

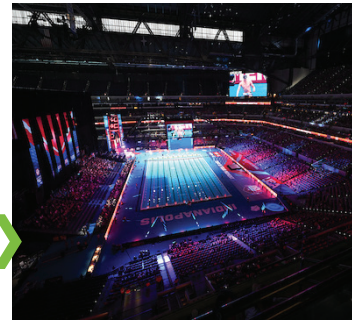
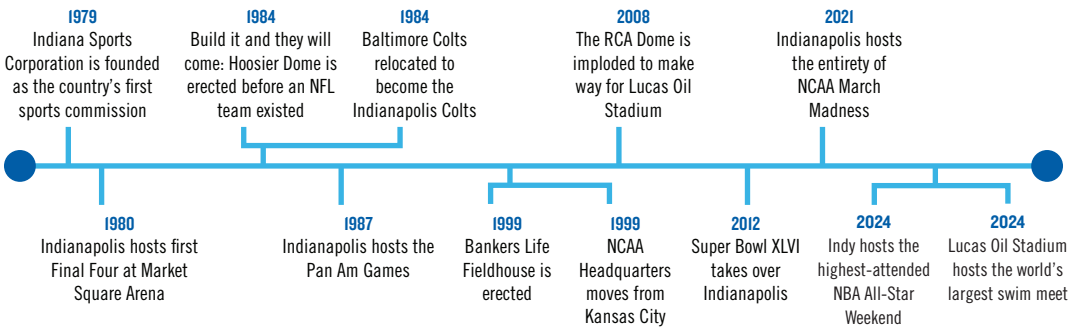

THE INDY SPORTS STRATEGY: A CATALYST FOR URBAN RENEWAL

Indianapolis experienced the same flight to the suburbs that plagued many Midwestern cities in the 1960s-70s. In response, civic leaders conceived a big idea: Rebuild downtown by making it the ‘amateur sports capital of the world.’ Although the city lacked any notable amateur sports assets at the time, city leaders knew it could be built.



INDY'S FEVER IS RISING



CAITLIN CLARK AND THE INDIANA FEVER ELEVATE THE WNBA

As a city with a thriving sports scene, the women of the Indiana Fever are changing the trajectory of the WNBA. By selling out home and away games, each game has a “home court” advantage for the most-watched team in the league. Rookie sensation Caitlin Clark has paired with Aliyah Boston, Kelsey Mitchell, and a young group of rising stars to make the Fever the hottest ticket in the WNBA. In 2025, Indy will host the WNBA All-Star Game.

NEXT LEVEL SPORTS VENUES



LUCAS OIL STADIUM

This multi-purpose stadium was used for Super Bowl XLVI (2012), the NCAA March Madness bubble (2021), and the NBA All-Star Celebrity Game (2024). Staple events include home games for the Indianapolis Colts, the NFL Combine (since 1897), and the Big Ten Football Championship (since 2011). This 70,000-capacity venue is no stranger to national and international events. **Next up:** One of WWE's biggest shows, the Royal Rumble.

INDIANAPOLIS MOTOR SPEEDWAY

Best known for hosting the largest single-day sporting event, the Indianapolis Motor Speedway can fit the White House, Vatican City, the Taj Mahal, the Roman Colosseum, Yankee Stadium, Rose Bowl Stadium, Liberty Island, and Churchill Downs inside the 2.5-mile-long track.

MAJOR TAYLOR VELODROME

One of the few remaining velodromes in the nation, this venue is the headquarters for track cycling in the Hoosier state. Named after the world's fastest bicycle rider and Indy's very own Major Taylor, this velodrome hosts cycling competitions from April through September.

CAITLIN & TYRESE

BICENTENNIAL UNITY PLAZA

The dome-like "Sphere," is a nod to basketball played inside the Fieldhouse. It's height is 23', 9", the distance between the 3-point line and the basket.



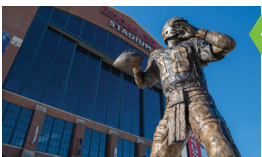
JOHN WOODEN
