Update for 03/19/21:

There are 72 days remaining in the Regular Legislative Session.

Bill filing has finally come to an end (last Friday, 03/12). We spent time this week reviewing all of the bills for industry impact. There have been 6,730 House and Senate Bills filed so far for this legislative session. Any bills filed after last Friday only pertain to local issues. The bill tracking list is linked to the State site (Texas Legislature Online), so if you would like to look over any of the bills you can click on the bill number and it will take you directly to a copy of it. Also included is a progress chart so that you are able to see how each bill is progressing along through the process, as well as what the last actions were, for example, if the bill has been referred, and to which committee, as well as if the bill is set for a hearing date.

This week, the Senate Business and Commerce Committee held a hearing on their version of the alcohol-to-go bill. Senate Bill 298 by Hancock was left pending in the committee. Texas Travel Alliance registered in support of this bill.

The House Committee on Ways & Means held a hearing on HB 1195 by Charlie Geren. Federal law enacted in 2020 provides for exclusion of the value of forgiven Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loans from gross income for purposes of the Internal Revenue Code. That exclusion does not apply for purposes of the Texas franchise tax, because the state tax is tied to the Internal Revenue Code as it existed in 2007. HB 1195 would amend the Tax Code to provide for exclusion from total revenue of the amounts of certain forgiven loans for purposes of the franchise tax. Texas Travel Alliance registered in support of this bill.

Our team continues to meet with members of the House Appropriations and Senate Finance Committees to support the dedicated fund to promote tourism. The subcommittees and workgroups continued to work this week and, so far, it doesn't appear the trusteed account is under any scrutiny.

Last Friday (03/12) was not only the last day to file a bill, but it was also the deadline for Senate Riders. Today (03/19) is the House Rider deadline. Once the Riders are available, we will go through them to determine if any would affect the industry.

Next week on Tuesday, Senate Bill 14 by Senator Brandon Creighton will be considered before the Senate Business & Commerce Committee. SB 14 is dubbed the Business Freedom and Uniformity Act. As the Texas economy continues to struggle from the pandemic, this legislation will provide needed stability for Texas employees by stopping local governments from imposing burdensome and inconsistent mandates on private-sector employment practices.

Also this week, TTA participated in U.S. Travel's Destination Capitol Hill with the Texas Delegation, representing the industry at the Federal level and urging our Senators and Representatives to support the industry through this crucial recovery period. Highlights from previous week's updates:

Today marked the 60th day of the Legislative Session and the bill filing deadline, unless it is a local bill. As of this email, 5,079 House Bills and 2,307 Senate Bills have been filed. The Legislature continues to hold hearings on the Winter Storm Uri and the electricity outages. We anticipate several more along those lines next week. Likewise, committees have really geared up and are starting to report bills out of the committees.

Senator Kelly Hancock filed Senate Bill 6 which is deemed the Pandemic Liability Protection Act. You may recall that Governor Abbott declared pandemic liability protection as an emergency item earlier this session. The bill offers liability protection for health care providers, product manufacturers, businesses, schools, and others who attempted to follow applicable government standards, with respect to minimizing the spread of COVID. The bill also allows for lawsuits to proceed if the plaintiff can prove the business, individuals, and other entities with invitees on their premises, that the actor refused to implement or flagrantly disregarded protocols. The Texas Travel Alliance will be supporting this bill.

The House Licensing and Administrative Procedures Committee met this week and approved HB 1024 by Geren, moving it one step closer to making permanent a temporary order that allows for bars and restaurants to sell mixed drinks-to-go as long as they are sealed in a tamper-proof container and accompanied by a food item. The Texas Travel Alliance supported this bill. The measure now heads to the full House for consideration. Likewise, the Senate companion to this bill will be heard in the Senate Business and Commerce Committee next week. We will be putting in a card of support on behalf of the Alliance.

This week, Erika Boyd with TTA and several of our members testified before the House Culture, Recreation, and Tourism committee on the impacts of COVID to the industry, as well as how the Legislature can help travel & tourism recover. The industry's legislative priorities were heard loud and clear: 1) protect Tourism Promotion funding; 2) preserve the Events Trust Fund and Major Events Reimbursement program; 3) protect/preserve hotel occupancy taxes for their intended purpose. Thank you to everyone who testified – excellent testimony by all!

Next week, the House Culture, Recreation, and Tourism will meet on Monday and hear two bills we are monitoring. HB 1341 by Leach which would waive entrance fees to state parks for resident first responders, military services members, and veterans. HB 1472 by Bucy would add the Concalf Gold Cup to the Major Events Reimbursement Program. Also on Monday, the House Ways and Means Committee will take up HB 1195 by Geren which relates to the forgiveness of a loan made under the Paycheck Protection Program for franchise tax purposes. This would protect business owners from

having to pay franchise taxes on loans they received that were forgiven. The Texas Travel Alliance will be supporting these bills.

Our lobby team will be monitoring the Appropriations Subcommittee on Article 1 which is scheduled for hearings on Monday and Wednesday of next week. As you may recall, Article 1 is where the Governor's Tourism Marketing Program is budgeted.

The Legislature is still moving more slowly than in past sessions, with both chambers meeting on shorter schedules. Covid-19, the State's budget, and the winter storm continue to dominate. Both the House and Senate met briefly this week, and have adjourned until next Tuesday, March 9th.

Last week bills started getting referred to committees. The bill filing deadline is March 12. Once we hit the deadline, we will take a deep dive into bill language for impacts to the industry and provide more information to you. As of today, there have been 4,260 bills filed, and we are tracking 193 of them for the Texas Travel Alliance.

The House Culture, Recreation & Tourism Committee has invited the travel industry to provide testimony about our covid-19 impacts and current state on Monday, March 8. TTA will provide testimony along with several members.

The Senate and the House held emergency hearings on the winter storms to get to the bottom of why the power grid failed when weatherization recommendations for power plants were issued a decade ago. It was evident that these recommendations issued by federal regulators were largely not enacted and unfortunately, left most of Texas' residents without power during the coldest ice storm the state has ever experienced. At this time, there are no estimates on what it will cost to weatherize all of the components of the grid, but at the end of the hearings, the Legislators main concern was who will pay? TTA will follow these ongoing conversations for impacts to the industry.

Lieutenant Governor Dan Patrick issued his top 31 priorities the Senate will take up and consider this legislative session. The topics vary from the State Budget, ERCOT, Broadband Access, and Pandemic Liability Protections. A complete list is here.

The bill filing volume is still down compared to previous sessions, but has picked up in recent days. There continues to be a backlog of bill drafting requests at Legislative Council. We will provide some statistics after the bill filing deadline which is on Friday, March 12th. We also continue to track filed bills for impacts to the travel industry.

The Senate and House continue to convene as a full body on Tuesdays and Wednesdays of each week. This week, the House started referring bills to their committees of jurisdiction. House committees will begin to hold organizational hearings next week and will most likely hold bill hearings the following week. So far this session, they have only spent 14 hours on the Floor combined. By this time in 2019, the two chambers had convened collectively for 53 hours. The main difference is that normally during this time, the chambers recognize groups and honor them with resolutions. With COVID, extra precautions are in place therefore, this ritualistic practice is not taking place.

TTA has signed on in support of the Hospitality and Commerce Job Recovery Act of 2021 (federal legislation). Support for this legislation is another part of our advocacy work to bring back meetings & events. The letter is linked here.

Senate Finance Committee hearings

State Tourism Promotion funding was not specifically discussed in testimony provided by Adriana Cruz, Office of Economic Development and Tourism. This is seen as a positive in that the request for funding has not drawn attention from any of the committee members and should remain intact. In advance of the hearings, TTA lobby team met with Senate Finance Committee members and their staff to discuss the importance of preserving the full budget request for tourism promotion and provided information on the value of the funds, particularly as related to economic recovery.

ASSET Coalition

The ASSET coalition, of which TTA is a member, continues to work to advance legislation to help businesses in Texas stabilize, rebuild, and grow. In order to help businesses stabilize, we will address overregulation—preempting cities and counties from regulating private employment practices, like scheduling, hiring, benefits and wages. This bill does not include language as related to discrimination. The bill will be filed by Senator Creighton and we will share more information as we have it.

Fleet/Commercial vehicle regulations

House Judiciary & Civil Jurisprudence Chair Jeff Leach (R-Plano) filed HB 19 to reform commercial vehicle litigation. A coalition is being built to support the legislation to clarify the rules for how commercial vehicle lawsuits are tried, ensuring juries have the facts necessary to award fair compensation and level the playing field for all litigants. Any members with fleet vehicles should follow this legislation and reach out for more information on the coalition and it's efforts. TTA will follow and report as it relates to tourism businesses.

Governor Abbott's State of the State

Governor Abbott's State of the State address, he declared five emergency items.

The emergency items are:

- Expanding broadband access;
- Passing laws that prevent cities from defunding the police;
- Fixing the "flawed bail system;"
- Election integrity so Texans can have "trust and confidence in the outcome of elections;" and
- Coronavirus-related civil liberty protections for "individuals, businesses and health care providers that operated safely during the pandemic."

By declaring these items as an emergency will allow the Legislature to take action on them within the first 60 days of the legislative session. Abbott also noted other areas he believes should be priorities this legislative session, including continued investment in education and mental health support. Beginning of Session update


The Legislature convened on January 12th to officially begin the 87th Regular Session. Representative Dade Phelan was formally elected as the Speaker of the Texas House and received nearly unanimous support from members of both parties.

Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced the biennial revenue estimate, which tells members how much they have to spend this budget cycle. The revenue estimate includes an upward revision over the July version, which had anticipated a 2021 ending balance of negative \$4.6 Billion. The figure now is expected to be a negative \$946 million. You can read Comptroller Hegar's announcement here.
