SEASON: JUNE - OCTOBER

Day One: Downtown Cedar City & Evening Play

AFTERNOON

- Detour for a scenic drive in Kolob Canyons
 - Take Exit 40 on I-15
 - As part of Zion National park, a national park pass or day-use permit is required.
- · Arrive in Cedar City and check into your lodging.


EVENING

- Attend the pre-show Play Orientation to learn more about the evening's play
- · Catch the free nightly Greenshow on the lawn
 - Song, dance, and lively theater
 - 3 rotating themes
 - Summer only

Ask About Ticket Bundles

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Day Two: Cedar Breaks National Monument

MORNING

- Grab breakfast and your go-to caffeine fix at The Grind and a picnic lunch to-go from Bristlecone.
- Join other Shakespeare Festival patrons for a discussion of the previous night's plays at the Play Seminar.

AFTERNOON

- Take off for Cedar Breaks National Monument
 - Center Street in Cedar City becomes SR-14 going east. This scenic byway will take you through Cedar Canyon. Turn left at the junction with Hwy 148.
 - On the way stop at the Zion Scenic Overlook (mile marker 16) for incredible views.
- · Hike at Cedar Breaks National Monument
 - Some of our favorite trails include: South Rim Trail (5 miles),
 Sunset Trail (2 miles), and Alpine Pond Loop (1 to 2 miles)

EVENING

• Grab dinner at Milt's Stagestop in Cedar Canyon. After returning to Cedar City, stop by IG Winery for drinks.



- Visit Brian Head for lunch and a scenic chairlift ride for incredible views. Fill the afternoon with Brian Head Resort summer activities or mountain biking.
 - WEEKENDS ONLY
 - The view from Brian Head Peak is amazing too!

 Catch a different theme at the nightly Greenshow at 7:10 pm before the next evening performance at 8:00 pm

Day Three: Cedar City to Home

MORNING

- Grab breakfast from The French Spot in downtown.
- Enjoy a Backstage Tour at 10 am with the Utah Shakespeare Festival team. Participants must be on time.

AFTERNOON

- Drive to the Parowan Gap to explore the past of Cedar City.
 - One of the largest collections of petroglyphs in the west, they are also some of the most accessible.
- Grab lunch in Historic Downtown. Explore the local shops and find vibrant murals as you wander.
- Attend an afternoon performance with the Utah Shakespeare Festival at 2 pm in downtown Cedar City
- Before packing up for the journey home, visit the Southern Utah Museum of Art and the Sculpture Gardens.
 - Admission for the Southern Utah Museum of Art is free
