Board Chair Rick Lindsey called the meeting to order at 11:51 a.m. and noted this meeting is taking place as a video conference due to the COVID-19 restrictions. Lindsey asked for a moment of silence to honor Richard Huff, a longtime supporter of the arts in Irving and community leader. He inquired if there were any citizen comments; there were none.

After welcoming new Board members Jason Wu Trujillo from University of Dallas and Nydia Hoskins – General Manager for Omni Mandalay, Lindsey asked for a roll call of Board member attendance.

Accounting Director Marianne Lauda gave an overview of the ICVB February 2020 financials.

- Revenue report is directly from Munis software. The only Revenue in February was Hotel Occupancy Tax of \$2,068,081.31
- She noted revenues are a credit balance and show as negatives on the report from the software; this is a quirk within Munis and one of many reasons the City is working on creating custom reports.
- February expenditures are 38.3% for the first five months of the fiscal year
- In reviewing the Check Register, the following items were discussed:
 - Irving ISD - \$1,800 for floral arrangements from the Nimitz High School floral studio for the RCMA event
 - American Express – payments include expenses for SXSW event that was cancelled, regular travel and entertainment expenses
 - Keynote Speakers of Canada – keynote speaker fee for the Irving Hospitality Industry Annual Meeting
 - Two checks to the Irving Convention Center (ICC) for monthly network services and catering

In response to a question from Board Vice Chair Karen Cooperstein, Lauda replied the financial report can be adjusted to show monthly revenue and expenses. Customization of reports is being discussed.

Lauda then reviewed the ICVB March 2020 financials.

- Revenue collected was from interest and miscellaneous revenue from joint tradeshow sponsorship payments from other CVBs
- Expenditures show over 48% expended at the end of March
- In reviewing the Quarterly Financial Report, Lauda noted \$50,000 was going to be transferred into the ICC Capital Improvement Project (CIP) Reserve fund. But after further discussion, the decision was made to not transfer funds at this time. The Computer Replacement fund shows no additional purchases. The ICC CIP fund shows a budget adjustment of \$250,000 for the Westin Irving Convention Center hotel parking lot agreement; this was for back payments from August through February. The bond trustee makes payment to the City, which is then transferred to the ICVB and then paid to SMG.
- The following Check Register items were reviewed:
 - Payments to the ICC include:
 - \$34,992 and \$229,774 for CIP
 - \$350,000 subsidy payment from the General Fund
 - \$62,000 meetings catering and network service, also included F&B for RCMA sponsorship
 - \$144,000 payment to SMG for Westin Irving Convention Center hotel parking garage for August 2019 and September 2020; pass-through costs from City transfers

Lauda thanked the Board for their patience with the new software reports and she is looking forward to customizing reports to reflect a more familiar and useful look for the board's review. Lindsey thanked Lauda for all her hard work in the transition to the new software.

Lindsey asked for a motion to accept the ICVB Financial Reports for February and March 2020. Cooperstein made a motion to accept and Board member Bob Bourgeois gave a second. A roll call vote was as follows: Lindsey, Jo-Ann Bresowar, Dirk Burghartz, David Cole, Herb Gears, Debbi Haacke, Julia Kang, Clem Lear, Greg Malcolm, Ron Mathai and Joe Philipp voted in support of the motion; no opposed. The motion passed unanimously.

ICC General Manager Tom Meehan reviewed the ICC February 2020 financial report.

- February was a great month - budgeted to make \$40,000; actual \$178,000 in the month; \$138,000 ahead of budget.
- For the first five months of the year, ICC was budgeted to lose \$386,000, and actually made \$176,000, at \$62,000 ahead of budget.
- F&B Catering was \$146,000 ahead for the month, YTD +\$541,000 which equates to almost \$1 million in catering services.
- Expenses are in-line with budget.

Meehan then reviewed the ICC March 2020 financial report.

- COVID-19 pandemic hit halfway through March 2020 and ICC was budgeted to lose \$121,000, actual loss \$129,000.
- This shows a fairly even forecast, but only due to the \$144,000 payment from the City/ICVB for Westin Irving Convention Center hotel parking garage agreement.

- Six months into the fiscal year shows budgeted to lose \$507,000; actual was \$554,000 ahead of budget.
- Compared to last year at this time, the financials had a great cushion sitting through the first six months of the fiscal year and fortunate to have it.
- Catering was down for the month.
- Other Income shows \$158,000 and includes \$144,000 from parking garage rental that was included in March.

In reviewing the forecast:

- First six months of the fiscal year were outstanding.
- April through September is the forecast for remainder of the year, with numerous unknown variables that affect everything.
- There will be no income in April, other than the parking garage transfer payments.
- May and June have scattered events holding on and hoping they will continue as booked.
- Forecasting through the end of the year looks like a \$1.1 million shortfall right now, but that is very subjective, with a lot of moving pieces remaining.
- Forecast does not yet reflect events that were moved into the August/September timeframe or adjustments to moving capital improvement funds to the operating fund. Next month will show a better picture as these and other operational adjustments are being made.
- June/July timeframe is very important.
- The goal is to work the estimated \$1.1 million shortfall down as low as possible.

Meehan reported 27 events have cancelled from March to October; some from force majeure and will receive a refund, some cancelled and will pay cancellation fees. Sixteen events moved dates: nine into this fiscal year and seven into the next fiscal year (after October 1). Eighteen events are still working with new dates and hoping to rebook. The building is very crowded in August and September and it is getting more difficult to find open dates. There are 13 events considered Lost Business and that have decided not to move forward. Good news is there were 12 new contracts signed over the past two and a half weeks, most within this fiscal year.

He further reported the building had a lot of improvement projects began before the building closure and have continued during this time.

- Parking equipment installation
- Security camera upgrade
- Replacement of main boiler in the kitchen
- New software and electrical for monitors in the building

ICC has also partnered with FestEvents Foundation to prepare 2,400 meals per week for hospitality employees that have been furloughed. There is no cost to ICC as all food is donated. They have four chefs who are volunteering for this cause, plus ICC Executive Chef Eduardo Alvarez. Meals will be distributed every Saturday and hospitality employees will receive breakfast/lunch/dinner for four. There will be a lot of good media coming out of Irving and FestEvents is excited to work with the ICC. In response to a question from Lindsey, Meehan reported due to the COVID-19 event, there will only be a small staff working in the kitchen from our location and if the number of meals rise that need to be distributed, additional volunteers may be needed. In order to be responsible regarding social distancing, volunteer staffing is equally critical. We will let the Board know if there is a need for volunteers.

Lindsey asked for an update on ASM Global initiatives during the COVID-19 crisis as it relates to supporting furloughed employees. Meehan reported their parent company has partnered with different organizations across the country to allow all furloughed employees from ASM Global building to apply for various positions at places like Albertson Companies and Amazon and be hired without interviews. This effort across the country will allow their employees to find work elsewhere until buildings reopen. Meehan is in communication with ICC staff regularly and offers assistance in any way possible to each person. Cooperstein also recommended the "Get Shift Done" area initiative, which was launched to employ affected hourly workers in the hospitality industry to perform shifts for nonprofit organizations and institutions trying to meet community demand during the COVID-19 crisis.

Lindsey asked for a motion to accept the ICC Financial Reports for February and March 2020. Cooperstein made a motion to accept and Board member Clem Lear gave a second. A roll call vote was as follows: Lindsey, Bresowar, Burghartz, Cole, Gears, Haacke, Kang, Lear, Malcolm, Mathai and Philipp voted in support of the motion; no opposed. The motion passed unanimously.

The COVID-19 Irving Visitor Economy Situation Analysis item began with updates from the hoteliers in attendance.

Four Seasons General Manager Dirk Burghartz reported the Four Seasons Resort and Club is closed during the COVID-19 crisis and is waiting for Texas Governor Greg Abbott's new guidelines that will be addressed this afternoon. The golf club has been open and adhering to the strict safe-distancing guidelines. The golf club is operating with a half crew and the resort has a dozen or so in engineering. The sales team has reduced staff and is rebooking events where possible. Meeting planners are eager to rebook, but reality may not be any time soon. The resort plans to open in June and hoping to capitalize on local and national leisure and business travel. The staff and resort members have held fundraisers to support their employees that are furloughed, and it has been heartwarming to see the outpouring, but the situation is hard for those in limbo. He predicted some markets may bounce back easier than others.

Omni Mandalay General Manager Nydia Hoskins thanked everyone for the opportunity to serve on the Board. The hotel is currently closed and under renovations. The renovations were taking place before the crisis and it has allowed the construction to continue and not disrupt any meetings and groups. Construction inside and outside is on schedule. The hotel will begin taking reservations May 15 but may change based on Governor Abbott's new guideline announcement today. Some groups and weddings in June are still confirmed and will hopefully stay. Ten employees were kept on staff and another 15 were brought back to work on additional projects.

Hampton Inn Las Colinas General Manager Kim Limon reported the property is open although business is slow. All bookings are last minute or same day arrivals. Only employees staffed are front desk and minimal housekeeping employees. Their staff has been helping the sister property Hilton Garden Inn Las Colinas. May business is holding steady, but no groups are booked. June bookings are questionable.

ICVB Executive Director Maura Gast gave a COVID-19 analysis report

- Hotel Occupancy changes week-to-week:
- Beginning of the year – 70%
- Current Citywide – 22%
- Trending better than many markets

- Average Daily Rate swings. Average daily rate likely will take 12 months minimum to catch up (recovery may be compressed due to rapid decline of remaining business –rate war timing could potentially be limited).
- Cash Flow and Funding Challenges are:
 - ICVB:
 - Reserve fund balance for catastrophic events is half of what it used to be.
 - \$3 million taken from ICVB in 2010 to fund 1st year debt service shortfall of ICC debt.
 - Have been working to rebuild; current balance at \$1.3 million.
 - Computer Reserve Fund - \$244K.
 - Uncommitted ICC Capital Expenditures - \$358K.
 - HOT funds received quarterly; Jan-Mar funds due mid-May.
 - ICC:
 - Event cancellations, postponements, re-bookings, new bookings.
 - Facility still needs to be maintained & protected.
- Three Phases for what we are going through: Response, Recovery and Resilience
 - We are in Recovery Phase:
 - Assumption that ZERO new HOT revenue will be coming in for the next several months
 - If no collections January through March; ICVB will be in dire times even with the use of reserves
 - Will need support from City, even with expenses reduced
 - Suspend all travel and training.
 - Stopping all advertising that could be stopped.
 - BizDIP - honoring what has been committed but nothing else.
 - Ad agency projects – finishing what is underway but then nothing else.
 - Halted all pursuit of a TPID.
 - Suspend executive director incentive.
 - Working with ASM/SMG Global on the possibility of contract extension terms that could allow access for capital projects
 - If ICVB becomes eligible for the federal Paycheck Protection Program, it will be reliant on the city's banking relationship with Bank of America. There are also issues impacting the viability of the PPP due to Texas laws restricting local governments from taking out loans; everything must go through the Attorney General in Texas.
 - Response - Other Issues:
 - 1/3 of the City's debt is tied to Hotel Occupancy Taxes
 - Debt service shortfall on ICC debt for this year.
 - Arts HOT funds will also be reduced.
 - Lingering issues with some regarding the ICVB pay plan changes of 2018
 - Priority to protect staffing levels – ICVB Staff reduced by 23% in 2010 (6 positions); only 1 of those since has been replaced.
 - The pay plan implementation cost \$95,000 across the ICVB's 21 positions
 - Biggest single portion of that was to the Executive Director position at 15%, thus the recommendation to eliminate the incentive eligibility for this year and next year, and to reduce the pay by 25% for 6 months.

Next Steps:

- Request board approval of a budget adjustment to use Catastrophic Reserve, Computer Reserve and uncommitted balance of ICC Capital Reserve into Operating Fund. Committed funds will be used to sustain ICC operations, along with committed ICC subsidy. This will then go to the City Council at its May 7 meeting.
- Approve temporary reduction in ICVB Executive Director pay by 25% and assess situation after six months; eliminate incentive for current year FY2020 and FY2021.
- Operating subsidy will still be needed for ICC; however, funds can begin to be recouped after building reopens.
- ICVB operations down to fundamentals until revenue recovery/rebuilding can begin.

Bresowar asked for the number of furloughed ICVB employees. Gast replied none from ICVB and staff is working remotely; ICC has furloughed half of its staff. Bresowar expressed concern over 25% reduction in Executive Director pay but felt the impact may not be much in the bigger scheme of things and might not be the fix, but she applauded the suggestion from Gast. Gast stated all options are drops in the bucket compared to the situation but feels it is important and is a matter of principle and a stand she believes is important to take. Lindsey noted the recommendation was approved unanimously by the Executive Committee; however, he is now questioning the recommendation as presented and asked voting Board members to reconsider the item.

Gears stated it is important now more than ever for the City to do a great job and ICVB and ICC have done that with a 10-year operation at the ICC. He supports the hospitality industry in the City and Gast is a critical component to how to continue to succeed and has proven over a number of years she knows what needs to be done. He is compelled to support the recommendation from Gast but agrees with no reason to cut the incentive pay for two years and suggested a language change to the item.

Phillip noted this is a fact- and emotionally-based discussion and a symbolic and economically correct motion. Gast sets the pace in the organization to adjust salary. This is an unusual circumstance and he will honor her request to revisit the salary adjustment at year-end, and recommends incentive pay elimination in FY2020 only.

Bettis asked for comments from Mayor Stopfer, Council members and City Manager. Stopfer reported the City is estimating a \$20 million shortfall. The city has furloughed 127 employees and has a potential 130 position eliminations. Each Department Head is working within their departments to see how they can contribute to expense cuts. The City Manager has made tough decisions on his own salary and bonus, and Stopfer agrees that FY2021 should be discussed at a later date. Gast does a phenomenal job and he will support the Board's decision.

Councilman Al Zapanta stated he feels the crisis will have an effect for at least up to 18 months or more. Everyone is taking strong actions to curb expenses and set priorities around essential activities in the City. Leadership is about leading and Gast and Hillman are leaders and setting the tone. Councilman Oscar Ward echoed Gears' and Phillip's comments. He supports the current recommendation. City Manager Chris Hillman reported federal money trickle down is important and has yet to occur. Cities with over 500,000 population have received federal money but there is a limit on how those dollars can be spent and the City will continue to work with federal and state officials for representation. Maintaining the City's triple A bond rating is important.

Perot suggested being consistent with the City's language and recommendation for staff reductions. Cole noted the City Manager, Mayor and Council comments were taken before the Board concluded the vote on the item and should have no bearing on the decision.

Lindsey asked for a motion to approve the recommendation for temporary reduction in Executive Director pay by 25% for a six-month minimum; reassess the situation at that point and elimination for incentive for FY2020 and FY2021. Those in favor: Cooperstein, Gears, Malcolm, Philipp. Those opposed: Lindsey, Bourgeois, Bresowar, Cole, Haacke, Kang, Lear, Mathai. Burghartz not present at time of vote. Motion failed 8-4.

Lear made a motion for an amended recommendation for no temporary reduction in Executive Director pay and elimination for incentive for FY2020; Cole gave a second. After additional discussion, Lear withdrew the amended motion.

Gears made a motion to reduce the pay by 25% for up to 6 months and to eliminate the FY 2020 incentive but to postpone discussion on the 2021 incentive. Those in favor: Cooperstein, Gears, Malcolm, Philipp. Those opposed: Lindsey, Bourgeois, Bresowar, Cole, Haacke, Kang, Lear, Mathai. Burghartz not present at time of vote. Motion failed 8-4.

Bresowar made a motion to approve a recommendation of a 15% reduction in Executive Director pay and revisit after three months to possibly increase or decrease the adjustment as market conditions require or as City implements citywide adjustments and to eliminate the FY2020 incentive pay; Gears gave a second. After further discussion, Bresowar withdrew the motion.

Cole suggested deferring the item to the Executive Committee for further discussion and a new recommendation to bring before the full Board for voting and after the May 7 City Council meeting. It was agreed to schedule an Executive Committee meeting for further discussion of the item.

Lindsey asked for a motion to approve the recommendation of the Executive Committee for budget adjustments from ICVB Reserve, Computer Reserve, and Convention Center Capital Improvement Project Reserve. Bresowar made a motion to accept and Haacke gave a second. A roll call vote was as follows: Lindsey, Bresowar, Cole, Gears, Haacke, Kang, Lear, Malcolm, Mathai and Philipp voted in support of the motion; Burghartz was not present at time of vote. There were no opposed. The motion passed unanimously.

There were no opposed. The motion passed unanimously.

Lindsey expressed his thanks for great communication between ICVB and ICC teams and noted the organization is a leader in the hospitality and tourism industry. Cooperstein and the Board offered congratulations to Gast on her 29 years of service at the ICVB.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:22 p.m.

DEFEND THE DRAINS

Wastewater overflows are costly, and residents can assist in preventing clogged drains by following the simple tip below.

Flush ONLY toilet paper down the toilet.

Flushing wipes, paper towels and other items can cause backups in homes, as well as damage to city infrastructure.

Wipes are designed to be strong and not break down when wet. Because of this, wipes do not dissolve in the pipes like toilet paper does. Wipes can cause major blockages in residential home pipes or farther down the line at the wastewater treatment facility. This includes baby wipes, bathroom wipes, facial or cosmetic wipes, personal hygiene wipes, disinfecting wipes, floor cleaning or dusting wipes, and toilet bowl scrub pads.

Even products labeled "flushable" can clog the sewer line because the plastic fibers do not break down quickly. There is no such thing as a "flushable" wipe; any item flushed or washed down a drain has to be removed to prepare the water for reuse.

Place wipes and other non-toilet paper items in the trash and never down the drain.



Postponing General and Special Bond Election from May 2, 2020 to November 3, 2020

The Texas Governor has issued a proclamation to allow local political subdivisions to postpone the May 2, 2020 Election to November 3, 2020. Following the Governor's proclamation, the Dallas County Elections Department announced they will not contract with any Dallas County entity for the May 2 uniform election date. Dallas County noted under the disaster declaration, guidelines put in place to "social distance" should be adhered to, and gatherings of more than 10 people at any time working up to the election to train, meet or move equipment, would be almost impossible.

As a result, the Irving City Council approved an ordinance, out of an abundance of caution for the residents of Irving, to postpone the May 2, 2020 General and Special Bond Election to November 3, 2020 at their March 31, 2020 Special Council meeting.

The Elections Division of the Texas Secretary of State's Office has issued guidelines for entities postponing to the November 3, 2020 uniform election in which the City of Irving will adhere:

- 1) **Candidate Filings** – The postponement does not have the effect of reopening candidate filings
- 2) **Ballots by Mail** – All applications to vote by mail will be preserved
- 3) **Election Records** – All records, including candidate filings, applications to vote by mail, ballot proofs, and printed ballots shall be retained and preserved
- 4) **Holdovers in Public Office** – Under Art. XVI, Sec. 17 of the Texas Constitution, the individuals who currently hold public offices that are scheduled to be on the ballot on the May uniform election date will continue to exercise the duties of those offices until the new officers take their oaths of office, following the November uniform election date.

Postergando la Elección General y la Elección Especial de Bonos del 2 de mayo del 2020 al 3 de noviembre del 2020

El Gobernador de Texas ha emitido un mandato permitiendo a entidades políticas locales a postergar la elección del 2 de mayo del 2020 al 3 de noviembre del 2020. Seguido del mandato del Gobernador, el Departamento Electoral del Condado de Dallas anunció que no establecerán contratos con ninguna entidad del Condado de Dallas para la fecha uniforme electoral del 2 de mayo. El Condado de Dallas manifestó, ante la declaración de desastre, pautas en referencia a la "distancia social" que deben adherirse, y reuniones de más de 10 personas en cualquier momento trabajando por las elecciones a fin de entrenar, encontrarse, o mover equipos, sería casi imposible.

Como resultado, el Concejo de la Ciudad aprobó una ordenanza como una medida de precaución para los residentes de Irving, de postergar la Elección General y la Elección Especial de Bonos del 2 de mayo del 2020 al 3 de noviembre en la reunión del Concejo Especial del 31 de marzo del 2020.

La División Electoral del Secretario del Estado de Texas ha emitido unas pautas para las entidades postergando para el 3 de noviembre del 2020, la elección uniforme en la cual la Ciudad de Irving se adherirá:

- 1) **Inscripciones de los Candidatos** – La postergación no tiene como efecto de abrir las inscripciones de los candidatos
- 2) **Boletas Electorales por Correo** – Todas la solicitudes para votar por correo serán preservadas
- 3) **Archivos Electorales** – Todos los archivos, incluyendo las inscripciones de los candidatos, solicitudes para votar por correo, boletas de prueba, y boletas impresas deberán ser retenidas y preservadas
- 4) **Funcionarios Reteniendo Cargo en Oficinas Públicas** – De acuerdo al Artículo XVI, Sección 17 de la Constitución de Texas, las personas que actualmente ocupan un cargo público que estaban programadas a estar en la boleta electoral en la elección uniforme de mayo continuarán ejerciendo las funciones respectivas de aquellas posiciones hasta que los nuevos funcionarios juramenten, pasada la fecha de la elección uniforme de noviembre.

Pet's Excessive Barking, Howling Can Be a Nuisance to Neighbors

Excessive barking, howling or other noises from animals can disturb the peace and quiet of surrounding neighbors. It is also a violation of Section 6-5 Loud Animals of the Irving Code of Ordinances.

The American Kennel Club (AKC) recommends that pet owners identify the cause of their pet's barking. In doing so, dog owners can positively correct their pet's excessive barking behavior. When a pet owner is home, AKC says it is best to avoid an immediate response to their pet's barking. Wait until the dog is quiet, and reward that behavior with positive reinforcement. In doing so, pet owners can teach their pet a "quiet" command and reduce the excessive barking.

Lack of Activity

Excessive barking also can be a result of a dog's boredom, and AKC mentions the following solutions:

- Exercise – A tired dog is more likely to rest when you are not at home. Consider walking your pet a couple of times a week.
- Use dog toys or puzzles – Consider toys and puzzles to distract your pet's attention from outside noise. There are a variety of pet products that can be filled with peanut butter or treats.

Separation Anxiety

Separation anxiety for dogs can be one reason for a

pet's excessive barking. When a pet owner leaves the residence, the dog can become stressed. The AKC suggests that pet owners consider:

- Crate training – If a dog is introduced to a crate positively, it can provide a safe, quiet place to relax.
- Introduce Positive Associations – Pet owners can try giving their dog a treat before leaving or begin with short periods of separation time to acclimate the pet to being left alone.

New Environment

Loud noises or unknown visitors also can cause stress in dogs and lead to barking.

- Manage surroundings – Pet owners can play soothing music or leave the TV on when the dog is left home alone.
- Socialization – Pet owners can introduce their dog to positive experiences with all ages and types of people, including people on bikes, in wheelchairs, children, etc., so the dog will become less likely to bark at them.

HIGH GRASS AND WEEDS

The City of Irving's Code Enforcement Department reminds residents to be mindful about high grass and weeds.

Grass and weeds over 10 inches in height are a violation of city code. Grass and weeds must be mowed to the edge of the roadway, including any alleyways. Edging is required along sidewalks and curbs. Do not blow leaves and grass into streets/storm drains. Property owners and tenants are responsible for keeping lawns maintained. Refusal to comply within seven days of a notice can result in a citation and the city bringing the property into compliance at the owner's expense.

SMART IRRIGATION CAN SAVE MONEY ON WATER BILL

Water conservation is crucial to ensuring future water supply availability, but it is also helps prevent over-spending on water bills. As the temperature heats up and lawns "green" up, the tendency is to increase irrigation. This practice leads to much higher water bills due to the high volume of water used for irrigation.

The City of Irving places an emphasis on "Smart Irrigation", which means making wise choices about water use. That includes conducting maintenance on the irrigation system before using it after a long rest, and checking the system monthly thereafter. In addition, monitor water usage, make sure sprinklers function properly and carefully consider when and how much water should be used. Because irrigation is the highest use of domestic water, it is good to be intentional about conserving water:

- Turn irrigation controllers off; turn on only when watering is needed.
 - Eliminates accidental/unnecessary irrigation.
 - Prevents irrigation system resetting due to electrical surges.
- Pay attention to the weather, and only water when appropriate.
 - Visit WaterMyYard.org.
 - Monitor local rainfall news.
 - Use a soil moisture meter to determine needs across a landscape.



- Review restrictions and watering tips to maximize irrigation effectiveness.
 - Visit CityofIrving.org/Water-Utilities.
 - Sign up for WaterMyYard.org weekly emails.
- Water no more than twice each week on designated days.
 - Odd addresses water on Sunday and Wednesday.
 - Even addresses water on Saturday and Tuesday.
 - Irrigate in the early morning and late evening; do not water between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m.
 - Use the cycle/soak watering method to prevent runoff.
- When using a hose, always attach a positive shutoff spray nozzle.

2020 CENSUS SELF-RESPONSE PHASE EXTENDED

The 2020 Census is underway! In response to the COVID-19 outbreak, the U.S. Census Bureau extended the period in which people can respond online, by phone or by mail through Oct. 31.

Information collected in the 2020 Census will determine the congressional representation, help communities and businesses plan for the future and determine the allocation of more than \$675 billion in federal funds every year for the next decade. Every household living in the United States is required by law to respond to the 2020 Census. Households that do not respond on their own will be visited by Census Bureau enumerators.

Individual answers cannot be shared with law enforcement, ICE, DEA, landlords, courts or anyone until 72 years have passed and they become valuable for genealogical and historical researchers.

Summer Overlay Project Kicks Off Ahead of Schedule



Irving residents will see crews rehabilitating roads ahead of schedule as part the city's Road to the Future Summer Overlay Project. The milling and overlay work on residential streets usually begins in June when the school year ends and runs through August. This year, construction began April 20.

The city's five-year Road to the Future program supports road reconstruction and rehabilitation across the city. Now in the third year of the program, the city's Traffic and Transportation Department has improved 95 roads and 45 miles of Irving thoroughfares. This year, the department's Streets Division will improve 18 roads, beginning with Second Street.

The Streets Division notifies residents and businesses that may be affected prior to construction work. Door hangers, written in English and Spanish, are placed at each residence notifying those in the area that work will begin, weather permitting. The Streets Division, also indicates the start date so that residents can remove vehicles from the affected roadway and businesses can inform their employees and patrons of possible traffic delays.

Milling and overlay is a more rapid process than street reconstruction. The process involves two sets of crews. The milling crew removes the existing asphalt down to the street's base. Then, an asphalt crew follows behind, laying and paving new asphalt. If traffic lines are affected, additional crews will repaint roadway safety markings. If the asphalt in front of a street's storm drain is sagging or impaired, crews will pave the road to help mitigate ponding water.

Most milling and overlay projects can be completed in a week. Once the work is complete, vehicles can immediately resume driving on the freshly paved roads.

However, roads that are longer, have more lanes and intersections, or are in need of rehabilitation can take multiple weeks to complete.

Street Improvements

Residents will see the city's Traffic and Transportation Department's Streets Division, milling and overlaying the following Irving roads during the spring and summer:

- Second Street from O'Connor Road to Lee Street
- Main Street from Second Street to Fifth Street
- Cheyenne Street from Rochelle Road to Northgate Drive
- Story Road from Irving Boulevard to Shady Grove Road
- Story Road from State Highway 183 to Irving Boulevard
- Senter Road from Shady Grove Road to Sixth Street
- Shady Grove Road from Park Grove Drive to Nursery Road
- Rogers Road from Sixth Street to Pioneer Drive
- Rogers Road from Pioneer Drive to Grauwylar Road
- Irving Heights Drive from Shady Grove Road to State Highway 356
- Rock Island Road from O'Connor Road to Main Street
- Hastings Street from Rock Island Road to Second Street
- Ohio Street from Rock Island Road to Second Street
- Jefferson Street from Irving Boulevard to Second Street
- Delaware Street from Irving Boulevard to Second Street

Do not text and drive, slow down, be patient and stay alert while driving in work zones. When driving in a construction zone, be sure to remain aware of workers, pedestrians and other drivers.





How was your overall destination experience?







Booking Status Change Due to Covid19





Room Nights Lost Due to Covid19




■ Number of Lost Room Nights ■ Number of Cancelled Room Nights ■ Number of Rebooked Room Nights


RFPS

April saw another decline in the number of RFPs from the previous month with **24 RFPs**, a year-over-year decline of 74%. There was also a decline in the number of associated room nights in April with **7,143 associated room nights**, which also represents a year-over-year decline of 74%. With the national emergency declaration and most of the U.S. under shelter-in-place orders during the month of April, these results were not unexpected. Simpleview, the ICVB's digital agency, has provided insights into the impact on meeting sales in destination marketing in the U.S. market. Using a sample set of 257 DMOs of all sizes, including 34 of Cvent's top 50 meetings destinations in the U.S., their sample set is representative of 67% of DMO-influenced room nights. The data indicates that on March 1, 2020, prior to the national emergency, the sample set showed 451,000 more room nights on the books vs. the same time last year. As of April 26, 2020, that same sample set now shows **8.3 million fewer** room nights on the books vs. the same time the previous year.



Simpleview's sample set, shown below, shows that as of April 26, 2020, most lost business is canceled (shown in gray) and not postponed (in green), with more canceling in June and July. However, it also shows that 2020 bookings (in orange) in August and beyond are continuing to hold.




WEBSITE TRAFFIC

Overall website traffic in April decreased with **27,805 total sessions** and **23,448 users** visiting both websites. The Visit Irving website's decrease was more modest with 26,207 sessions, while the Irving Convention Center site decreased significantly with 1,598 sessions. Traffic to the Irving Convention Center website is largely driven by attendees and is highly influenced by events. The cancellation of events in the facility is the reason for the minimal traffic to the website in April, which will continue to remain at lower levels until the building begins hosting regular events again.




The Visit Irving website is continuing to perform well relative to the industry. Simpleview has provided insights on the impact on a sample set of aggregated website traffic of 200 DMOs from the beginning of the year through May 7. The sample set continues to show a sharp decline in overall traffic to DMO websites since the declaration of the national emergency. By comparison, the Visit Irving website has experienced a smaller decline in traffic. In April, organic search traffic for the industry is down 55% year-over-year, while the Visit Irving site is down by 31% year-over-year. Traffic to the Visit Irving website continues to largely be driven by the [Coronavirus Resources pages](#) and the popularity of the [frequent blog postings](#).


Aggregated YOY Overall DMO Website Traffic: January 1 – May 7, 2020, provided by Simpleview Inc.




Visit Irving Overall YOY Website Traffic: January 1 – May 6, 2020

BLOG TRAFFIC

Blog traffic increased again in April with **6,691 pageviews** and **5,795** unique pageviews, a 33% increase over the previous month. The top three blog posts in April were "Irving Dine-Around Bingo," with 1,114 pageviews, "Eat Locally While Distancing Socially," with 707 pageviews, and "Throwback Thursday, the Story of Irving," with 360 pageviews.



As an essential element of Visit Irving's SEO strategy, the frequency of fresh content from blog postings continues to be an important driver of traffic to the Visit Irving site. The blog postings also serve to keep the organization visible to visitors, clients, and the community while helping to support Irving's local business partners. From January 1 through April 30, 2020, the blog has had 18,777 pageviews.



ADVERTISING

With a ban on public gatherings and severe budget cuts, the CVB suspended nearly all its advertising through the remainder of the fiscal year. As a result, advertising impressions decreased in April with **1,129 impressions** and **55 site visits**.


Advertising Engagement



PAID SEARCH


The Google AdWords paid search campaigns have also been suspended, which resulted in zero impressions and site visits for the month of April. Prior to the suspension, resources were shifted to meetings-focused campaigns, which increased the number of RFPs generated from these campaigns during this fiscal year despite the drop in overall impressions and site visits. The resources allocated for the AdWords campaigns during the suspension continues to accrue, which will allow these campaigns to have an outsized impact when these meetings-focused campaigns resume.

As with the ICVB, DMOs across the U.S. suspended their paid search campaigns during shelter in place. As a result, paid sessions have fallen farther than other channels. As DMOs slowly reengage their paid search campaigns to position their destinations in front of hopeful travelers and planners, paid sessions are showing the greatest rebound in traffic.


Aggregated YOY DMO Paid Search Traffic: January 1 – May 7, 2020, provided by Simpleview Inc.



HOTEL AND FLIGHT BOOKINGS


Information available through the ADARA Magellan travel intelligence platform displays approximately 70% of the hotel bookings, room nights, hotel booking revenue, and flights booked by travelers who viewed the bureau’s digital advertising or visited either website. The attribution window is 60 days, which means that the most complete information available to date is from February. In February, 111 hotel reservations were booked, which accounts for 250 room nights and \$43,290 in hotel revenue. Travelers also booked 146 flights in February.

Completing the bingo card puts diners in the running for prizes, such as \$50 American Express gift cards and \$25 restaurant gift cards. This week’s prize has the added bonus of two tickets to a concert at The Pavilion at Toyota Music Factory once they resume operations.

Restaurants were picked by recommendations from hundreds of residents, according to Visit Irving, and have been split onto two different bingo cards. Participants can play on either or both cards each week.

Visit Irving, run by the Irving Convention and Visitors Bureau, has posted the full rules to the game [on its blog](#). To play, residents must share pictures of their meals on Twitter, Facebook or Instagram and tag @VisitIrvingTX in the post. Direct messages or pictures of receipts are also accepted, as well as images sent to info@irvingtexas.com if someone isn’t on social media. Entries for the week are due by 10 a.m. each Monday, and winners are chosen randomly from those who have submitted cards and proof of purchases.

The game aimed at boosting restaurant purchases comes as restaurants have felt the pinch of the coronavirus-slowed economy, with many forced to lay off or furlough employees, if not close down. Congress has set aside billions to aid small businesses including eateries, but these [funds haven’t eased much of the stress](#) on the struggling industry.

Program that feeds Dallas restaurant workers moves to bigger digs

A nonprofit that arose after coronavirus to feed the food & beverage industry is moving to bigger new digs: **Staff Meal**, which provides 2,400 free chef-crafted meals every weekend to hospitality workers in need, is moving its program from 3015 at Trinity Groves to the Irving Convention Center, beginning Saturday, May 2.

Irving Convention Center donated the space, providing a larger, state-of-the-art kitchen and workspace for the volunteer culinary team and a more central location for curbside pick-up for F&B workers across North Texas.

"Staff Meal is providing a service that my entire team can support and embrace," says Tom Meehan, the GM at Irving Convention Center, in a release. "We are pleased to be able to give back to the community during this time of need."

Staff Meals was launched on April 11 in response to the growing amount of restaurant and hospitality workers unemployed due to COVID-19. Founders include Cheryl Weis, Alison Matis, and Emily Mantooth of FestEvents Foundation, a 501c3 that supports workforce development in the hospitality industry, collaborating with chef Nick Walker of Virgin Hotels Dallas and Steve DeShazo, of El Centro College.

The program provides 300 free to-go food packages, including four servings of breakfast and four servings of lunch/dinner.


Reservations for the meals are required through www.staffmeal.org, and the food is ready for no-touch pickup on Saturdays from 10 am-1 pm. The new pickup is at Irving Convention Center, at 500 W. Las Colinas Blvd. in Irving.

Associations and businesses who have donated funding, product, and services include 3015 at Trinity Groves, Artscape Creative, Cava Group Inc., Chef's Produce Company, The Chefs' Warehouse, Dairy Max, Fresh Point, Friedman Marketing and Public Relations, Gordon Food Service, Greater Dallas Restaurant Association, Irving Convention Center, La Madeleine, M&M Concessions, Maple Leaf Farms, Omni Hotels & Resorts, Profound Foods, Tailwater Capital, Texas Beef Council, Verlasso Salmon, Vipin Nambiar, and Wackym's Kitchen.

DeShazo says in a statement that they needed a bigger kitchen to accommodate demand.

"There are 677,000 unemployed service industry workers across the state of Texas," DeShazo says. "Due to the overwhelming response that we received from North Texans over the last three weeks for the meal distribution, we knew we needed a much larger kitchen. We will see Staff Meal continue to grow and expand outreach, especially now that we are more accessible to sectors that are heavily populated with displaced industry workers but offer fewer free meal plans."

Irving's hotel occupancy rate for March remained higher than the US at 43.7%. When comparing current month's occupancy numbers to last year, Irving's occupancy was down 43.1%, while Texas figures decreased 37.9% and the US figures were down 42.3% for the month. Demand for the current period is down 42.6%, and YTD is down 13.6% over last year, while STR data reflects a 43.1% decrease for the current period and a 16.1% decrease in YTD occupancy compared to 2019.

For average daily rate, Irving was \$95.92, down 13.6% in March compared to last year, leaving Irving's YTD average daily rate at \$111.26, down 1.0% over last year.

As previously noted, do not be mis-lead by a decrease in occupancy, as new inventory has come online which then causes a lower occupancy figure. When the inventory level is static, then the Occupancy figure is a good performance indicator. However, when there are increases or decreases in inventory, then "Demand" must be looked at as well. Demand is the actual amount of room nights sold during the period being reviewed.

AirBNB

For the month of March, there were 531 available listings in Irving which is a 51.7% increase in listings over last year's figure of 350. The average daily rate for March is \$166.55, which is down 17.57% over last year, with an occupancy percentage of 59.4%, which is a 10.02% decrease compared to last year. For the hotel comparable subset, the average daily rate for March is \$106.55, up 19.08% from last year, with occupancy at 62.5%, down 12.86% from last year.

NOTE: Commencing in January 2019, the AirDNA rate and occupancy figures include HomeAway data, in addition to AirBNB data. Therefore, prior year data reflected on the graphs will not correlate with the prior year data from previously published graphs. Prior year data sets have been updated to include HomeAway data as well.





Three Year Comparison - CITY OF IRVING - ALL PROPERTIES



- Total event income for the month fell short by \$517,229. Due to COVID-19, we had a total of eighteen groups that either canceled or postponed. These events would have generated a *minimum* of \$403,000, making up for almost all of the shortage of the month.
- Other operating income did not meet expectations due to not receiving any commissions that our events would have generated. That number consists of April's Westin garage rent minus expenses for the south garage.
- Indirect expenses were under budget for the month.
- Overall, the ICC missed the budget target by \$367,674.
