

TRAILS & PARKS:

LAND TRUST OF NORTH ALABAMA invites you to explore 70+ miles of free trails across eight public nature preserves in Madison County. Let your adventure begin just minutes (two miles) from downtown Huntsville on the 1,106 acre Monte Sano Nature Preserve - one of the largest urban land preserves in the U.S. Stroll along ponds and fields at Harvest Square, play disc golf at Chapman Mountain, or hike to see a spectacular waterfall at Bethel Spring.
