MINUTES - COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT COMMITTEE

IRVING CONVENTION CENTER Tuesday, January 17, 2023

Those in attendance: Committee Chair Colvin Gibson, Board Chair Bob Bourgeois, Board Vice Chair Richard Stewart, Jr. – Committee; Carol Boyer, Maura Gast, Diana Pfaff, and Monty White – ICVB Staff; Tom Meehan – ICC Staff; Guest – Councilman Oscar Ward.

Committee Chair Colvin Gibson called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. Gibson asked for any citizen comments and there were none.

Gibson asked for a motion to approve the Community Engagement Committee meeting minutes of October 11, 2022. Board Vice Chair Bob Bourgeois asked for an adjustment of wording and replacing the words "to table." The minutes have been adjusted to read: "He suggested resuming the discussion until after the Texas Restaurant Association Foundation Scholarships committee can resume in 2023." On a motion from Board Chair Bob Bourgeois, and a second from Board Vice Chair Richard Stewart, Jr., the motion to approve the revised minutes was unanimously approved.

STRATEGIC PLAN - COMMITTEE UPDATES

a. Irving Schools Foundation ICVB Scholarship Update Assistant Executive Director Marketing and Communications Diana Pfaff reported the scholarship qualifications have not been changed for this year. This year's scholarships are in the reviewing process to identify students to receive the current ICVB scholarship. There will need to be a vote from the ICVB Board of Directors to adopt the revised scholarship for ICVB to present to a student's parent who is in the hospitality industry for training. Another option is to present to an Irving ISD teacher for training.

ACTION ITEM: Add is to January 23, 2023, Board meeting agenda to expand the scholarship to parents of a student who are in the hospitality industry for approval.

b. High Spirited Citizen Program

- I. Nominations and Recommendations There are three High Spirited Citizen Awards to be presented: Annette French, Susan Motley and Ernestine Chipman. It was noted that Councilman Brad LaMorgese has a nomination to submit but it has not been received to date. Pfaff indicated there were other names that had also previously been approved but not yet recognized that will need to be included.
- II. Recognition Luncheon There are several dates available in May at the Convention Center. The calendar is full prior to May. There was a conflict on May 11 with an Irving ISD event. The City of Irving staff training program on May 12 should not be a conflict. It was also noted that May 5 may not be a good option as Election Day is May 6.

ACTION ITEMS:

- Gast to reach out to LaMorgese for his HSC nomination.
- Gast to send out available May 2023 dates for luncheon to Board/Committee and City Secretary's Office.
- Expedite new nomination recommendations to the Board in time for recognition and attendance at luncheon.

BRAND ASSESSMENT PROJECT

Gast gave an overview of the recent Brand Assessment meetings. Believable Brands Gary Sherwin and Destination Consultancy Group Don Anderson met with several groups that included Board members, ICVB and ICC staff, City of Irving leadership, Las Colinas Association, and the Irving-Las Colinas Chamber. Those meetings were completed last week. Surveys will be sent out to those participants and to Irving residents, as well as clients, stakeholders, industry partners and site selectors/commercial real estate professionals. Gast asked the Committee for their support in encouraging residents to respond to the survey. Talking points and/or a QR code with information will be provided to share at local groups, Homeowners Associations, neighborhood Facebook pages, NextDoor, etc. for resident input. Gibson commented that the sessions with the consultants were productive, and time well spent.

COMMITTEE CHAIR

Gibson requested ending each Committee meeting discussing the productiveness of the meeting and if the ball was advanced. It is a suitable time to reflect on the importance of taking action and following through to advance the mission and message. Stewart suggested pointing out from the previous meeting's minutes any action items or previous conversations that needed follow-up.

Gast noted the January Executive Committee meeting has several ICVB and ICC financial reports and Hotel Tax Occupancy collection review that would be a good meeting to reach out to Councilmen John Bloch and LaMorgese to attend.

ACTION ITEM: Gibson to reach out to LaMorgese and Gast to contact Board member David Cole to reach out to Bloch for an invitation to attend.

Councilman Oscar Ward gave a shout out to Mary Higbie for publishing a "Things to Do In Irving" brochure with map and shared copies of the brochure with attendees. He noted the Irving Archives and Museum are attracting visitors from across the country and beyond with their popular exhibitions. The Green Book Exhibit brought visitors from Peru and Europe. The book is being sold in the Museum Gift Shop and staff have re-ordered multiple times to keep up with demand. He noted energizing Irving citizens should be a big part of the Committee and Board mission. The upcoming World War II exhibit at the Museum will attract a large veteran and military crowd.

ACTION ITEM: Gast to extend information of the exhibit to military groups in Irving.

Ward also noted there is a Planning and Zoning Work Session tonight at 6:00 p.m. at City Hall to discuss the R-AB Ordinance.



Pfaff added the MarComm team attended a team building event in the Bishop Arts District and she feels there are similarities to South Irving in the area. The small businesses, arts and crafts shops and restaurants are an attractive model and attract people to the area. It would be a good model for South Irving.

Discussion was held on foot traffic and parking issues and the road construction project in the Heritage District, which will be complete in early 2024. The branding assessment meetings identified needing some "home runs" in South Irving. It is important for the residents in the area to be positive about the improvements. Ward noted that the Heritage Square project will include a vertical parking garage with multi-family residential units. It is an exciting project and moving forward. Bourgeois echoed Ward's comments that what people would like to see in South Irving requires a lot more density than we have.

The Committee was in consensus that the meeting was successful.

GOAL:

INCREASE COMMUNITY OUTREACH & COLLABORATION

ASSIGNED TO: Community Engagement Committee

Objective A

Enhance Community Awareness, Appreciation and Support of the ICVB and the impact of the Visitor Economy on Irving.

Suggested Tactics:

- Revisit current Engagement and Advocacy strategies (i.e., Spirit of Irving awards, Annual Meeting, High Spirited Citizens) and update/revise to better achieve the Board's outreach priorities
- Develop clear talking points for the Board to use in its public outreach initiatives
- As part of Board Member orientation, consider requiring a shift worked at the Volunteer VisitorInformation Center as it re-starts to showcase the work being done to welcome consumers
- Work with ICTN to create a series about the importance of the Visitor Economy and ICVB's role
- Engage with Neighborhood Associations to tell the ICVB story

Objective B

Continue to work with City Leaders to create a better understanding of the role that Tourism plays in the community's Economic Vitality and Quality of Life.

Suggested Tactics:

- Design an advocacy plan that speaks the language of civic leaders
- Continue twice-a-year Board presentations to City officials communicating progress towards thecommunity's economic recovery and stabilization in future years
- Develop periodic FAM excursions to highlight areas of opportunities for City leaders and reinforcethe critical work being done by the ICVB
- Identify specific and targeted ways to engage former Board members to keep them up-to-date onthe Bureau's activities, efforts and needs
- At the Chair's invitation, and based on funding availability, host an annual Past Chairs and/or PastBoard Members gathering, with an agenda for discussion.

- Look to use social media channels (Impacting Irving, ICVB LinkedIn page) as tools for local,targeted communications
- Consider creating a series of "back-of-the-house" videos to show the work that Irving hospitalityworkers do every day to provide the platform for great visitor experience

Objective C

Build more Collaborative Relationships with other Community/Economic Development agencies.

Suggested Tactics:

- Identify the top 100 thought leaders in the community for personal contact by Board members
- Increase inter-agency communication between Chambers, Economic Development and others to maximize opportunities and eliminate duplicative efforts and spending
- Invite key stakeholders and influencers to sit in on Board meetings
- Identify opportunities for joint board meetings at least once a year with agencies such as DCURDand the TIF Board at the invitation of the ICVB Board Chair
- Work with the Parks & Recreation Department (Board to Board and Staff to Staff) to develop a plan for the pursuit of sports tournaments to best align resources and to avoid duplication of efforts



High Spirited Citizen Program

Irving's High Spirited Citizen program was initiated in 1988 by the Irving Convention and Visitors Bureau (ICVB). Its purpose is to recognize and encourage the spirit of volunteerism within the city of Irving. High Spirited Citizen award recipients are honored at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Irving City Council, and are further recognized by participation in other civic events as requested, such as the City of Irving Annual Holiday Parade.

More than 400 of Irving's "unsung" heroes have been named High-Spirited Citizen. To nominate an outstanding Irving resident for this award, please fill out the nomination form below. Candidates *must* meet the criteria listed below for award consideration. Applications are forwarded initially to the Community Relations Committee of the ICVB Board of Directors for review, and then forwarded to the full Board for action.

Nomination Guidelines

Anyone may submit a nomination for consideration.

Nominees must reside in the city of Irving, with the majority of their volunteer service benefiting an Irving organization or philanthropy. Selection will be based on the nominees' sustained efforts within their Irving organization or philanthropy.

Nominees' volunteer community involvement *may* be a designated part of their job responsibilities; however, in the true spirit of volunteerism, selection will be based on the nominees' amount of *personal* time, effort and resources dedicated to community service.

Nominees who hold or are running for public office at time of consideration will not be selected. Current members of the ICVB Board of Directors, ICVB staff or ICC staff are not eligible for consideration.



Nominees whose primary community service contributions are the result of courtordered service, or otherwise *required* service hours (i.e., scholarship or grant application) will not be considered.

The nomination form must be completed in its entirety, signed and dated. Additional pages detailing the nominees' volunteer community involvement are accepted and encouraged. The Community Relations committee may also ask for additional information from the nominator.

Nominators are encouraged to keep their nominations confidential until the ICVB Community Relations Committee has completed its review process and the Board of Directors has taken their formal action.

Nominators may request to remain anonymous.

Selection and Presentation Process

All nominations for the High Spirited Citizen Award are considered and reviewed by Community Relations Committee of the Irving Convention and Visitors Bureau (ICVB) Board of Directors, and those selected forwarded to the full Board for approval. Award selections are forwarded to the Office of the Mayor of Irving for scheduling coordination.

Once the Board of Directors has approved a nominee, the nominee will receive a formal announcement letter from the ICVB letting them know they have been nominated; this letter begins the coordination of the actual presentation process.

The award is presented by the Mayor at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Irving City Council. Nominators will be notified when their nominee is selected and informed of the date of the council meeting in which he/she will be honored. Nominators are encouraged to extend invitations to those close to the nominee to be part of the presentation.



Award presentations are typically not scheduled during the months of April and May, so as to avoid any perceived conflict with City elections.

The presentations begin at the start of a regularly scheduled meeting of the Irving City Council; awardees, family and friends are encouraged to be at City Hall no later than 6:45 p.m. that evening. The Mayor will come down to the podium and invite the honoree to come forward; the Mayor will make a presentation that includes highlights of the honoree's volunteer efforts and comments from their nomination form. The Mayor and the honoree then will pose for a picture from the podium. Often, the Mayor will ask the honoree if they'd like to make any brief comments of their own.

Photos and Press Releases

Photography of the actual presentation is encouraged and welcome.

Following the presentation, the honoree and any friends and family attending are asked to gather away from the main Council chambers for group pictures. These are typically done just outside the City Council Conference Room.

ICVB staff members will take a variety of group pictures, and then submit these to Irving media outlets, along with a press release, for considered publication. Honorees are also provided digital copies of the photographs.

How do we measure success?

Why measure success:

Measuring outcomes will assist the program to be more customer-focused, gather information in order to make changes where needed, expand and/or enhance volunteer involvement, share success stories, and volunteer efforts will be more effective. The outcomes help identify both the program strengths and limitations.

Program Focus:

Outcome Objective – visitors who request volunteer support will receive qualified volunteers who are able to provide appropriate services.

- All of our volunteers were well qualified; Board members and High Spirited Citizens who were knowledgeable about Irving attractions, visitor destinations, transportation, etc.
- Each volunteer was computer savvy and the kiosk was equipped with ipads that were preloaded with apps on the home screen to easily find information.

Outcome Measure – follow-up survey, questionnaire

• Visitors contact information was not asked for or received.

Performance Standard – 90-100% (realistic?) of visitors requesting support will report satisfaction with the quality of the volunteer and provision of service.

• Visitors contact information was not asked for or received.

Visitor Focus:

Outcome Objective – Visitors assisted by the VIV Program will have a positive, friendly experience.

- Comments at the Visitor Information kiosk were particularly good.
- Visitors verbally reported being thankful for the information they were given.
- Visitors verbally commented on being thankful to be greeted by a friendly, smiling face with a welcoming attitude easy to approach.
- Visitors verbally commented on the kiosk itself with positive notes.

In the future:

Outcome Measure – Assessment after six and twelve months and administer a questionnaire is for results to measure success.

Performance Standard – have a goal of 90% or greater for visitor satisfaction experience in connection with a volunteer.

Volunteer Focus:

Outcome Objective - Volunteers will be well-trained and feel prepared to provide direction when answering phone calls or walk-in questions.

- FAQ's document in the Visitor Kiosk Desk Guide was helpful
- Event resume' gave additional information about ICC events.
- TMF map was helpful and colorful.
- An email with each event to be worked was sent to the volunteer(s) before the event with any pertinent information.
- The training session was successful not all volunteers attended.
- Some volunteers trained others who did not attend the training session.

Outcome Measure – Information received from volunteers after 6-12 months participating in the program.

- Volunteer Survey Results: Ten surveys were sent and six responded
 100% of Volunteers said they rated their overall satisfaction with the Visitor Information kiosk volunteer program as Excellent
- 100% of the Volunteers replied this is not their first on-going volunteer position
- 66.67% replied they Strongly Agreed they felt valued as a volunteer in this program; 33.33%
 Agreed.
- 83.33% replied they Strongly Agreed they were given adequate support, training, clear instructions, resources, timely information and technical support; 16.67 Agreed
- 83.33% said their motivation for volunteering in this program was to Support a Mission They Believed In; 16.67% said it was to Help the Public.
- 100% of the Volunteers would be willing to continue to volunteer in this program.

Observations:

The kiosk was used only for public events at the ICC when the client had agreed to have it set up and volunteers present, as such it became more of an information booth for the ICC facility itself and the event.

It was helpful for attendees to have a centrally located place to ask questions about the event itself and the facility, as well as the entertainment options and restaurants at the Westin/Texican and TMF.

Next Steps:

Recruit more volunteers.

Decide if the kiosk should be an ICC/event operation or utilize it to the fullest as an Irving Visitor Information Center

If the latter, then it would be best to move locations outside of the ICC; Mustang Museum, TMF, or mobile unit (with shared overhead costs)

If only ICC/event operation, work with ICC sales to identify events and request their permission. Utilize opportunities when events offer the ICVB free booth space at their event and utilize our volunteers to promote the ICVB and Irving as a destination.

Marketing campaign to raise awareness; social media, place on ICVB, City, IAC websites.
