

**Report says Greater Manchester on course to become European leader in AI innovation** 

Greater Manchester's AI companies are now valued at £3.14bn, more than five times their 2020 valuation, and the city region is on a path of considerable growth, according to a new report from the Turing Innovation Catalyst Manchester.

The report also highlights that, with the right support and investment, the city

region's AI ecosystem has the potential to be worth £11.2bn by 2035, increasing

the number of AI jobs to 25,000 and achieving an economic impact contribution of £18.67bn gross value added.
