This year will also mark the team's first as a High-A affiliate. For their first 28 years the Crawdads were members of the Low-A South Atlantic League. The 'Dads are now members of the 12 team High-A East League and play teams from the Carolinas, Kentucky, and the Northeast.

The 'Dads play 60 home games a season and pack a promotional schedule full of giveaways, movie tributes,

dog days, food and drink specials, and post-game Christian concerts. The Crawdads also shoot fireworks following every Friday night home game!



he Hickory community has long been known for its resiliency, creativity, strength and determination, as is evidenced by its storied history. In the summer of 1944, without warning, a serious epidemic spread throughout the Catawba Valley region. When news disseminated throughout the community that hospitals in neighboring cities had already reached their full capacity, it became evident that new patients in the region would soon need a place to be treated. Residents and businessmen from all industries in Hickory quickly convened and launched a massive volunteer effort to respond immediately to this health crisis. They collectively came together with the help of the March of Dimes and the American Red Cross to build and staff an emergency hospital within just 54 hours. The hospital ended up treating over 500 patients, the majority of which were young children, and many lives were saved in the Catawba Valley region from the worst polio outbreak that had ever hit the United States. This remarkable achievement is commonly referred to as The Miracle of Hickory.

When the Great Recession of 2008 made its way to Hickory, manufacturing was one of the hardest hit industries. The Hickory community, which is so rich and ingrained in furniture and textile manufacturing, needed to come together once again to rapidly resolve the challenges at hand. Furniture manufacturers discussed how

they could quickly adapt their businesses in order to survive throughout this difficult time period. Some companies downsized to smaller operations while others merged with common partners and shared resources. Some completely shifted production strategies and others were forced to close completely. Many skilled furniture and

textile craftsmen and industry veterans decided it was time to retire and others supplemented their income by utilizing their skills for side projects wherever they could. This created another challenge of educating and training the next generation in the time-honored traditions and skills of handcrafting high-quality furniture that has become synonymous with the Hickory area. As a result of this economic crisis, The Furniture Academy at Catawba Valley Community College was founded by several local multi-generational furniture manufacturers in partnership with the local community college. Their proactive vision was to create an industry-driven training program, which prepared students for open skilled positions by one of this region's largest employers - the furniture industry. Since its inception, students have been learning about all the different high-quality furniture processes and handcrafted techniques from highly experienced furniture craftsmen within the region. After graduation, these students are often hired by the same local furniture factories that have provided training to them along the way.

After the Great Recession of 2008, the furniture industry experienced several prosperous years of increased demand, production and growth. But most recently in 2020, our region faced yet another unprecedented challenge

when the Coronavirus made its way into North Carolina. Early on, each state grappled with the reality of competing against the rest of the world for the exact same resources needed to combat the virus. It was the resiliency, strength and determination once again by the furniture and textile industries in our community, along with their creative spirit and strong partnerships that made it possible for them to completely pivot and adjust like they had done so many times before. Many North Carolina furniture and textile manufacturers utilized their seasoned skills and resources to retool their manufacturing facilities in order to produce large amounts of personal protective equipment (PPE) to distribute to all the selfless healthcare workers and front-line responders. We are so proud of our furniture manufacturers who stepped up to help save countless lives around the world through their tireless and resilient efforts to fight this unrivaled pandemic.

As the Hickory community and the furniture industry both continue to pivot and adjust to whatever lies ahead, the resiliency, creativity, strength and determination that has been such an instrumental part of our past will continue to reshape and define our future. We are so proud to be part of this remarkable community...Hickory Furniture Mart.

Zack put his spin and design on the space by renovating the location from floor to ceiling. The Charolais now boasts a large wine cellar (which landed them in a 2020 issue of Wine Spectator Magazine), a hand laid penny bar with cowhide bar stools and friendly faces who have welcomed guests for decades.

Cranford Hospitality is making a name for themselves in the Hickory Metro hospitality industry and the future is looking bright with possibilities of new projects on the horizon. Zack and family are also giving back to the hospitality community through his work with a new Hospitality Academy Charolais for the Hickory Metro area and his work through the






