The Legislature is still moving more slowly than in past sessions, with both chambers meeting on shorter schedules. Covid-19, the State's budget, and the winter storm continue to dominate. Both the House and Senate met briefly this week, and have adjourned until next Tuesday, March 9th.

Last week bills started getting referred to committees. The bill filing deadline is March 12. Once we hit the deadline, we will take a deep dive into bill language for impacts to the industry and provide more information to you. As of today, there have been 4,260 bills filed, and we are tracking 193 of them for the Texas Travel Alliance.

If you are signed up to be an advocate for travel & tourism through our grassroots platform, look for a text from us earlier today. The House Culture, Recreation & Tourism Committee has invited the travel industry to provide testimony about our covid-19 impacts and current state on Monday, March 8. TTA will provide testimony along with several members. More to come next week!

Highlights from previous week's updates:

The Senate and the House held emergency hearings on the winter storms to get to the bottom of why the power grid failed when weatherization recommendations for power plants were issued a decade ago. It was evident that these recommendations issued by federal regulators were largely not enacted and unfortunately, left most of Texas' residents without power during the coldest ice

storm the state has ever experienced. At this time, there are no estimates on what it will cost to weatherize all of the components of the grid, but at the end of the hearings, the Legislators main concern was who will pay? TTA will follow these ongoing conversations for impacts to the industry.

Lieutenant Governor Dan Patrick issued his top 31 priorities the Senate will take up and consider this legislative session. The topics vary from the State Budget, ERCOT, Broadband Access, and Pandemic Liability Protections. A complete list is here.

The bill filing volume is still down compared to previous sessions, but has picked up in recent days. There continues to be a backlog of bill drafting requests at Legislative Council. We will provide some statistics after the bill filing deadline which is on Friday, March 12th. We also continue to track filed bills for impacts to the travel industry.

The Senate and House continue to convene as a full body on Tuesdays and Wednesdays of each week. This week, the House started referring bills to their committees of jurisdiction. House committees will begin to hold organizational hearings next week and will most likely hold bill hearings the following week. So far this session, they have only spent 14 hours on the Floor combined. By this time in 2019, the two chambers had convened collectively for 53 hours. The main difference is that normally during this time, the chambers recognize groups and honor them with resolutions. With COVID, extra precautions are in place therefore, this ritualistic practice is not taking place.

TTA has signed on in support of the Hospitality and Commerce Job Recovery Act of 2021 (federal legislation). Support for this legislation is another part of our advocacy work to bring back meetings & events. The letter is linked <u>here</u>.

Senate Finance Committee hearings

State Tourism Promotion funding was not specifically discussed in testimony provided by Adriana Cruz, Office of Economic Development and Tourism. This is seen as a positive in that the request for funding has not drawn attention from any of the committee members and should remain intact. In advance of the hearings, TTA lobby team met with Senate Finance Committee members and their staff to discuss the importance of preserving the full budget request for tourism promotion and provided information on the value of the funds, particularly as related to economic recovery.

ASSET Coalition

The ASSET coalition, of which TTA is a member, continues to work to advance legislation to help businesses in Texas stabilize, rebuild, and grow. In order to help businesses stabilize, we will address overregulation—preempting cities and counties from regulating private employment practices, like scheduling, hiring, benefits and wages. This bill does not include language as related to discrimination. The bill will be filed by Senator Creighton and we will share more information as we have it.

Fleet/Commercial vehicle regulations

House Judiciary & Civil Jurisprudence Chair Jeff Leach (R-Plano) filed HB 19 to reform commercial vehicle litigation.

A coalition is being built to support the legislation to clarify the rules for how commercial vehicle lawsuits are tried, ensuring juries have the facts necessary to award fair compensation and level the playing field for all litigants. Any members with fleet vehicles should follow this legislation and reach out for more information on the coalition and it's efforts. TTA will follow and report as it relates to tourism businesses.

Governor Abbott's State of the State

Governor Abbott's State of the State address, he declared five emergency items. The emergency items are:

- Expanding broadband access;
- Passing laws that prevent cities from defunding the police;
- Fixing the "flawed bail system;"
- Election integrity so Texans can have "trust and confidence in the outcome of elections;" and
- Coronavirus-related civil liberty protections for "individuals, businesses and health care providers that operated safely during the pandemic."

By declaring these items as an emergency will allow the Legislature to take action on them within the first 60 days of the legislative session. Abbott also noted other areas he believes should be priorities this legislative session, including continued investment in education and mental health support. Beginning of Session update

The Legislature convened on January 12th to officially begin the 87th Regular Session. Representative Dade Phelan was formally elected as the Speaker of the Texas House and received nearly unanimous support from members of both parties.

Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced the biennial revenue estimate, which tells members how much they have to spend this budget cycle. The revenue estimate includes an upward revision over the July version, which had anticipated a 2021 ending balance of negative \$4.6 Billion. The figure now is expected to be a negative \$946 million. You can read Comptroller Hegar's announcement here.

Hospitality and Commerce Job Recovery Act of 2021

Section-by-Section Summary

SEC. 2. ESTABLISHMENT OF TAX CREDIT TO SUPPORT THE CONVENTION AND TRADE

SHOW INDUSTRY: Provides a general business credit (or a refundable payroll tax credit in the case of nonprofit organizations) for the cost of attending or hosting a convention, business meeting, or trade show in the United States between January 1, 2022 and December 31, 2024.

- Specifically, creates a convention and trade show restart credit equal to:
 - o 50% of the qualified participation costs paid or incurred by the taxpayer, and
 - 100% of the qualified restart costs paid or incurred by an eligible provider.
- Qualified participation costs would be defined as any cost incurred to attend or participate in a qualified event, including registration fees, lodging, and costs associated with trade show exhibitions.
- Qualified restart costs would be defined as any cost associated with reopening facilities designed for conventions, business meetings, or trade shows, if the facility was forced to close down or reduce operations due to the COVID-19 pandemic—including any renovation, remediation, personal protective equipment, cleaning, testing, or labor cost needed to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

SEC. 3. EXTENSION OF EMPLOYEE RETENTION TAX CREDIT: Extends the Employee Retention Tax Credit from July 1, 2021 to January 1, 2022.

SEC. 4. REPEAL OF LIMITATION ON ENTERTAINMENT, ETC. EXPENSES RELATED TO TRADE OR BUSINESS: Temporarily restores the Entertainment Business Expense Deduction by repealing the changes made by the 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act for taxable years after December 31, 2020 and before January 1, 2023.

SEC. 5. ESTABLISHMENT OF TAX CREDIT TO SUPPORT THE RESTAURANT INDUSTRY:

Provides a general business tax credit for restaurants or food service businesses (including carry-out food businesses who's primary operations function is prepared foods), covering any cost associated with reopening or increasing service at an establishment forced to close down or reduce operations due to the COVID-19 pandemic—including any renovation, remediation, testing, or labor cost needed to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Credit would be effective between the date of enactment and December 31, 2022.

- Specifically, creates a restaurant and dining restart credit equal to the qualified restart costs paid or incurred by the taxpayer.
- Qualified restart costs include costs in reopening a trade or business property or increasing meal and beverage services provided at such property including renovation, remediation, additional labor, or rental costs or testing of employees.

SEC. 6. CREDIT FOR TRAVEL EXPENDITURES: Provides an individual tax credit for qualified travel expenses occurring in the United States between January 1, 2021 and December 31, 2023.

• Specifically, creates a credit for individuals worth 50 percent of qualified travel expenses up to a maximum of \$1,500 per household plus \$500 for each qualifying child (providing a maximum

benefit of \$3,000 for a family of five). The credit begins phasing out for individuals making over \$75,000 per year (\$150,000 for married couples).

- Qualified travel expenses would include any travel expense above \$25 incurred at least 50 miles from the individual's home and includes an overnight stay, including expenses related to meals, lodging, recreation, transportation, amusement or entertainment, and gasoline.
- The tax credit can be carried back to the previous tax year, to provide a for a quicker benefit.

SEC. 7. ESTABLISHMENT OF TEMPORARY TAX CREDIT FOR UNMERCHANTABLE

INVENTORY: Provides a temporary credit for unmerchantable inventory between March 13, 2020 and September 30, 2020 at 90 percent of the qualified unmerchantable food and beverage costs for any taxpayer engaged in active trade of sale of food or beverage as a manufacturer, importer, wholesale distributer, or retailer.

When we last wrote on January 5, we had our eyes fixed on the Georgia Senate races. The victories by Democrats Jon Ossoff and Raphael Warnock sealed the Democratic control of both legislative chambers and the White House, but with a twist—a 50/50 Senate, with Vice President Kamala Harris able to cast the 51st vote. More of what this means below.

This dynamic has only occurred three times in history—1881, 1953 and 2001. In the U.S. House of Representatives, appointments to the administration from the Democratic ranks

further closes the gap, with Democrats holding 221 seats and Republicans holding 211 seats.

TravelPAC in Action

With such narrow margins in both chambers, it is possible to see more involvement from the emerging bipartisan Problem Solvers Caucus. This group played a pivotal role late in 2020, jumpstarting negotiations on the year-end coronavirus relief package.

POLITICAL LAY OF THE LAND

THE IMPACT OF A 50/50 SENATE

There are 100 seats in the U. S. Senate, currently split down with middle with both Democrats and Republicans holding 50 each and Vice President Kamala Harris (D) serving as tiebreaker. Majority Leader Chuck Schumer (D-NY) and Minority Leader Mitch McConnell (R-

KY) will continue to lead their respective parties.

About Dem Options...

Revoking the filibuster—a political procedure where one or more members of Congress debate over a proposed piece of legislation to delay or prevent a vote—seemed like a real possibility as Democrats took majority. This now appears unlikely for the time being as the Democrats make an effort to work with Republicans—and because they do not have the votes.

However, there are two legislative procedures for Democrats to exercise their simple majority of 51 votes: using the Congressional Review Act (CRA) and budget reconciliation.

- The CRA allows Congress to negate a final agency rulemaking with a simple majority vote in both chambers and the President's signature.
- <u>Budget reconciliation</u> accelerates the legislative process and allows the Senate to bypass the 60-vote threshold. Still, every provision of the bill must comply with complicated budget rules.

Reconciling the Relief Package

The Biden administration's American Rescue Plan is slated to pass under the budget reconciliation rules, but the Senate parliamentarian must conduct a thorough analysis to ensure all provisions comply.

In the final days before the vote, the Senate parliamentarian determined a provision to raise the minimum wage to \$15 an hour was outside the scope of the reconciliation rules and it will likely be removed from the final bill.

Goodbye Congress, Hello Administration

Sen. Kamala Harris (D-CA)

As we all well know, the Democratic senator resigned from her seat to assume the Vice President role, becoming the first Black, South Asian and female to hold the office.

Who Takes the Seat? California Governor Gavin Newsom (D) selected California Secretary of State Alex Padilla (D) to succeed Vice President Kamala Harris, who will finish Harris' term through 2022 when he will be up for re-election if he chooses to run. Senator Padilla is the first Latino senator from California.

Rep. Cedric Richmond (D-LA-2)

Rep. Richmond will serve as senior advisor to President Biden and director of the Office of Public Engagement.

Who Takes the Seat? Louisiana will hold a special election to fill the seat on March 20. Louisiana is a majority-vote system, meaning all candidates compete in the same primary, and a candidate can win the election outright by receiving more than 50% of the vote. If no candidate does, the top two vote recipients from the primary advance to the general election,

regardless of their partisan affiliation. If necessary, a runoff election will be held on April 24. This is a solid Democratic seat.

Rep. Deb Haaland* (D-NM-1)

The Democratic representative from New Mexico's 1st Congressional District has been nominated to serve as Secretary of the Interior. If confirmed, she would become the first-ever Native American cabinet secretary.

Who Takes the Seat? According to New Mexico law, the governor must call for a special election within 10 days of the vacancy, which must occur no earlier than 77 days from the date of the proclamation and no later than 91 days from the date of declaration. Party leaders will select the candidates who will face off in the race to serve New Mexico's 1st Congressional District. This is considered a strong Democratic seat—Rep. Heather Wilson was the last Republican to hold this office in 2009.

Rep. Marcia Fudge* (D-OH-11)

The Democratic representative for Ohio's 11th Congressional District has been nominated to serve as Secretary of Housing and Urban Development.

Who Takes the Seat? Based on Ohio's Constitution, Governor Mike DeWine (R) will call for a special election to complete the remainder of Rep. Fudge's term. Depending on the confirmation process timing, the primary will either be held on May 4 or August 3 (concurrent with regularly scheduled primaries). The general election will be either on August 3 or November 2. This is considered a solidly Democratic seat.

*Pending Senate Confirmation—because the Democrats hold a slim margin, President Biden is trying to confirm executive nominations in the Senate quickly.

IT IS NEVER TOO EARLY TO START TALKING MID-TERMS (2022)

Retiring Travel Champions and Swing State Senators

Senator Pat Toomey (R-PA): A two-term senator and the ranking member of the Senate Banking Committee—where he was formerly chair. In October, Sen. Toomey announced he would leave office and move to the private sector after his current term. This seat is considered a toss-up in 2022.

Senator Rob Portman (R-OH): A two-term senator and the ranking member of the Homeland Security and Government Affairs Committee. In January, Sen. Portman announced he would not run for re-election, citing partisan gridlock and a lack of legislative progress. This seat leans Republican.

Senator Richard Shelby (R-AL): A Republican senior senator from Alabama and ranking member of the Senate Appropriations Committee. First elected in 1978, he has served as the chairman of four powerful committees, including Banking, Intelligence, Rules, and

Appropriations. This is a solid Republican seat.

Senator Richard Burr (R-NC): A three-term Republican senator and former chairman of the Senate Intelligence Committee. Sen. Burr announced in 2016 that he would leave office at the end of his term to work in the private sector. He has faced rebuke as one of seven Republicans who voted to convict former President Trump in the recent impeachment hearings and was censured by the North Carolina GOP. This seat is considered a toss-up in 2022.

Potential Senators Retiring

Sen. Chuck Grassley (R-IA): A senior senator, ranking member of the Senate Judiciary Committee and member on the Senate Finance, Budget, and Agriculture committees, and the Joint Committee on Taxation. If elected to a sixth term in 2022, Sen. Grassley would be 95 at the end of his term. The senators has indicated he loves his job and has the stamina to continue to serve. He will decide in the fall whether or not to run again.

Sen. Dianne Feinstein (D-CA): A senior senator (she is the oldest senator at the age of 87) and former ranking member on the Senate Judiciary Committee after she made the decision to step down last November. This action has increased speculation that she may retire before her term ends in 2024. She has been criticized for her collegial relationship with Sen. Lindsay Graham (R-SC), and according to the <u>LA Times</u>, recent polls show that only 35% of registered California voters approve of Sen. Feinstein's work.

Retiring Representatives

Rep. Eddie Bernice Johnson (D-TX-30): The first woman to chair the House Committee on Science, Space, and Technology. She is retiring at the end of her 15th term in Congress.

Potential Representatives Retiring in 2022

Rep. Nancy Pelosi (D-CA-12): The current Speaker of the House. Ahead of the 116th Congress, she pledged that she would only serve as Speaker for four years. At 80 years old, she remains a force, and her well-honed political skills have kept various factions of her caucus in line.

Rep. Jim Langevin (D-2-RI): May lose his seat if redistricting eliminates one of Rhode Island's two congressional districts. He could run for governor of Rhode Island in 2022.

MEMBER OF CONGRESS Q&A

Rep. Stephanie Murphy (D-FL-7)

Q: What is your proudest legislative achievement that supported travel and tourism in your district?

Tax Credit (ERTC), a pro-worker and pro-business provision that provides direct financial support to businesses that retain or rehire workers, rather than lay them off. It is estimated that this provision will enable businesses to retain or rehire 13 million workers, and it should be especially helpful to businesses and workers in the travel and tourism sector.

Q: What is your top recommendation for why travelers should visit your district?

A: Central Florida is home to many tourist attractions like Walt Disney World, Universal Studios, SeaWorld, among many others. We are also a top culinary destination, with a growing list of frequently visited restaurants with cuisines from all over the world. And given the fact that Florida enjoys warm weather year-round, we are a perfect spot for retreats, conventions, and conferences. Since we're so used to visitors from all over the world, Central Floridians are always welcoming people. We can't wait to beat this virus so we can once again welcome travelers with open arms.

Q: What was your most memorable childhood vacation?

A: I loved going fishing with my dad as a kid. Now that I call Florida home, I love visiting our beautiful beaches, fishing with my husband and young children, and soaking in all that Florida has to offer. Like my dad taught me, there is no issue that can't be resolved while fishing.

Q: What do you miss the most about travel during the pandemic?

A: I miss going on trips with the kids and planning future adventures that I know they will keep as memories for the rest of their lives. As a member of Congress, I often travel back and forth between Washington and my Central Florida home. During these trips, I miss the ability to interact freely with the community I represent, and exchange views or hugs at the airport or on the plane as I hear the stories from Central Floridians about the needs that exist in our region. I hope we will soon return to normal, and travel will once again not just be a means to get to another destination, but also to connect with other people.

MINUTES – BOARD AND BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

IRVING CONVENTION CENTER VIA ZOOM Friday, December 4, 2020

Those in attendance: Acting Committee Chair Debbi Haacke, Committee Vice Chair Bob Bourgeois, Beth Bowman, Board Chair Karen Cooperstein, Julia Kang, Clem Lear, Rick Lindsey, and Greg Malcolm – Committee; Carol Boyer, Maura Gast and Susan Rose – ICVB Staff.

Acting Committee Chair Debbi Haacke called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Haacke asked for any citizen comments and there were none.

Haacke thanked everyone for their support during her appointment as the Committee Chair and ICVB Board member. She reminded the Committee of the accomplishments they have made and noted their contributions in support of the Board are invaluable.

The Committee discussed reorganization and updates to the ICVB Board portal. Executive Director Maura Gast stated the updates and reorganization recommended are for better navigation and to encourage Board use. Assistant Executive Director Finance/Administration Susan Rose, Marketing Director Monty White and Office Manager Carol Boyer will head the project and hope to have updates completed to present to the full Board at the January 25 meeting, based on today's input.

Rose presented a preview presentation of the newly redesigned portal.

- Initial input from the Committee was implemented.
- The portal now has tabs posted by Committee with links for each with complete information needed for that Committee. Other tabs include Board and staff contact information, forms, industry news, Board orientation documents, Board/Committee meeting and activities calendar and City Council agendas.
- The ICVB Board bylaws will be added as separate tab so it can be easily identified.
- There is no Search option available for the portal only; the Search function will only search the entire Visit Irving website.
- From October 1, 2019 to September 30, 2020 there were 2,870 page views.
- IT Manager Brice Petty is developing a "how to" video with instructions for basic use of the portal and will include smart phone access and shortcut instructions.
- The portal is a secure link only. Anyone outside the ICVB Board requesting any of the information contained within the portal should submit an Open Records Request. A highlighted link on the portal entry page provides links to the City's website with instructions to submit a request.

Rose asked for Committee feedback:

- Haacke commented she is encouraged by the reorganization of the portal and ease of use.
- Board Chair Karen Cooperstein suggested "hot buttons" for the ICVB Strategic Plan and Budget.
- "In the News" tab Gast noted there are several articles added in the monthly Board meeting
 packet and she is hesitant to move too much to the portal in this tab, so they do not get lost on
 the portal and not read.

Discussion was held on sending email alerts when information that is important has posted to the portal and the choice of opting in to receive the information. Board member Beth Bowman commented the updates and reorganization are a great enhancement to the portal from the foundation that was already created. She suggested adding the Chamber of Commerce economic and legislative information to the "Industry News". She cautioned overwhelming Board members with emails. It is important to have all information in one place for Board members as volunteers in the community to navigate all the resources available to them.

Haacke asked if there is a procedure for keeping the information up to date. Rose replied there is no formal process in place but will work with Boyer and the ICVB Executive team to get information updated. Gast will also include a review of the portal in the Board orientation and discuss the importance of use.

ACTION ITEM: Rose will research if an opt-in option is available in the website program.

ACTION ITEM: The Committee will revisit the portal discussion in six months from its "re-launch" to review the usage and any further update requests, so there is time for board members to begin using the revamped version and to get used to it.

ACTION ITEM: Legislative Alerts tab – add legislative information and include the Chamber's legislative news and City of Irving's legislative agenda. Also add links to Texas Restaurant Association and Texas Hotel & Lodging Association for their legislative agendas as well, and any others that may be appropriate.

ACTION ITEM: Add Calendar to the Council Agendas and Calendar to the Chamber of Commerce.

ACTION ITEM: Add ICVB Board value statements as a priority to include in the Strategic Plan update in 2021.

Rose thanked everyone for their input.

Gast gave an overview of the ICVB Bylaws recommended changes:

- Industry-at-large Board position changed from Salesmanship Club position.
- Formalization of the Officer nominations, with the process being the responsibility of the Board and Business Development Committee. Committee recommendations would serve as official slate with nominations from the floor at the Board meeting when the vote is taken.
- The only Committee with defined members is the Executive Committee.

ACTION ITEM: Gast to make the Bylaws changes and bring back to the full Board in January for adoption. If adopted, then moves to the City Council agenda for their approval in February or March 2021.

ACTION ITEM: Gast to connect with Executive Director of Arts and Culture Todd Hawkins for clarification of timing for the Arts Board Bylaws adoption.

ACTION ITEM: Change in language – A slate will be presented by the Board & Business Development Committee for the Board's action at its November meeting, and nominations may also be taken from the floor.

ACTION ITEM: Future Committee topic – Board Nomination Process.

Gast gave an overview of the 2021 Legislative Session.

National Issues:

- Comprehensive COVID relief hotels, restaurants, related industry, states, and cities, CVBs, Convention Centers.
- Comprehensive COVID Recovery National Restaurant Association, US Travel Association.
- US Conference of Mayors National Restaurant Association and Destinations

International working very closely with U.S. Conference of Mayors on issues.

State Issues:

- Local control, municipal lobbying rights, protection of current hotel tax statutes, protection (or expansion) of State Tourism Office funding, protection (or expansion) of tools such as TPID, Events Trust Fund, etc.
- Restaurant issues will include making certain COVID exceptions permanent, i.e., alcohol to go, Restaurant Rescue Package omnibus bill.
- Texas Competes/combating discriminatory legislation.
- City will adopt its legislative agenda next week (12/14).
- "How" the Texas legislature will operate in COVID environment is still TBD.

Cooperstein suggested a letter from the Board to support and have an opportunity to voice opinion to the State Affairs Committee hearing to reinvigorate the ban on taxpayer lobbying. It is imperative to support the initiative, as it does affect Irving.

ACTION ITEM: Gast to send to full Board for their support.

Haacke asked for a motion to approve the Board and Business Development Committee meeting minutes. From September 11, 2020. On a motion from Cooperstein and a second from Board member Bob Bourgeois, the motion was unanimously approved.

Haacke reminded the Committee the next proposed meeting date is March 12 with new Committee Chair Bourgeois. A quarterly meeting date schedule will be forthcoming.

Future Committee meeting topics were discussed and included:

- Legislative Issues.
- Related Party Transaction Policy for ICC.
- Strategic Plan update with possible July Strategic Plan meeting with full Board.
- Rebuilding ICVB Reserve & Operating Funds:
 - Continued conversation with City Chief Financial Officer Jeff Litchfield on terms for loan repayment.
 - Opportunity for repayment of \$3 million taken from ICVB to meet initial debt service shortfall.

- 2026 Sunset of current Hotel Occupancy Tax allocations.
- Board applicant recruitment efforts.
- Formalize procedure for ICC bad debt policy.
- Additional CARES Act funding opportunities.
- "Great Plates" type programs Texas, local/Irving.
- Relief Bill trickle down to local level and CVB asks.
- Extending/adding another level to programs that were approved in order to create a recovery specific Business Development Incentive Plan effort that hotels could use to mitigate additional expenses for a group.

Discussion was held on vaccine distribution and protocol for healthcare and essential workers. Hotel and Restaurant Associations are lobbying nationally to be defined as essential. Convention Centers could be identified as mass vaccine inoculation sites.

Gast reported a Go Fund Me page will be launched benefiting ICC furloughed staff for assistance during the holidays. Another addition of StaffMeal, serving the restaurant, hospitality, and events community, will be distributed at the ICC the week before Christmas and volunteers may be needed.

Haacke thanked the Committee and extended wishes for continued success in future meetings.

Haacke adjourned the meeting at 10:18 a.m.
