## **が KANARRA FALLS**

Kanarra Falls is a favorite destination for adventure seekers. This moderate to strenuous water hike requires you to hike along and through the stream all the way up the canyon, scale a 20' aluminum ladder, and traverse several large boulders.

Difficulty: Moderate Water Hike Average Time: 3-4 Hours Distance: 4 Miles Roundtrip Elevation Gain: 700 ft. Permits: \$12.00 Per Person 150 permits issued/day



This is a water hike, plan on hiking in the river. Please do not make side paths to avoid getting wet. Due to the uneven terrain, hiking poles and good water shoes are recommended. **No flip flops**. This is a slot canyon and prone to flash flooding, do not hike if thunderstorm warnings have been issued for the area. Hike at your own risk. Never hike alone; remember to tell others where you are going and when you will return.

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PARKING LOT AND RESTROOMS - Free parking; RV/trailer parking available at Center Street and 100 West. There are restrooms in the Falls parking lot as well as a small gazebo with four picnic tables. There are no other facilities along the trail, so remember to "Go before you go," or pack out all human waste.


**PERMIT KIOSK AND ROAD** - Redeem online tickets at the kiosk. Depending on availability, tickets may be purchased here (limit 150 per day). Credit or debit card preferred when purchasing tickets at the kiosk. The trail follows an old access road ( $\approx$ 0.8 miles) into the Hurricane Cliffs and enters the lower open section of the canyon. The trail crosses the stream several times along the road.

EXITING BLM LANDS - The road ends and the trail narrows near the town's spring. The trail may be overgrown in places and you will alternate between hiking in the (usually less than a foot-deep) water and on the trail closest to the stream; stay on this trail to avoid further erosion to the banks. Good water hiking shoes and poles are highly recommended.

KANARRA FALLS - The first waterfall is at  $\approx$ 1.6 miles. Scaling a 20 foot aluminum ladder is required to continue the hike. The ladder may be icy, wet, and slippery. The trail is not maintained after this point, use extreme caution and know your limits! HIKE AT YOUR OWN RISK.

 ${\rm BOULDER}$  - At  $\approx 1.7$  miles is another waterfall and a large boulder. Climb/scale the boulder to continue. The boulder has no handholds or ladders.

2<sup>№0</sup> WATERFALL - The final waterfall is at ≈1.9 miles in a narrowing slot canyon and deeper water. Do not use makeshift rope or log ladders, these are not maintained and dangerous. DO NOT GO BEYOND THIS POINT; it is private property and extremely difficult for Search and Rescue to reach this area.
